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SENATE BILL NO. 983

AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE

(Proposed by the Senate Committee on Rehabilitation and Social Services
on January 27, 2023)

(Patron Prior to Substitute—Senator Mason)

A BILL to amend and reenact §§ 4.1-100, 4.1-206.1, as it is currently effective and as it shall become effective, 4.1-219, and 4.1-231.1 of the Code of Virginia, relating to alcoholic beverage control; winery and farm winery licenses; requirements and privileges.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

1. That §§ 4.1-100, 4.1-206.1, as it is currently effective and as it shall become effective, 4.1-219, and 4.1-231.1 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted as follows:

§ 4.1-100. Definitions.

As used in this subtitle unless the context requires a different meaning:

"Alcohol" means the product known as ethyl or grain alcohol obtained by distillation of any fermented liquor, rectified either once or more often, whatever the origin, and shall include synthetic ethyl alcohol, but shall not include methyl alcohol and alcohol completely denatured in accordance with formulas approved by the government of the United States.

"Alcohol vaporizing device" means any device, machine, or process that mixes any alcoholic beverages with pure oxygen or other gas to produce a vaporized product for the purpose of consumption by inhalation.

"Alcoholic beverages" includes alcohol, spirits, wine, and beer, and any one or more of such varieties containing one-half of one percent or more of alcohol by volume, including mixed alcoholic beverages, and every liquid or solid, powder or crystal, patented or not, containing alcohol, spirits, wine, or beer and capable of being consumed by a human being. Any liquid or solid containing more than one of the four varieties shall be considered as belonging to that variety which has the higher percentage of alcohol, however obtained, according to the order in which they are set forth in this definition; except that beer may be manufactured to include flavoring materials and other nonbeverage ingredients containing alcohol, as long as no more than 49 percent of the overall alcohol content of the finished product is derived from the addition of flavors and other nonbeverage ingredients containing alcohol for products with an alcohol content of no more than six percent by volume; or, in the case of products with an alcohol content of more than six percent by volume, as long as no more than one and one-half percent of the volume of the finished product consists of alcohol derived from added flavors and other nonbeverage ingredients containing alcohol.

"Arts venue" means a commercial or nonprofit establishment that is open to the public and in which works of art are sold or displayed.

"Authority" means the Virginia Alcoholic Beverage Control Authority created pursuant to this subtitle.

"Barrel" means any container or vessel having a capacity of more than 43 ounces.

"Bed and breakfast establishment" means any establishment (i) having no more than 15 bedrooms; (ii) offering to the public, for compensation, transitory lodging or sleeping accommodations; and (iii) offering at least one meal per day, which may but need not be breakfast, to each person to whom overnight lodging is provided. For purposes of the licensing requirements of this subtitle, "bed and breakfast establishment" includes any property offered to the public for short-term rental, as that term is defined in § 15.2-983, other than a hotel as defined in this section, regardless of whether a meal is offered to each person to whom overnight lodging is provided.

"Beer" means any alcoholic beverage obtained by the fermentation of an infusion or decoction of barley, malt, and hops or of any similar products in drinkable water and containing one-half of one percent or more of alcohol by volume.

"Board" means the Board of Directors of the Virginia Alcoholic Beverage Control Authority.

"Bottle" means any vessel intended to contain liquids and having a capacity of not more than 43 ounces.

"Bus" means a motor vehicle that (i) is operated by a common carrier licensed under Chapter 20 (§ 46.2-2000 et seq.) of Title 46.2 to transport passengers for compensation over the highways of the Commonwealth on regular or irregular routes of not less than 100 miles, (ii) seats no more than 24 passengers, (iii) is 40 feet in length or longer, (iv) offers wireless Internet services, (v) is equipped with charging stations at every seat for cellular phones or other portable devices, and (vi) during the transportation of passengers, is staffed by an attendant who has satisfied all training requirements set forth in this subtitle or Board regulation.

"Club" means any private nonprofit corporation or association which is the owner, lessee, or

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60 occupant of an establishment operated solely for a national, social, patriotic, political, athletic, or other
61 like purpose, but not for pecuniary gain, the advantages of which belong to all of the members. It also
62 means the establishment so operated. A corporation or association shall not lose its status as a club
63 because of the conduct of charitable gaming conducted pursuant to Article 1.1:1 (§ 18.2-340.15 et seq.)
64 of Chapter 8 of Title 18.2 in which nonmembers participate frequently or in large numbers, provided
65 that no alcoholic beverages are served or consumed in the room where such charitable gaming is being
66 conducted while such gaming is being conducted and that no alcoholic beverages are made available
67 upon the premises to any person who is neither a member nor a bona fide guest of a member.

