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## **SENATE BILL NO. 1300**

AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE

(Proposed by the House Committee on Appropriations

on February 15, 2023)

(Patron Prior to Substitute—Senator Deeds)

A BILL to amend and reenact § 22.1-198.1, as it is currently effective and as it shall become effective, of the Code of Virginia, relating to teacher licensure requirements; trauma-informed care training. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

8 9 1. That § 22.1-298.1, as it is currently effective and as it shall become effective, of the Code of 10 Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:

§ 22.1-298.1. (For Expiration Date, see 2022 Acts cc. 549, 550, cl. 2) Regulations governing 11 12 licensure.

A. As used in this section:

14 "Alternate route to licensure" means a nontraditional route to teacher licensure available to 15 individuals who meet the criteria specified in the guidelines developed pursuant to subsection N or regulations issued by the Board of Education. 16

17 "Industry certification credential" means an active career and technical education credential that is earned by successfully completing a Board of Education-approved industry certification examination, 18 being issued a professional license in the Commonwealth, or successfully completing an occupational 19 20 competency examination.

21 "Licensure by reciprocity" means a process used to issue a license to an individual coming into the 22 Commonwealth from another state when that individual meets certain conditions specified in the Board 23 of Education's regulations.

24 "Professional teacher's assessment" means those tests mandated for licensure as prescribed by the 25 Board of Education.

26 "Provisional license" means a nonrenewable license issued by the Board of Education for a specified 27 period of time, not to exceed three years, to an individual who may be employed by a school division in 28 the Commonwealth and who generally meets the requirements specified in the Board of Education's 29 regulations for licensure, but who may need to take additional coursework, pass additional assessments, 30 or meet alternative evaluation standards to be fully licensed with a renewable license.

31 "Renewable license" means a license issued by the Board of Education for 10 years to an individual 32 who meets the requirements specified in the Board of Education's regulations.

B. The Board of Education shall prescribe, by regulation, the requirements for the licensure of 33 34 teachers and other school personnel required to hold a license. Such regulations shall include procedures 35 for (i) the denial, suspension, cancellation, revocation, and reinstatement of licensure; (ii) written 36 reprimand of license holders on grounds established by the Board, in accordance with law, notice of which shall be made by the Superintendent of Public Instruction to division superintendents or their 37 38 designated representatives; and (iii) the immediate and thorough investigation by the division 39 superintendent or his designee of any complaint alleging that a license holder has engaged in conduct 40 that may form the basis for the revocation of his license. At a minimum, such procedures for 41 investigations contained in such regulations shall require (a) the division superintendent to petition for the revocation of the license upon completing such investigation and finding that there is reasonable 42 cause to believe that the license holder has engaged in conduct that forms the basis for revocation of a 43 license; (b) the school board to proceed to a hearing on such petition for revocation within 90 days of 44 the mailing of a copy of the petition to the license holder, unless the license holder requests the 45 cancellation of his license in accordance with Board regulations; and (c) the school board to provide a 46 47 copy of the investigative file and such petition for revocation to the Superintendent of Public Instruction at the time that the hearing is scheduled. The Board of Education shall revoke the license of any person **48** 49 for whom it has received a notice of dismissal or resignation pursuant to subsection F of § 22.1-313 and, in the case of a person who is the subject of a founded complaint of child abuse or neglect, after all 50 51 rights to any administrative appeal provided by § 63.2-1526 have been exhausted. Regardless of the authority of any other agency of the Commonwealth to approve educational programs, only the Board of 52 53 Education shall have the authority to license teachers to be regularly employed by school boards, 54 including those teachers employed to provide nursing education.

The Board of Education shall prescribe by regulation the licensure requirements for teachers who 55 teach only online courses, as defined in § 22.1-212.23. Such license shall be valid only for teaching 56 online courses. Teachers who hold a 10-year renewable license issued by the Board of Education may 57 teach online courses for which they are properly endorsed. 58

59 C. The Board of Education's regulations shall include requirements that a person seeking initial SB1300H1

60 licensure:

61 1. Demonstrate proficiency in the relevant content area, communication, literacy, and other core skills 62 for educators by achieving a qualifying score on professional assessments or meeting alternative 63 evaluation standards as prescribed by the Board;

64 2. Complete study in attention deficit disorder;

65 3. Complete study in gifted education, including the use of multiple criteria to identify gifted 66 students; and

67 4. Complete study in methods of improving communication between schools and families and ways 68 of increasing family involvement in student learning at home and at school. 69

