## **SENATE BILL NO. 429**

AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE

(Proposed by the Senate Committee on Education and Health)

(Patron Prior to Substitute—Senator Dunnavant)

- 2 3 4 5 6 Senate Amendments in [] - February 10, 2022 A BILL to amend the Code of Virginia by adding a section numbered 37.2-312.3 and by adding in 7 Chapter 11 of Title 52 a section numbered 52-49.1, relating to the Department of Behavioral Health 8 and Developmental Services and the Department of State Police; mobile applications; mental health 9 and public safety.
- 10 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 37.2-312.3 and by adding 11 in Chapter 11 of Title 52 a section numbered 52-49.1 as follows: 12 13

§ 37.2-312.3. Mental health mobile application.

14 A. The Department shall develop or obtain a mental health mobile application for suicide prevention 15 and the provision of educational materials related to suicide prevention. The mobile application shall provide a means to directly connect to the 988 Suicide Prevention Lifeline. [ The Department shall 16 17 ensure that the mobile application protects the identity and confidential information of any individual who uses it, except as necessary for referral to the 988 Suicide Prevention Lifeline or law enforcement 18 or unless confidentiality is waived by the individual. 19

20 B. The Secretary of Health and Human Resources and the Secretary of Education shall determine 21 and direct the appropriate agencies to promote, market, and advertise the use of the mental health 22 mobile application throughout the Commonwealth through such agencies' existing staff and digital 23 programs [ and social media platforms ]. 24

§ 52-49.1. Public safety mobile application.

25 A. The Department of State Police shall develop or obtain a public safety mobile application to provide to individuals in the Commonwealth a platform that is capable of receiving text, audio, images, 26 27 and video to submit confidential tips concerning a suspected, anticipated, or completed criminal 28 violation, including bullying and threats of school violence. The Department of State Police shall 29 develop a referral system to ensure that tips received through the mobile application are referred to the 30 chief law-enforcement officer of the relevant jurisdiction for proper coordination of response and investigation. Such coordination shall include the local school board, the threat assessment team 31 32 established pursuant to § 22.1-79.4 or 23.1-805, or any other relevant entity. [The Department of State 33 Police shall ensure that the mobile application protects the identity and confidential information of any 34 individual who uses it, except as necessary for referral to the 988 Suicide Prevention Lifeline or another 35 *law-enforcement agency or unless confidentiality is waived by the individual.* ]

36 B. The Secretary of Public Safety and Homeland Security shall determine and direct the appropriate 37 agencies to promote, market, and advertise the use of the public safety mobile application throughout 38 the Commonwealth through such agencies' existing staff and digital programs [ and social media 39 platforms].

2. That the provisions of § 37.2-312.3 of the Code of Virginia, as created by this act, shall become 40 41 effective on July 1, 2023.

[ 3. That the provisions of this act shall not become effective unless an appropriation effectuating 42

43 the purposes of this act is included in a general appropriation act passed in 2022 by the General

Assembly that becomes law. ] 44
