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VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY - CHAPTER

An Act to amend the Code of Virginia by adding in Title 30 a chapter numbered 66, consisting of 2 3 sections numbered 30-421 through 30-429, and to repeal Article 11 (§§ 2.2-2544 through 2.2-2550) 4 of Chapter 25 of Title 2.2 of the Code of Virginia, relating to the American Revolution 250 5 Commission; report.

8 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

9 1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Title 30 a chapter numbered 66, consisting 10 of sections numbered 30-421 through 30-429, as follows:

CHAPTER 66.

AMERICAN REVOLUTION 250 COMMISSION.

§ 30-421. American Revolution 250 Commission; purpose.

14 The American Revolution 250 Commission (the Commission) is established in the legislative branch 15 of state government. The purpose of the Commission is to commemorate the 250th anniversary of the American Revolution, the Revolutionary War, and the independence of the United States. 16 17

§ 30-422. Membership; terms; vacancies; chairman and vice-chairman.

A. The Commission shall have a total membership of 27 members that shall consist of five legislative 18 19 members, 17 nonlegislative citizen members, and five ex officio members. Members shall be appointed 20 as follows: 21

1. Two members of the Senate, to be appointed by the Senate Committee on Rules;

22 2. Three members of the House of Delegates, to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of 23 Delegates in accordance with the principles of proportional representation contained in the Rules of the 24 House of Delegates;

25 3. One representative from each of the lead commemoration partners: the Jamestown-Yorktown 26 Foundation, the primary state agency; the Virginia Museum of History & Culture, the primary nonstate 27 agency; and Gunston Hall, the primary representative of Virginia's historic homes and related sites;

28 4. One representative from the American Battlefield Trust, the secretariat of the United States 29 Semiquincentennial Commission, and one representative from the Virginia Bar Association;

30 5. Six members appointed by the Governor from a list of 10 provided by the Jamestown-Yorktown 31 Foundation: and

32 6. Six members appointed by the Governor from a list of 10 provided by the Virginia Museum of 33 History & Culture.

34 The Secretary of Education, the Librarian of Virginia, the Director of the Department of Historic 35 Resources, the Executive Director of Virginia Humanities, and the Chief Executive Officer of the 36 Virginia Tourism Authority, or their designees, shall serve as ex officio members with voting privileges. 37 Nonlegislative citizen members of the Commission shall be citizens of the Commonwealth. 38

B. The Commission shall elect a chairman and vice-chairman from among its membership.

39 C. Legislative members of the Commission shall serve terms coincident with their terms of office. 40 Nonlegislative citizen members shall be appointed for the duration of the Commission's activities. 41 Appointments to fill vacancies shall be for the unexpired terms. Vacancies shall be filled in the same 42 manner as the original appointments. 43

§ 30-423. Quorum; meetings.

44 A majority of the members shall constitute a quorum. The meetings of the Commission shall be held 45 at the call of the chairman or whenever a majority of the members so request.

46 § 30-424. Compensation; expenses.

47 Legislative members of the Commission shall receive such compensation as provided in § 30-19.12. 48 Nonlegislative citizen members of the Commission shall not receive compensation or reimbursement for travel and other expenses incurred in the performance of their duties. 49 50

§ 30-425. Powers and duties of the Commission.

A. The Commission shall have the following powers and duties:

51 52 1. Formulate and implement a program for the inclusive observance of the 250th anniversary of the 53 independence of the United States and the Revolutionary War in Virginia, including (i) civic, cultural, 54 and historical education and scholarship concerning the ideals of the American Revolution and their 55 contemporary relevance; (ii) visitation of museums and historic sites, including battlefields; (iii) creation 56 and publication of historical documents and studies; (iv) cooperation with agencies responsible for the

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57 preservation or restoration of historic sites, buildings, art, and artifacts; (v) establishment of exhibitions 58 and interpretive and wayfinding signage; (vi) arrangement of appropriate public ceremonies; (vii) a 59 comprehensive marketing and tourism campaign encompassing calendar year 2025 through calendar 60 year 2026; and (viii) the general dissemination of public information regarding Virginia's involvement in 61 the American Revolution and its legacy today;

62 2. Appoint and establish an advisory council composed of nonlegislative citizen members at large who have a knowledge of relevant history or expertise in areas useful to the work of the Commission, 63 64 including a representative of the Sons of the Revolution in the Commonwealth of Virginia, a 65 representative of the Virginia Daughters of the American Revolution, and a representative of the 66 National Washington-Rochambeau Revolutionary Route Association. The advisory council shall make 67 recommendations and provide comment as requested by the Commission. The Commission may from 68 time to time appoint, add, or remove members of the advisory council. Members of the advisory council 69 shall serve without compensation or reimbursement;

70 3. Appoint and establish an executive committee composed of members of the Commission, including 71 the Commission's chairman and vice-chairman and one representative designated by each of the 72 following: the Jamestown-Yorktown Foundation, the Virginia Museum of History & Culture, and 73 Gunston Hall; and

74 4. Perform such other duties, functions, and activities as may be necessary to facilitate and 75 implement the objectives of the Commission.

