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11	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
12	1. That § 2.2-4002 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
13 14	 § 2.2-4002. Exemptions from chapter generally. A. Although required to comply with § 2.2-4103 of the Virginia Register Act (§ 2.2-4100 et seq.),
14	the following agencies shall be exempted from the provisions of this chapter, except to the extent that
16	they are specifically made subject to §§ 2.2-4024, 2.2-4030, and 2.2-4031:
17	1. The General Assembly.
18	2. Courts, any agency of the Supreme Court, and any agency that by the Constitution is expressly
19	granted any of the powers of a court of record.
20	3. The Department of Wildlife Resources in promulgating regulations regarding the management of
21	wildlife and for all case decisions rendered pursuant to any provisions of Chapters 2 (§ 29.1-200 et
22	seq.), 3 (§ 29.1-300 et seq.), 4 (§ 29.1-400 et seq.), 5 (§ 29.1-500 et seq.), and 7 (§ 29.1-700 et seq.) of
23	Title 29.1, except that such regulations and case decisions (a) of Article 6 (§ 29.1-563 et seq.) of
24 25	Chapter 5 of Title 29.1 shall not be exempted pursuant to this section; or (b) related to the take of
25	wildlife incidental to but not as the purpose of an otherwise lawful activity.
26 27	4. The Virginia Housing Development Authority.5. Municipal corporations, counties, and all local, regional, or multijurisdictional authorities created
28	under this Code, including those with federal authorities.
2 9	6. Educational institutions operated by the Commonwealth, provided that, with respect to § 2.2-4031,
30	such educational institutions shall be exempt from the publication requirements only with respect to
31	regulations that pertain to (i) their academic affairs, (ii) the selection, tenure, promotion, and disciplining
32	of faculty and employees, (iii) the selection of students, and (iv) rules of conduct and disciplining of
33	students.
34	7. The Milk Commission in promulgating regulations regarding (i) producers' licenses and bases, (ii)
35	classification and allocation of milk, computation of sales, and shrinkage, and (iii) class prices for
36	producers' milk, time and method of payment, butterfat testing, and differential.

65 subsection C of § 35.1-14 that incorporate the Food and Drug Administration's Food Code pertaining to 66 restaurants or food service. 67

23. The Board of Pharmacy when specifying special subject requirements for continuing education 68 69 for pharmacists pursuant to § 54.1-3314.1.

70 24. The Virginia Department of Veterans Services when promulgating rules and regulations pursuant 71 to § 58.1-3219.7 or 58.1-3219.11.

25. The Virginia Department of Criminal Justice Services when developing, issuing, or revising any 72 training standards established by the Criminal Justice Services Board under § 9.1-102, provided such 73 74 actions are authorized by the Governor in the interest of public safety.

75 B. Agency action relating to the following subjects shall be exempted from the provisions of this 76 chapter: 77

1. Money or damage claims against the Commonwealth or agencies thereof.

2. The award or denial of state contracts, as well as decisions regarding compliance therewith.

79 3. The location, design, specifications, or construction of public buildings or other facilities.

80 4. Grants of state or federal funds or property.

81 5. The chartering of corporations.

82 6. Customary military, militia, naval, or police functions.

83 7. The selection, tenure, dismissal, direction, or control of any officer or employee of an agency of 84 the Commonwealth. 85

8. The conduct of elections or eligibility to vote.

9. Inmates of prisons or other such facilities or parolees therefrom.

87 10. The custody of persons in, or sought to be placed in, mental health facilities or penal or other 88 state institutions as well as the treatment, supervision, or discharge of such persons.

89 11. Traffic signs, markers, or control devices.

90 12. Instructions for application or renewal of a license, certificate, or registration required by law.

91 13. Content of, or rules for the conduct of, any examination required by law. 92

14. The administration of pools authorized by Chapter 47 (§ 2.2-4700 et seq.).

93 15. Any rules for the conduct of specific lottery games, so long as such rules are not inconsistent with duly adopted regulations of the Virginia Lottery Board, and provided that such regulations are 94 95 published and posted.

16. Orders condemning or closing any shellfish, finfish, or crustacea growing area and the shellfish, 96 finfish, or crustacea located thereon pursuant to Article 2 (§ 28.2-803 et seq.) of Chapter 8 of Title 28.2. 97

98 17. Any operating procedures for review of child deaths developed by the State Child Fatality 99 Review Team pursuant to § 32.1-283.1, any operating procedures for review of adult deaths developed by the Adult Fatality Review Team pursuant to § 32.1-283.5, any operating procedures for review of 100 101 adult deaths developed by the Maternal Mortality Review Team pursuant to § 32.1-283.8, and any operating procedures for review of the deaths of persons with a developmental disability developed by the Developmental Disabilities Mortality Review Committee pursuant to § 37.2-314.1. 102 103

18. The regulations for the implementation of the Health Practitioners' Monitoring Program and the 104 activities of the Health Practitioners' Monitoring Program Committee pursuant to Chapter 25.1 (§ 105 106 54.1-2515 et seq.) of Title 54.1.

107 19. The process of reviewing and ranking grant applications submitted to the Commonwealth 108 Neurotrauma Initiative Advisory Board pursuant to Article 12 (§ 51.5-178 et seq.) of Chapter 14 of Title 109 51.5.

110 20. Loans from the Small Business Environmental Compliance Assistance Fund pursuant to Article 4 111 (§ 10.1-1197.1 et seq.) of Chapter 11.1 of Title 10.1.

21. The Virginia Breeders Fund created pursuant to § 59.1-372. 112

113 22. The types of pari-mutuel wagering pools available for live or simulcast horse racing.

114 23. The administration of medication or other substances foreign to the natural horse.

115 24. Any rules adopted by the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services for the approval and conduct of game variations for the conduct of raffles, bingo, network bingo, and instant bingo games, 116 provided that such rules are (i) consistent with Article 1.1:1 (§ 18.2-340.15 et seq.) of Chapter 8 of Title 117 118 18.2 and (ii) published and posted.

119 C. Minor changes to regulations published in the Virginia Administrative Code under the Virginia Register Act (§ 2.2-4100 et seq.), made by the Virginia Code Commission pursuant to § 30-150, shall be 120

121 exempt from the provisions of this chapter.

122 2. That guidance documents developed prior to the effective date of this act pursuant to Article 6 (§ 29.1-563 et seq.) of Chapter 5 of Title 29.1 of the Code of Virginia or guidance documents developed and used by the Department of Wildlife Resources in making comments or providing 123 124 125 consultation to the Department of Environmental Quality or the Virginia Marine Resources Commission during such agencies' decision-making processes and in use by the Department of 126 Wildlife Resources as of the effective date of this act shall expire on December 31, 2023, unless 127 128 such documents are filed for publication with the Virginia Registrar of Regulations by August 1, 129 2023, and made available for public comment as prescribed in § 2.2-4002.1 of the Code of Virginia 130 by December 31, 2023.

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
