23104694D **SENATE BILL NO. 1077** 1 2 AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE 3 (Proposed by the Committee on Education and Health 4 5 6 on January 19, 2023) (Patrons Prior to Substitute—Senators Ruff and Norment [SB 1450]) A BILL to amend and reenact § 23.1-2802 of the Code of Virginia; to amend the Code of Virginia by 7 adding in Title 23.1 a chapter numbered 21.1, consisting of sections numbered 23.1-2105 through 8 23.1-2109; and to repeal § 23.1-2806 of the Code of Virginia, relating to Richard Bland College; 9 governance. 10 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 11 1. That § 23.1-2802 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted and that the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Title 23.1 a chapter numbered 21.1, consisting of sections 12 numbered 23.1-2105 through 23.1-2109, as follows: 13 14 *CHAPTER 21.1.* 15 RICHARD BLAND COLLEGE. § 23.1-2105. Corporate name; name of the College. 16 A. The board of visitors of Richard Bland College (the board) is a corporation under the name and 17 style of "The Rector and Visitors of Richard Bland College" and has, in addition to its other powers, all 18 the corporate powers given to corporations by the provisions of Title 13.1 except those powers that are 19 20 confined to corporations created pursuant to Title 13.1. The board shall at all times be under the 21 control of the General Assembly. 22 B. The institution shall be known as Richard Bland College (the College). 23 § 23.1-2106. Membership. The board shall consist of 12 members appointed by the Governor. 24 25 § 23.1-2107. Meetings; officers; committees. A. The board shall meet at the College at least once a year and at such other times as it determines. 26 27 Special meetings of the board may be called by the rector or any three members. The secretary shall 28 provide notice of any special meeting to each member. 29 B. A majority of the members shall constitute a quorum. 30 C. At the first meeting after July 1 in every even-numbered year, the board shall elect from its 31 membership a rector to preside at its meetings, a vice-rector to preside at its meetings in the absence of the rector, and a secretary to preside at its meetings in the absence of the rector and vice-rector. 32 33 D. The board may appoint a pro tempore officer to preside at its meetings in the absence of the 34 rector, vice-rector, and secretary. 35 E. Vacancies in the offices of rector, vice-rector, and secretary may be filled by the board for the 36 unexpired term. 37 F. At every regular annual meeting of the board, the board may appoint an executive committee for 38 the transaction of business in the recess of the board, to serve for a period of one year or until the next 39 regular annual meeting. 40 § 23.1-2108. Powers and duties. 41 A. The board shall appoint all teachers and fix their salaries, provide for the employment of other 42 personnel as required, and generally direct the affairs of the College. B. The board may confer degrees and, subject to the provisions of § 23.1-203, approve new 43 44 academic programs and discontinue academic programs offered by the College. C. All property, property rights, duties, contracts, and agreements of the College are vested in the 45 board. The board shall care for and preserve all property belonging to the College. 46 D. The board shall (i) make regulations and policies concerning the College; (ii) manage the funds 47 **48** of the College and approve an annual budget; (iii) appoint the chief executive officer of the College; 49 and (iv) fix the rates charged to students for tuition, mandatory fees, and other necessary charges. 50 § 23.1-2109. Courses of study. 51 The board shall focus its efforts on preparing students for academic and career success. Its students 52 may include dual enrollment students, associate-degree-seeking students, and students seeking 53 job-relevant skills or credentials. 54 In furtherance of such efforts, the board may: 55 1. Broker agreements between and among educational, industry, and nonprofit partners and establish collaborative, innovative partnership agreements with local school divisions, public and private 56 institutions of higher education, economic development agencies, employers, philanthropic organizations, 57 veterans organizations, public agencies, and other partners as necessary to strengthen and streamline 58

educational pathways from high school to work-based learning and from high school and work-based

learning to baccalaureate and advanced degrees that prepare individuals, including nontraditional 60 students such as veterans and military personnel, for entry into careers in Science, Technology, 61 62 Engineering, Mathematics, and Health Care (STEM-H) and other high-demand fields in the 63 *Commonwealth;*

64 2. Pilot and implement innovative educational approaches and technologies and promote the 65 development, delivery, and ongoing assessment of innovative, cost-effective degree programs and 66 stackable credentials, including industry-recognized, competency-based credentials that are aligned with and responsive to the educational and workforce development needs of traditional and nontraditional 67 students, including veterans and military personnel, and that advance the economic development needs 68 69 of employers and industries throughout the Commonwealth; and

70 3. Identify and implement new strategies to support economic and community development in the 71 Commonwealth and to expand opportunities for traditional and nontraditional students, including 72 veterans and military personnel, to prepare for careers in high-demand fields.

- 73 § 23.1-2802. Powers and duties.
- 74 A. The board shall generally direct the affairs of the university and Richard Bland College.
- 75 B. The board may confer degrees.

2. That § 23.1-2806 of the Code of Virginia is repealed. 76

3. That notwithstanding the provisions of § 23.1-1300 of the Code of Virginia, the Governor's 77 78 initial appointments of members to the board of visitors of Richard Bland College in accordance 79 with the provisions of § 23.1-2106 of the Code of Virginia, as created by this act, shall be staggered as follows: five members for a term of four years, four members for a term of three 80 years, and three members for a term of two years. After the initial staggering of terms, members 81 shall be appointed by the Governor for terms of four years in accordance with the provisions of 82 § 23.1-1300 of the Code of Virginia. 83

4. That any contracts entered into or rules or regulations adopted by the board of visitors of The 84

85 College of William and Mary in Virginia on behalf of or related to Richard Bland College shall continue in effect as though they were agreed to or adopted by the board of visitors of Richard 86 87 **Bland College.**

88 5. That all real and tangible personal property, property rights, duties, contracts, and agreements 89 of Richard Bland College vested in the board of visitors of The College William and Mary shall

90 be, as of the effective date of this act, transferred to and taken as standing in the name of the

91 board of visitors of Richard Bland College.

6. That the president of Richard Bland College shall submit a report on the institution's progress 92 93 in exploring and adopting an innovative model for higher education, as permitted pursuant to § 23.1-2109 of the Code of Virginia, as created by this act, to the Chairmen of the House 94

Committee on Appropriations, the House Committee on Education, the Senate Committee on 95

Education and Health, and the Senate Committee on Finance and Appropriations no later than 96 97

July 1 of each year.

7. That the audit conducted by the Auditor of Public Accounts for the fiscal year ending June 30, 98 99 2023, shall be the last audit for which Richard Bland College is treated as a consolidated entity of

the board of visitors of The College of William and Mary in Virginia. The Auditor of Public 100

Accounts shall submit its audit report on Richard Bland College for the fiscal year ending June 101

30, 2024, to the board of visitors of Richard Bland College. 102
