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95 C. In addition to any sum provided to a qualified organization as set forth in subsection B, the
96 Director may disburse funds to any qualified organization to fund maintenance and care of additional
97 historical African American graves in the Commonwealth that have been certified by the Department
98 and documented in the Department's cultural resources database. Funds disbursed under this subsection
99 shall be disbursed at the rate set forth in subsection B.

D. A qualified organization receiving funds shall expend the funds for the routine maintenance of its
 historical African American cemetery, associated graves, and graves certified by the Department and
 documented in the Department's cultural resources database and the erection of and caring for markers,
 memorials, and monuments to the memory of such African Americans.

E. Each qualified organization, through its proper officer, shall after July 1 of each year submit to the Director a certified statement that the funds appropriated to the organization during the preceding fiscal year were or will be expended for the purposes set forth in subsection D. No organization that fails to comply with any of the requirements of this section shall receive moneys allocated under this section for any subsequent fiscal year until the organization fully complies with the requirements.

109 F. In addition to funds that may be provided pursuant to subsection B or C, any organization that 110 receives funds pursuant to subsection B or C may apply to the Director for a grant to perform extraordinary maintenance, renovation, repair, or reconstruction of any of its historical African American 111 112 cemeteries and graves. However, a locality that is eligible for funding pursuant to subsection B or C 113 may apply to the Director for such a grant without having received funding pursuant to subsection B or C. A locality's application for the grant shall not preclude another qualified organization from applying 114 for funding pursuant to subsection B or C for the same cemetery or grave. A grant made pursuant to 115 this subsection shall be made from any appropriation made available by the General Assembly for such 116 117 purpose or from the Fund.

118 G. Any locality may receive and hold funds drawn pursuant to subsection B or C on behalf of any qualified organization until such time as the organization is able to receive or utilize such funds. No local matching funds shall be required for any grants made pursuant to this section.

121 H. The owner of a historical African American cemetery shall reasonably cooperate with a qualified 122 organization that receives funds pursuant to subsection B or C.
