10 11	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 1. That § 54.1-2957.16 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
12	§ 54.1-2957.16. Licensure of behavior analysts and assistant behavior analysts; requirements;
13	powers of the Board.
14	A. It shall be is unlawful for any person to practice or to hold himself out as practicing as a
15	behavior analyst or to use the title "Licensed Behavior Analyst" unless he holds a license as a behavior
16	analyst issued by the Board. It shall be is unlawful for any person to practice or to hold himself out as
17 18	practicing as an assistant behavior analyst or to use the title "Licensed Assistant Behavior Analyst" unless he holds a license as an assistant behavior analyst issued by the Board. The Board shall issue
19	licenses to practice as a behavior analyst or an assistant behavior analyst to applicants for licensure who
20	meet the requirements of this chapter and the Board's regulations.
21	B. The Board shall establish criteria for licensure as a behavior analyst, which shall include, but not
22	be limited to, the following:
23	1. Documentation that the applicant is currently certified as a Board Certified Behavior Analyst by
24 25	the Behavior Analyst Certification Board or any other entity that is nationally accredited to certify practitioners of behavior analysis its successor;
23 26	2. Documentation that the applicant conducts his professional practice in accordance with the
<b>2</b> 7	Behavior Analyst Certification Board Guidelines for Responsible Conduct and Professional Ethical and
28	Disciplinary Standards ethics code for behavior analysts and any other accepted professional and ethical

30 31	3. Documentation that the applicant for licensure has not had his license or certification as a behavior analyst or as an assistant behavior analyst suspended or revoked and is not the subject of any
31 32	disciplinary proceedings by the certifying board or in another jurisdiction.
33	C. The Board shall establish criteria for licensure as an assistant behavior analyst, which shall
34	include, but not be limited to, the following:
35	1. Documentation that the applicant is currently certified as a Board Certified Assistant Behavior
36	Analyst by the Behavior Analyst Certification Board or any other entity that is nationally accredited to
37 38	certify practitioners of behavior analysis <i>its successor</i> ; 2. Documentation that the applicant conducts his professional practice in accordance with the
39	Behavior Analyst Certification Board Guidelines for Responsible Conduct and Professional Ethical and
40	Disciplinary Standards ethics code for behavior analysts and any other accepted professional and ethical
41	standards the Board deems necessary;
42	3. Documentation that the applicant for licensure has not had his license or certification as an
43 44	assistant behavior analyst suspended or revoked and is not the subject of any disciplinary proceedings by
44	the certifying board or in another jurisdiction; and 4. Documentation that the applicant's work is supervised by a licensed behavior analyst in accordance
46	with the supervision requirements and procedures established by the Board.
47	D. The Board shall promulgate such regulations as may be necessary to implement the provisions of
<b>48</b>	this chapter related to (i) application for and issuance of licenses to behavior analysts or assistant
<b>49</b>	behavior analysts, (ii) requirements for licensure as a behavior analyst or an assistant behavior analyst,
50 51	(iii) standards of practice for licensed behavior analysts or licensed assistant behavior analysts, (iv) requirements and procedures for the supervision of a licensed assistant behavior analyst by a licensed
51 52	behavior analyst, and (v) requirements and procedures for supervision by licensed behavior analysts and
53	licensed assistant behavior analysts of unlicensed individuals who assist in the provision of applied
54	behavior analysis services.
55	E. The Board shall establish a fee, determined in accordance with methods used to establish fees for
56 57	other health professionals licensed by the Board of Medicine, to be paid by all applicants for licensure
57	as a behavior analyst or assistant behavior analyst.
