10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That § 18.2-32.2 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
12	§ 18.2-32.2. Killing a fetus; penalties.
13	A. Any person who unlawfully, willfully, deliberately, maliciously, and with premeditation kills the
14	fetus of another is guilty of a Class 2 felony.
15	B. Any person who unlawfully, willfully, deliberately, and maliciously kills the fetus of another is
16	guilty of a felony punishable by confinement in a state correctional facility for not less than five nor
17	more than 40 years.
18	C. Any person who kills the fetus of another by an intentional act committed while in the sudden
19	heat of passion upon reasonable provocation is guilty of voluntary manslaughter.
20	D. Any person who kills the fetus of another accidentally, contrary to the intention of the parties and
21	while engaged in conduct so gross, wanton, and culpable as to show a reckless disregard for human
22	life, is guilty of involuntary manslaughter.
23	2. That the provisions of this act may result in a net increase in periods of imprisonment or
24	commitment. Pursuant to § 30-19.1:4 of the Code of Virginia, the estimated amount of the
25	necessary appropriation cannot be determined for periods of imprisonment in state adult
26	correctional facilities; therefore, Chapter 2 of the Acts of Assembly of 2022, Special Session I,
27	requires the Virginia Criminal Sentencing Commission to assign a minimum fiscal impact of
28	\$50,000. Pursuant to § 30-19.1:4 of the Code of Virginia, the estimated amount of the necessary

appropriation cannot be determined for periods of commitment to the custody of the Department
of Juvenile Justice.