68 Any such corporation or association which has been declared exempt from federal and state income
69 taxes as one which is not organized and operated for pecuniary gain or profit shall be deemed a
70 nonprofit corporation or association.

71 "Commercial lifestyle center" means a mixed-use commercial development covering a minimum of
72 10 acres of land and having at least 100,000 square feet of retail space featuring national specialty chain
73 stores and a combination of dining, entertainment, office, residential, or hotel establishments located in a
74 physically integrated outdoor setting that is pedestrian friendly and that is governed by a commercial
75 owners' association that is responsible for the management, maintenance, and operation of the common
76 areas thereof.

77 "Container" means any barrel, bottle, carton, keg, vessel, or other receptacle used for holding
78 alcoholic beverages.

79 "Contract winemaking facility" means the premises of a licensed winery or farm winery that obtains
80 grapes, fruits, and other agricultural products from a person holding a *winery or farm winery* license and
81 crushes, processes, ferments, bottles, or provides any combination of such services pursuant to an
82 agreement with the *winery or farm winery* licensee. For all purposes of this subtitle, wine produced by a
83 contract winemaking facility for a *winery or farm winery* shall be considered to be wine owned and
84 produced by the *winery or farm winery* that supplied the grapes, fruits, or other agricultural products
85 used in the production of the wine. The contract winemaking facility shall have no right to sell the wine
86 so produced, unless the terms of payment have not been fulfilled in accordance with the contract. The
87 contract winemaking facility may charge the *winery or farm winery* for its services. *A winery licensee*
88 *may utilize contract winemaking services only for the manufacture or processing of wine of which no*
89 *less than 90 percent of the grapes, fruits, and other agricultural products used to make such wine are*
90 *grown in the Commonwealth.*

91 "Convenience grocery store" means an establishment that (i) has an enclosed room in a permanent
92 structure where stock is displayed and offered for sale and (ii) maintains an inventory of edible items
93 intended for human consumption consisting of a variety of such items of the types normally sold in
94 grocery stores.

95 "Culinary lodging resort" means a facility (i) having not less than 13 overnight guest rooms in a
96 building that has at least 20,000 square feet of indoor floor space; (ii) located on a farm in the
97 Commonwealth with at least 1,000 acres of land zoned agricultural; (iii) equipped with a full-service
98 kitchen; and (iv) offering to the public, for compensation, at least one meal per day, lodging, and
99 recreational and educational activities related to farming, livestock, and other rural activities.

100 "Delicatessen" means an establishment that sells a variety of prepared foods or foods requiring little
101 preparation, such as cheeses, salads, cooked meats, and related condiments.

102 "Designated area" means a room or area approved by the Board for on-premises licensees.

103 "Dining area" means a public room or area in which meals are regularly served.

104 "Drugstore" means an establishment that sells medicines prepared by a licensed pharmacist pursuant
105 to a prescription and other medicines and items for home and general use.

106 "Establishment" means any place where alcoholic beverages of one or more varieties are lawfully
107 manufactured, sold, or used.

108 "Farm winery" means (i) an establishment ~~(a)~~ *or cooperative* located ~~on a farm~~ in the
109 Commonwealth on land zoned agricultural ~~with that has (a) a producing~~ vineyard, orchard, or similar
110 growing area *that produces grapes or other fruits used to manufacture the wine of such farm winery,*
111 *subject to the requirements set forth in § 4.1-219, and with (b) facilities for fermenting and bottling*
112 *wine on the premises where the owner or lessee such farm winery manufactures wine that contains not*
113 *more than 21 percent alcohol by volume or (b) located in the Commonwealth on land zoned agricultural*
114 *with a producing vineyard, orchard, or similar growing area or agreements for purchasing grapes or*
115 *other fruits from agricultural growers within the Commonwealth, and with facilities for fermenting and*
116 *bottling wine on the premises where the owner or lessee manufactures wine that contains not more than*
117 *24 percent alcohol by volume or (ii) an accredited public or private institution of higher education,*
118 *provided that (a) no wine manufactured by the institution shall be sold, (b) the wine manufactured by*
119 *the institution shall be used solely for research and educational purposes, (c) the wine manufactured by*
120 *the institution shall be stored on the premises of such farm winery that shall be separate and apart from*
121 *all other facilities of the institution, and (d) such farm winery is operated in strict conformance with the*

