11	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
12	1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Article 12 of Chapter 22 of Title 2.2 a
13	section numbered 2.2-2377 as follows:
14	§ 2.2-2377. Commonwealth Opioid Abatement and Remediation Fund.
15	There is hereby created in the state treasury a special nonreverting fund to be known as the
16	Commonwealth Opioid Abatement and Remediation Fund, referred to in this section as "the Fund." The
17	Fund shall be established on the books of the Comptroller. All funds received pursuant to a direct
18	settlement, judgment, verdict, or other court order relating to consumer protection claims regarding the
19	manufacturing, marketing, distribution, or sale of opioids or that are intended to be used for opioid
20	abatement or remediation, excluding funds designated for transfer to the Opioid Abatement Authority
21	established under this chapter, and that shall be deposited by the Office of the Attorney General in such
22	amounts into the Fund, or appropriated for such purpose, and any gifts, donations, grants, bequests,
23	and other funds received on its behalf shall be paid into the state treasury and credited to the Fund.
24	Interest earned on moneys in the Fund shall remain in the Fund and be credited to it. Any moneys
25	remaining in the Fund, including interest thereon, at the end of each fiscal year shall not revert to the
26 27	general fund but shall remain in the Fund. The Fund shall be administered by the Department of Health
27 28	and moneys in the Fund shall be used solely for the purposes of efforts to treat, prevent, or reduce opioid use disorder or the misuse of opioids or to otherwise abate or remediate the opioid epidemic, or
20 29	for any other approved purposes to the extent such purposes are described in a related settlement,
<b>30</b>	judgment, verdict, or other court order. The Department of Health shall establish and publish guidelines
30 31	and criteria for uses of moneys in the Fund consistent with such purposes. To the degree practicable,
32	the implementation and maintenance of performance measures associated with the use of such funds
33	shall be documented and remitted to the Opioid Abatement Authority upon request. Expenditures and
34	disbursements from the Fund shall be made by the State Treasurer on warrants issued by the

35 Comptroller upon written request signed by the Secretary of Health and Human Resources.