D. In addition, such regulations shall include requirements that:

70 1. Every person seeking initial licensure and persons seeking licensure renewal as teachers who have 71 not completed such study shall complete study in child abuse recognition and intervention in accordance 72 with curriculum guidelines developed by the Board of Education in consultation with the Department of 73 Social Services that are relevant to the specific teacher licensure routes;

74 2. Every person seeking renewal of a license shall complete all renewal requirements, including 75 professional development in a manner prescribed by the Board, except that no person seeking renewal of 76 a license shall be required to satisfy any such requirement by completing coursework and earning credit 77 at an institution of higher education;

78 3. Every person seeking initial licensure or renewal of a license shall provide evidence of completion 79 of certification or training in emergency first aid, cardiopulmonary resuscitation, and the use of automated external defibrillators. The certification or training program shall (i) be based on the current 80 national evidence-based emergency cardiovascular care guidelines for cardiopulmonary resuscitation and 81 the use of an automated external defibrillator, such as a program developed by the American Heart 82 Association or the American Red Cross, and (ii) include hands-on practice of the skills necessary to 83 perform cardiopulmonary resuscitation. The Board shall provide a waiver for this requirement for any 84 85 person with a disability whose disability prohibits such person from completing the certification or 86 training;

87 4. Every person seeking licensure with an endorsement as a teacher of the blind and visually 88 impaired shall demonstrate proficiency in reading and writing Braille;

89 5. Every teacher seeking an initial license in the Commonwealth with an endorsement in the area of 90 career and technical education shall have an industry certification credential in the area in which the 91 teacher seeks endorsement. If a teacher seeking an initial license in the Commonwealth has not attained 92 an industry certification credential in the area in which the teacher seeks endorsement, the Board may, 93 upon request of the employing school division or educational agency, issue the teacher a provisional 94 license to allow time for the teacher to attain such credential;

95 6. Every person seeking initial licensure or renewal of a license shall complete awareness training, 96 provided by the Department, on the indicators of dyslexia, as that term is defined by the Board pursuant 97 to regulations, and the evidence-based interventions and accommodations for dyslexia;

98 7. Every person seeking initial licensure or renewal of a license with an endorsement as a school 99 counselor shall complete training in the recognition of mental health disorder and behavioral distress, 100 including depression, trauma, violence, youth suicide, and substance abuse;

8. Every person seeking initial licensure as a teacher who has not received the instruction described 101 102 in subsection D of § 23.1-902 shall receive instruction or training on positive behavior interventions and 103 supports; crisis prevention and de-escalation; the use of physical restraint and seclusion, consistent with 104 regulations of the Board of Education; and appropriate alternative methods to reduce and prevent the 105 need for the use of physical restraint and seclusion;

106 9. Every person seeking initial licensure or renewal of a license shall complete instruction or training in cultural competency; 107

108 10. Every person seeking initial licensure or renewal of a license with an endorsement in history and 109 social sciences shall complete instruction in African American history, as prescribed by the Board; and

110 11. Every person seeking renewal of a license as a teacher shall complete training in the instruction 111 of students with disabilities that includes (i) differentiating instruction for students depending on their 112 needs; (ii) understanding the role of general education teachers on the individualized education program 113 team; (iii) implementing effective models of collaborative instruction, including co-teaching; and (iv) 114 understanding the goals and benefits of inclusive education for all students; and

115 12. Every person seeking initial licensure or renewal of a license as a teacher shall complete 116 trauma-informed care training that includes the following topics: (i) childhood trauma and the impacts of childhood trauma on a child's physical, emotional, and behavioral development; (ii) the importance of 117 118 mental health wellness for both teachers and students; (iii) how to handle childhood trauma in the 119 classroom and foster a trauma-informed classroom environment; (iv) how to recognize the signs of 120 childhood trauma in students; (v) how to respond when a student discloses or informs a teacher of a 121 traumatic experience or exhibits signs that the student has had a traumatic experience; and (vi) when

122 and how to contact support services or other resources outside the classroom to ensure that students 123 who have experienced trauma receive the support that they need.

124 E. No teacher who seeks a provisional license shall be required to meet any requirement set forth in 125 subdivision D 1, 3, 6, or 8 as a condition of such licensure, but each such teacher shall complete each 126 such requirement during the first year of provisional licensure.