122 requirements of this clause (ii) and Board regulations. As used in this definition, the terms "owner" and
 123 "lessee" shall include term "cooperative" means a cooperative formed by an association of individuals
 124 for the purpose of manufacturing wine. In the event that such determining whether a cooperative is
 125 licensed as a farm winery, has met the term "farm" as used in this definition includes requirements set
 126 forth in clause (i), the Board shall consider all of the land in the Commonwealth that is owned or
 127 leased by the individual members a member of the cooperative as long as such land is located in the
 128 Commonwealth. For purposes of this definition, "land zoned agricultural" means (1) land zoned as an
 129 agricultural district or classification or (2) land otherwise permitted by a locality for farm winery use.
 130 For purposes of this definition, "land zoned agricultural" does not include land zoned "residential
 131 conservation." Except for the limitation on land zoned "residential conservation," nothing in the
 132 definition of "land zoned agricultural" shall otherwise limit or affect local zoning authority.

133 "Gift shop" means any bona fide retail store selling, predominantly, gifts, books, souvenirs, specialty
 134 items relating to history, original and handmade arts and products, collectibles, crafts, and floral
 135 arrangements, which is open to the public on a regular basis. Such shop shall be a permanent structure
 136 where stock is displayed and offered for sale and which has facilities to properly secure any stock of
 137 wine or beer. Such shop may be located (i) on the premises or grounds of a government registered
 138 national, state or local historic building or site or (ii) within the premises of a museum. The Board shall
 139 consider the purpose, characteristics, nature, and operation of the shop in determining whether it shall be
 140 considered a gift shop.

141 "Gourmet brewing shop" means an establishment which sells to persons to whom wine or beer may
 142 lawfully be sold, ingredients for making wine or brewing beer, including packaging, and rents to such
 143 persons facilities for manufacturing, fermenting and bottling such wine or beer.

144 "Gourmet oyster house" means an establishment that (i) is located on the premises of a commercial
 145 marina, (ii) is permitted by the Department of Health to serve oysters and other fresh seafood for
 146 consumption on the premises, and (iii) offers to the public events for the purpose of featuring and
 147 educating the consuming public about local oysters and other seafood products.

148 "Gourmet shop" means an establishment provided with adequate inventory, shelving, and storage
 149 facilities, where, in consideration of payment, substantial amounts of domestic and imported wines and
 150 beers of various types and sizes and related products such as cheeses and gourmet foods are habitually
 151 furnished to persons.

152 "Government store" means a store established by the Authority for the sale of alcoholic beverages.

153 "Grocery store" means an establishment that sells food and other items intended for human
 154 consumption, including a variety of ingredients commonly used in the preparation of meals.

155 "Historic cinema house" means a nonprofit establishment exempt from taxation under § 501(c)(3) of
 156 the Internal Revenue Code that was built prior to 1970 and that exists for the primary purpose of
 157 showing motion pictures to the public.

158 "Hotel" means any duly licensed establishment, provided with special space and accommodation,
 159 where, in consideration of payment, food and lodging are habitually furnished to persons, and which has
 160 four or more bedrooms. It shall also mean the person who operates such hotel.

161 "Interdicted person" means a person to whom the sale of alcoholic beverages is prohibited by order
 162 pursuant to this subtitle.

163 "Internet wine and beer retailer" means a person who owns or operates an establishment with
 164 adequate inventory, shelving, and storage facilities, where, in consideration of payment, Internet or
 165 telephone orders are taken and shipped directly to consumers and which establishment is not a retail
 166 store open to the public.

167 "Intoxicated" means a condition in which a person has drunk enough alcoholic beverages to
 168 observably affect his manner, disposition, speech, muscular movement, general appearance, or behavior.

169 "Licensed" means the holding of a valid license granted by the Authority.

170 "Licensee" means any person to whom a license has been granted by the Authority.

171 "Liqueur" means any of a class of highly flavored alcoholic beverages that do not exceed an alcohol
 172 content of 25 percent by volume.

173 "Low alcohol beverage cooler" means a drink containing one-half of one percent or more of alcohol
 174 by volume, but not more than seven and one-half percent alcohol by volume, and consisting of spirits
 175 mixed with nonalcoholic beverages or flavoring or coloring materials; it may also contain water, fruit
 176 juices, fruit adjuncts, sugar, carbon dioxide, preservatives or other similar products manufactured by
 177 fermenting fruit or fruit juices. Low alcohol beverage coolers shall be treated as wine for all purposes of
 178 this subtitle, except that low alcohol beverage coolers may be manufactured by a licensed distiller or a
 179 distiller located outside the Commonwealth.

