6 **Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:**7 **1. That § 27-34.2:1 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:**8 **§ 27-34.2:1. Police powers of fire marshals.**

9 In addition to such other duties as may be prescribed by law, the local fire marshal and those
10 assistants appointed pursuant to § 27-36 designated by the fire marshal shall, if authorized by the
11 governing body of the county, city, or town appointing the local fire marshal, have the same police
12 powers as a sheriff, police officer, or law-enforcement officer. The investigation and prosecution of all
13 offenses involving hazardous materials, fires, fire bombings, bombings, attempts or threats to commit
14 such offenses, false alarms relating to such offenses, *and* possession and manufacture of explosive
15 devices, substances, and fire bombs shall be the responsibility of the fire marshal or his designee, if
16 authorized by the governing body of the county, city, or town appointing the local fire marshal. The
17 police powers granted in this section shall not be exercised by any local fire marshal or assistant until
18 such person has satisfactorily completed a *basic law-enforcement* course for fire marshals with police
19 powers, *and maintains satisfactory participation in in-service and advanced courses and programs,*
20 designed by the Department of Fire Programs in cooperation with the Department of Criminal Justice
21 Services, which course shall be approved by the Virginia Fire Services Board.

22 *Current or prior certification as a law-enforcement officer, who retired or resigned from his position*
23 *as a law-enforcement officer in good standing, may satisfy the police powers training requirements upon*
24 *successful review to determine equivalency by the Department of Fire Programs in cooperation with the*
25 *Department of Criminal Justice Services.*

26 In addition, fire marshals with police powers shall continue to exercise those powers only upon
27 satisfactory participation in in-service and advanced courses and programs designed by the Department
28 of Fire Programs in cooperation with the Department of Criminal Justice Services, which courses shall
29 be approved by the Virginia Fire Services Board.

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