127 F. The Board shall issue a license to an individual seeking initial licensure who has not completed 128 professional assessments as prescribed by the Board, if such individual (i) holds a provisional license 129 that will expire within three months or, at the discretion of the school board and division superintendent, 130 within six months if the individual has received a satisfactory mid-year performance review in the 131 current school year; (ii) is employed by a school board; (iii) is recommended for licensure by the 132 division superintendent; (iv) has attempted, unsuccessfully, to obtain a qualifying score on the 133 professional assessments as prescribed by the Board; (v) has received an evaluation rating of proficient or above on the performance standards for each year of the provisional license, and such evaluation was 134 conducted in a manner consistent with the Guidelines for Uniform Performance Standards and 135 136 Evaluation Criteria for Teachers, Principals, and Superintendents; and (vi) meets all other requirements 137 for initial licensure.

138 G. Each local school board or division superintendent may waive for any individual whom it seeks to 139 employ as a career and technical education teacher and who is also seeking initial licensure or renewal 140 of a license with an endorsement in the area of career and technical education any applicable 141 requirement set forth in subsection C or subdivision D 2, 4, or 6.

142 H. The Board's regulations shall require that initial licensure for principals and assistant principals be 143 contingent upon passage of an assessment as prescribed by the Board.

144 I. The Board shall establish criteria in its regulations to effectuate the substitution of experiential 145 learning for coursework for those persons seeking initial licensure through an alternate route as defined 146 in Board regulations. Such alternate routes shall include eligibility for any individual to receive, 147 notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, a renewable one-year license to teach in public 148 high schools in the Commonwealth if he has: 149

1. Received a graduate degree from a regionally accredited institution of higher education;

150 2. Completed at least 30 credit hours of teaching experience as an instructor at a regionally 151 accredited institution of higher education;

152 3. Received qualifying scores on the professional teacher's assessments prescribed by the Board, 153 including the communication and literacy assessment and the content-area assessment for the 154 endorsement sought; and 155

4. Met the requirements set forth in subdivisions D 1 and 3.

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156 J. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the Board (i) may provide for the issuance 157 of a provisional license, valid for a period not to exceed three years, pursuant to subdivision D 5 or to 158 any person who does not meet the requirements of this section or any other requirement for licensure 159 imposed by law; (ii) shall provide for the issuance of a provisional license, valid for a period not to 160 exceed three years, to any former member of the Armed Forces of the United States or the Virginia National Guard who has received an honorable discharge and has the appropriate level of experience or 161 162 training but does not meet the requirements for a renewable license; and (iii) may provide for the 163 issuance of a provisional license, valid for a period not to exceed three years, to any individual who has 164 held within the last five years a valid and officially issued and recognized license or certification to 165 teach issued by an entity outside of the United States but does not meet the requirements for a 166 renewable license if the individual's license or certification to teach has been evaluated and verified by 167 an entity approved by the Department.

K. The Board's licensure regulations shall also provide for licensure by reciprocity:

169 1. With comparable endorsement areas for those individuals holding a valid out-of-state teaching 170 license and national certification from the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards or a 171 nationally recognized certification program approved by the Board of Education. The application for 172 such individuals shall require evidence of such valid licensure and national certification and shall not 173 require official student transcripts;

174 2. For any spouse of an active duty or reserve member of the Armed Forces of the United States or 175 a member of the Virginia National Guard who has obtained a valid out-of-state license, with full 176 credentials and without deficiencies, that is in force at the time the application for a Virginia license is 177 received by the Department. Each such individual shall establish a file in the Department by submitting 178 a complete application packet, which shall include official student transcripts and an official copy of the 179 military permanent assignment orders of the individual's spouse. No service requirements or licensing 180 assessments shall be required for any such individual. The Department shall determine and communicate 181 such individual's eligibility for licensure by reciprocity within 15 business days of receipt of the 182 complete application packet; and

183 3. For individuals who have obtained a valid out-of-state license, with full credentials and without 184 deficiencies, that is in force at the time the application for a Virginia license is received by the 185 Department. Each such individual shall establish a file in the Department by submitting a complete 186 application packet, which shall include official student transcripts. No service requirements or licensing 187 assessments shall be required for any such individual.

188 L. The Board shall include in its regulations an alternate route to licensure for elementary education 189 preK-6 and an alternate route to licensure for special education general curriculum K-12. Each such 190 alternate route to licensure shall require individuals to (i) meet the qualifying scores on the content area 191 assessment prescribed by the Board for the endorsements sought and (ii) complete an alternative certification program that provides training in the pedagogy and methodology of the respective content 192 or special education areas prescribed by the Board. The curriculum of any such alternative certification 193 program shall be approved by the Board. Nothing in this subsection shall preclude the Board from 194 195 establishing other alternate routes to licensure.

M. The Board, in its regulations providing for licensure by reciprocity established pursuant to 196 197 subsection K, shall (i) permit applicants to submit third-party employment verification forms and (ii) 198 grant special consideration to individuals who have successfully completed a program offered by a 199 provider that is accredited by the Council for the Accreditation of Educator Preparation.

