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11	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
12	1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 22.1-298.8 as follows:
13 14	§ 22.1-298.8. Annual trauma-informed care training program; established. A. For the purposes of this section:
15	"Childhood trauma" means any emotionally disturbing or distressing event or experience occurring
16	during childhood that could have a lasting negative effects on a child's physical, emotional, and
17	behavioral development and health, including "Adverse Childhood Experiences," or childhood physical
18	or emotional abuse or neglect, sexual abuse, alcohol or substance abuse in the home, mental illness in
19	the home, incarceration of a family member, witnessing domestic violence, and parental divorce or
20 21	separation. "Trauma-informed" means an approach to childhood care and education that includes (i) an
²¹ 22	understanding of the impact childhood trauma has on a child's physical, emotional, and behavioral
$\overline{23}$	development; (ii) the ability to recognize signs that a child has experienced childhood trauma; (iii) the
24	skills, knowledge, and resources to provide necessary and timely support to a child who has experienced
25	childhood trauma; and (iv) the knowledge to facilitate a safe, stable, and trauma-sensitive classroom
26	environment.
27 28	B. The Board shall collaborate with the Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental
20 29	Services to develop a comprehensive trauma-informed care training program for elementary and secondary school teachers for the purpose of ensuring that all such teachers are equipped with the
3 0	skills, knowledge, and resources to recognize and address signs of childhood trauma in students and
31	provide such students with the support they need. Such trauma-informed care training program shall
32	include guidance on:
33	1. Childhood trauma and the impacts of childhood trauma on a child's physical, emotional, and
34 35	behavioral development; 2. The importance of mental health wellness for both teachers and students;
35 36	3. How to handle childhood trauma in the classroom and foster a trauma-informed classroom
37	environment;
38	4. How to recognize the signs of childhood trauma in students;
39	5. How to respond when a student discloses or informs a teacher of a traumatic experience or
40	exhibits signs that the student has had a traumatic experience; and
41 42	6. When and how to contact support services or other resources outside the classroom to ensure that
42 43	students who have experienced trauma receive the support they need. C. The trauma-informed care training program shall be overseen by the Department of Education
4 4	and the Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services and shall be conducted annually
45	at each school division in person by a representative from the Department of Behavioral Health and
46	Developmental Services who is a professional in trauma-informed care.
47	D. Each local school board shall adopt and implement policies that require annual completion of the
48 40	trauma-informed care training program, as developed by this section, by each primary and secondary teacher in the school division.