76 B. The Commission may solicit, accept, use, and dispose of gifts, grants, donations, bequests, or 77 other funds or real or personal property for the purpose of aiding or facilitating the work of the 78 Commission. In accordance with the appropriation act, the Commission may procure supplies, services, 79 and property, and make or enter into contracts, leases, or other legal agreements as it may deem 80 necessary to carry out its duties as set forth in this chapter. No contract, lease, or other legal 81 agreement shall be entered into by the Commission that extends beyond the date of expiration of the 82 Commission. 83

§ 30-426. Staffing.

84 The Commission may appoint and employ and, at its pleasure, remove an executive director and 85 such other persons as it deems necessary to assist it in carrying out its duties as set forth in this chapter. The Commission may determine the duties of such staff and fix their salaries or compensation 86 87 within the amounts appropriated thereof. If funds are not appropriated for staffing, the Joint Rules 88 Committee shall determine the staffing support for the Commission.

89 Administrative staff support shall be provided by the Office of the Clerk of the Senate or the Office 90 of the Clerk of the House of Delegates as may be appropriate for the house in which the chairman of 91 the Commission serves. The Division of Legislative Services shall serve as fiscal agent and provide legal 92 services as requested by the Commission. All agencies and political subdivisions of the Commonwealth 93 shall provide assistance to the Commission, upon request. 94

§ 30-427. Chairman's executive summary of activity and work of the Commission; report.

95 The chairman shall submit to the General Assembly and the Governor an annual executive summary 96 of the interim activity and work of the Commission no later than the first day of each regular session of 97 the General Assembly. The executive summary shall be submitted as provided in the procedures of the 98 Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents and reports and 99 shall be posted on the General Assembly's website.

100 § 30-428. Virginia American Revolution 250 Commission Fund.

There is hereby created in the state treasury a special nonreverting fund to be known as the Virginia 101 American Revolution 250 Fund, hereafter referred to as the "Fund." The Fund shall be established on 102 the books of the Comptroller and shall consist of gifts, grants, donations, bequests, or other funds from 103 104 any source as may be received by the Commission for its work. Moneys shall be paid into the state 105 treasury and credited to the Fund. Interest earned on moneys in the Fund shall remain in the Fund and 106 be credited to it. Any moneys remaining in the Fund, including interest thereon, at the end of each 107 fiscal year shall not revert to the general fund but shall remain in the Fund. Moneys in the Fund shall 108 be used solely for the purpose of enabling the Commission to perform its duties. Expenditures and 109 disbursements from the Fund shall be made by the State Treasurer on warrants issued by the 110 Comptroller upon written request of the chairman of the Commission. 111

§ 30-429. Sunset.

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This chapter shall expire on July 1, 2032.

2. That Article 11 (§§ 2.2-2544 through 2.2-2550) of Chapter 25 of Title 2.2 of the Code of Virginia 113 114 is repealed.

115 3. That any unexpended balances as of June 30, 2023, of the American Revolution 250

Commission, as established by Chapters 914 and 915 of the Acts of Assembly of 2020, that have 116

accrued in the executive department pursuant to a general appropriation act shall be transferred 117

- to the American Revolution 250 Commission, as established in the legislative branch by this act. 118
- 119 4. That as of July 1, 2023, the American Revolution 250 Commission established by this act shall 120 be deemed successor in interest to the American Revolution 250 Commission established pursuant
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- to Chapters 914 and 915 of the Acts of Assembly of 2020. All rights, title, and interest in and to 122 any real or tangible personal property vested in the American Revolution 250 Commission
- established pursuant to Chapters 914 and 915 of the Acts of Assembly of 2020 shall be transferred 123
- 124 to and taken as standing in the name of the American Revolution 250 Commission established by
- 125 this act.
- 126 5. That the members of the American Revolution 250 Commission (the Commission) appointed
- 127 pursuant to Chapters 914 and 915 of the Acts of Assembly of 2020 or Chapters 685 and 687 of the
- 128 Acts of Assembly of 2022 shall continue to serve on the Commission pursuant to their original
- 129 appointments.