200 N. The Board shall develop guidelines that establish a process to permit a school board or any 201 organization sponsored by a school board to petition the Board for approval of an alternate route to 202 licensure that may be used to meet the requirements for a provisional or renewable license or any 203 endorsement. Any such alternate route may include alternatives to the regulatory requirements for 204 teacher preparation, including alternative professional assessments and coursework. The petitioner may 205 proffer or the Board may impose conditions in conjunction with the approval of such petition.

The literacy assessment for any individual seeking initial licensure through an alternate route with an endorsement in early/primary education preschool through grade three, elementary 361 362 education preschool through grade six, special education general curriculum kindergarten through grade 12, special education deaf and hard of hearing preschool through grade 12, or special education 363 blindness/visual impairments preschool through grade 12 or as a reading specialist shall include a 364 rigorous test of science-based reading research and evidence-based literacy instruction; and 365

4. Met the requirements set forth in subdivisions D 1 and 3. 366

367 J. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the Board (i) may provide for the issuance

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368 of a provisional license, valid for a period not to exceed three years, pursuant to subdivision D 5 or to 369 any person who does not meet the requirements of this section or any other requirement for licensure 370 imposed by law; (ii) shall provide for the issuance of a provisional license, valid for a period not to exceed three years, to any former member of the Armed Forces of the United States or the Virginia 371 372 National Guard who has received an honorable discharge and has the appropriate level of experience or 373 training but does not meet the requirements for a renewable license; and (iii) may provide for the 374 issuance of a provisional license, valid for a period not to exceed three years, to any individual who has 375 held within the last five years a valid and officially issued and recognized license or certification to 376 teach issued by an entity outside of the United States but does not meet the requirements for a 377 renewable license if the individual's license or certification to teach has been evaluated and verified by 378 an entity approved by the Department.

K. The Board's licensure regulations shall also provide for licensure by reciprocity:

With comparable endorsement areas for those individuals holding a valid out-of-state teaching
 license and national certification from the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards or a
 nationally recognized certification program approved by the Board of Education. The application for
 such individuals shall require evidence of such valid licensure and national certification and shall not
 require official student transcripts;

385 2. For any spouse of an active duty or reserve member of the Armed Forces of the United States or 386 a member of the Virginia National Guard who has obtained a valid out-of-state license, with full 387 credentials and without deficiencies, that is in force at the time the application for a Virginia license is 388 received by the Department. Each such individual shall establish a file in the Department by submitting 389 a complete application packet, which shall include official student transcripts and an official copy of the 390 military permanent assignment orders of the individual's spouse. No service requirements or licensing assessments shall be required for any such individual. The Department shall determine and communicate 391 392 such individual's eligibility for licensure by reciprocity within 15 business days of receipt of the 393 complete application packet; and

394 3. For individuals who have obtained a valid out-of-state license, with full credentials and without
395 deficiencies, that is in force at the time the application for a Virginia license is received by the
396 Department. Each such individual shall establish a file in the Department by submitting a complete
397 application packet, which shall include official student transcripts. No service requirements or licensing
398 assessments shall be required for any such individual.

399 L. The Board shall include in its regulations an alternate route to licensure for elementary education 400 preschool through grade six and an alternate route to licensure for special education general curriculum 401 kindergarten through grade 12. Each such alternate route to licensure shall require individuals to (i) meet 402 the qualifying scores on the content area assessment prescribed by the Board for the endorsements 403 sought and (ii) complete an alternative certification program that provides training in the pedagogy and methodology of the respective content or special education areas prescribed by the Board. The 404 405 curriculum of any such alternative certification program shall be approved by the Board. Nothing in this 406 subsection shall preclude the Board from establishing other alternate routes to licensure.

407 M. The Board, in its regulations providing for licensure by reciprocity established pursuant to
408 subsection K, shall (i) permit applicants to submit third-party employment verification forms and (ii)
409 grant special consideration to individuals who have successfully completed a program offered by a
410 provider that is accredited by the Council for the Accreditation of Educator Preparation.

411 N. The Board shall develop guidelines that establish a process to permit a school board or any 412 organization sponsored by a school board to petition the Board for approval of an alternate route to 413 licensure that may be used to meet the requirements for a provisional or renewable license or any 414 endorsement. Any such alternate route may include alternatives to the regulatory requirements for 415 teacher preparation, including alternative professional assessments and coursework. The petitioner may 416 proffer or the Board may impose conditions in conjunction with the approval of such petition.
