23106344D **SENATE BILL NO. 1427** 1 2 FLOOR AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE 3 (Proposed by Senator Suetterlein 4 on February 6, 2023) 5 (Patron Prior to Substitute—Senator Suetterlein) 6 A BILL to amend and reenact §§ 24.2-949.6, 24.2-949.7, and 24.2-953.1 of the Code of Virginia and to 7 amend the Code of Virginia by adding a section numbered 24.2-949.7:1, relating to campaign finance; political action committees; certain large pre-election expenditures. 8 9 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 1. That §§ 24.2-949.6, 24.2-949.7, and 24.2-953.1 of the Code of Virginia are amended and 10 reenacted and that the Code of Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 24.2-949.7:1 as 11 12 follows: 13 § 24.2-949.6. Filing schedule for political action committees. 14 A. Political action committees shall file the prescribed campaign finance reports with the State Board 15 in accordance with the applicable provisions of this section. The first filed report shall be complete for the entire period from the time the committee was organized or contributions were received. 16 17 B. The reporting requirements shall continue in effect for each committee until a final report is filed. 18 C. Political action committees shall file the prescribed campaign finance reports as follows: 19 1. Not later than April 15 complete from the preceding report through March 31; 20 2. Not later than July 15 June 1 complete from the preceding report through June 30 May 25; 21 3. Not later than October September 15 complete from the preceding report through September 30 22 August 31; and 23 4. Not later than October 15 complete from the preceding report through October 7; and 24 5. Not later than January 15 complete from the preceding report through December 31, and then 25 continuing in accordance with this subsection until a final report is filed. D. A political action committee that files its statement of organization on or after March 15 and 26 27 before the third Tuesday in June in any odd-numbered year shall file with its statement of organization a campaign finance report as provided in § 24.2-949.5 for that year, complete through the date that it 28 29 files its statement of organization, and if such political action committee files its statement of 30 organization before the twelfth day before the third Tuesday in June, such political action committee shall file its next campaign finance report in accordance with subdivision \hat{C} 2. After the twelfth day 31 32 before the third Tuesday in June, or after the date a political action committee has filed its statement of organization if the political action committee has filed its statement of organization on or after the 33 eleventh day before the third Tuesday in June, and until the third Tuesday in June, the political action 34 35 committee shall report any single contribution or expenditure of \$500 or more to the State Board in 36 writing or electronically pursuant to § 24.2-946.1, and the report shall be received by the State Board 37 by 11:59 p.m. on the following day or, for a contribution received or expenditure made on a Saturday, 38 by 11:59 p.m. on the following Monday. However, any such contribution received or expenditure made 39 within the 24 hours prior to the third Tuesday in June shall be reported and a report thereof received 40 on the day prior to the third Tuesday in June. Any activity reported pursuant to this subsection shall also be reported on the report required to be filed for activity through August 31. 41 42 E. A political action committee that files its statement of organization on or after August 15 and before the November election day in any odd-numbered year shall file with its statement of organization 43 a campaign finance report as provided in § 24.2-949.5 for that year, complete through the date that it 44 files its statement of organization, and if such political action committee files its statement of 45 organization before September 30 October 15, such political action committee shall file its next 46 campaign finance report in accordance with subdivision C 3 4. After September 30 October 15, or after 47 the date a political action committee has filed its statement of organization if the political action **48** committee has filed its statement of organization on or after October 1 October 16, and until the 49 November election day, the political action committee shall report any single contribution or expenditure 50 51 of \$500 or more to the State Board in writing or electronically pursuant to § 24.2-946.1, and the report shall be received by the State Board by 11:59 p.m. on the following day_{τ} or, for a contribution received 52 or expenditure made on a Saturday, by 11:59 p.m. on the following Monday. However, any such 53 54 contribution received or expenditure made within the 24 hours prior to the election day shall be reported and a report thereof received on the day prior to the election. Any activity reported pursuant to this 55 subsection shall also be reported on the report required to be filed for activity through December 31. 56 57 § 24.2-949.7. Large dollar contribution reporting requirement for political action committees. 58

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In addition to the quarterly scheduled reports required by § 24.2-949.6, political action committees 59 shall report any single contribution or loan of \$10,000 or more received at any time during the calendar

year within three business days of receipt of the contribution or loan. 60

1. The report shall be filed on a "large dollar contribution report" form prescribed by the State Board 61 62 and shall be filed in writing or electronically in the same manner as the political action committee files 63 its quarterly disclosure scheduled reports.

64 2. Any contribution or loan reported pursuant to this section shall also be reported on the next 65 subsequent report required under § 24.2-949.6 following receipt of the contribution or loan.

66 3. For the purposes of this section, political action committees shall report as one contribution multiple contributions from a single source that have been subdivided into smaller amounts or given 67 68 through different bank accounts for the purpose of evading the \$10,000 threshold. A political action committee that receives contributions from affiliated organizations shall not be deemed to be receiving 69 70 contributions from a single source. 71

§ 24.2-949.7:1. Special report required of certain large pre-election expenditures.

72 A. Any contribution or expenditure reported pursuant to this section shall also be reported on the 73 first report required by this article after any election.

74 B. Political action committees shall report any single contribution received or expenditure made of \$1,000 or more between May 26 and the third Tuesday in June. Such contribution or expenditure shall 75 be reported electronically pursuant to § 24.2-946.1, and the report shall be received by the State Board 76 by 11:59 p.m. on the following day or, for a contribution received or expenditure made on a Saturday, 77 78 by 11:59 p.m. on the following Monday. However, any such contribution received or expenditure made 79 within the 24 hours prior to the third Tuesday in June shall be reported and a report thereof received on the day prior to the third Tuesday in June. 80

C. Political action committees shall report any single contribution received or expenditure made of 81 \$1,000 or more between October 8 and the date of the November general election. Such contribution or 82 83 expenditure shall be reported electronically pursuant to § 24.2-946.1, and the report shall be received by the State Board by 11:59 p.m. on the following day or, for a contribution received or expenditure made on a Saturday, by 11:59 p.m. on the following Monday. However, any such contribution received 84 85 or expenditure made within the 24 hours prior to the election day shall be reported and a report thereof 86 87 received on the day prior to the election. 88

§ 24.2-953.1. Failure to file the required reports.

89 A. In the case of a failure to file the statement of organization for a candidate campaign committee 90 or political committee required by this chapter, there shall be a civil penalty not to exceed \$500.

91 B. In the case of the failure to file a required report, the candidate campaign committee or political committee shall be assessed a civil penalty not to exceed \$500. In the case of the failure to file a report 92 required pursuant to subsection D or E of § 24.2-949.6, the political action committee shall be assessed 93 a civil penalty not to exceed \$500. In the case of a second or any subsequent such violation pertaining 94 95 to one election cycle, the candidate campaign committee or political committee shall be assessed a civil 96 penalty of \$1,000 for each such failure to file.

C. In the case of a failure to file the report of any large pre-election contribution required by 97 98 § 24.2-947.9 or 24.2-949.7:1 or a report required pursuant to subsection D or E of § 24.2-949.6, there 99 shall be a rebuttable presumption that the violation was willful.
