13	Any person who, without consent, impedes the blood circulation or respiration of another person by
14	knowingly, intentionally, and unlawfully (i) applying pressure to the neck of such person resulting in the
15	wounding or bodily injury of such person or (ii) blocking or obstructing the airway of such person is
16	guilty of strangulation, a Class 6 felony.
17	2. That the provisions of this act may result in a net increase in periods of imprisonment or $2 + 2 + 2 + 2 + 2 + 2 + 2 + 2 + 2 + 2 $
18	commitment. Pursuant to § 30-19.1:4 of the Code of Virginia, the estimated amount of the
19 20	necessary appropriation cannot be determined for periods of imprisonment in state adult correctional facilities; therefore, Chapter 2 of the Acts of Assembly of 2022, Special Session I,
20 21	requires the Virginia Criminal Sentencing Commission to assign a minimum fiscal impact of