180 "Marina store" means an establishment that is located on the same premises as a marina, is operated
 181 by the owner of such marina, and sells food and nautical and fishing supplies.

182 "Meals" means, for a mixed beverage license, an assortment of foods commonly ordered in bona

183 fide, full-service restaurants as principal meals of the day. Such restaurants shall include establishments
184 specializing in full course meals with a single substantial entree.

185 "Member of a club" means (i) a person who maintains his membership in the club by the payment of
186 monthly, quarterly, or annual dues in the manner established by the rules and regulations thereof or (ii)
187 a person who is a member of a bona fide auxiliary, local chapter, or squadron composed of direct lineal
188 descendants of a bona fide member, whether alive or deceased, of a national or international
189 organization to which an individual lodge holding a club license is an authorized member in the same
190 locality. It shall also mean a lifetime member whose financial contribution is not less than 10 times the
191 annual dues of resident members of the club, the full amount of such contribution being paid in advance
192 in a lump sum.

193 "Mixed beverage" or "mixed alcoholic beverage" means a drink composed in whole or in part of
194 spirits.

195 "Mixer" means any prepackaged ingredients containing beverages or flavoring or coloring materials,
196 and which may also contain water, fruit juices, fruit adjuncts, sugar, carbon dioxide, or preservatives
197 which are not commonly consumed unless combined with alcoholic beverages, whether or not such
198 ingredients contain alcohol. Such specialty beverage product shall be manufactured or distributed by a
199 Virginia corporation.

200 "Municipal golf course" means any golf course that is owned by any town incorporated in 1849 and
201 which is the county seat of Smyth County.

202 "Place or premises" means the real estate, together with any buildings or other improvements thereon,
203 designated in the application for a license as the place at which the manufacture, bottling, distribution,
204 use or sale of alcoholic beverages shall be performed, except that portion of any such building or other
205 improvement actually and exclusively used as a private residence.

206 "Principal stockholder" means any person who individually or in concert with his spouse and
207 immediate family members beneficially owns or controls, directly or indirectly, five percent or more of
208 the equity ownership of any person that is a licensee of the Authority, or who in concert with his spouse
209 and immediate family members has the power to vote or cause the vote of five percent or more of any
210 such equity ownership. "Principal stockholder" does not include a broker-dealer registered under the
211 Securities Exchange Act of 1934, as amended, that holds in inventory shares for sale on the financial
212 markets for a publicly traded corporation holding, directly or indirectly, a license from the Authority.

213 "Public place" means any place, building, or conveyance to which the public has, or is permitted to
214 have, access, including restaurants, soda fountains, hotel dining areas, lobbies and corridors of hotels,
215 and any park, place of public resort or amusement, highway, street, lane, or sidewalk adjoining any
216 highway, street, or lane.

217 "Public place" does not include (i) hotel or restaurant dining areas or ballrooms while in use for
218 private meetings or private parties limited in attendance to members and guests of a particular group,
219 association or organization; (ii) restaurants licensed by the Authority in office buildings or industrial or
220 similar facilities while such restaurant is closed to the public and in use for private meetings or parties
221 limited in attendance to employees and nonpaying guests of the owner or a lessee of all or part of such
222 building or facility; (iii) offices, office buildings or industrial facilities while closed to the public and in
223 use for private meetings or parties limited in attendance to employees and nonpaying guests of the
224 owner or a lessee of all or part of such building or facility; or (iv) private recreational or chartered boats
225 which are not licensed by the Board and on which alcoholic beverages are not sold.

226 "Residence" means any building or part of a building or structure where a person resides, but does
227 not include any part of a building that is not actually and exclusively used as a private residence, nor
228 any part of a hotel or club other than a private guest room thereof.

229 "Resort complex" means a facility (i) with a hotel owning year-round sports and recreational facilities
230 located contiguously on the same property; (ii) owned by a nonstock, nonprofit, taxable corporation with
231 voluntary membership which, as its primary function, makes available golf, ski, and other recreational
232 facilities both to its members and to the general public; or (iii) operated by a corporation that operates
233 as a management company which, as its primary function, makes available (a) vacation accommodations,
234 guest rooms, or dwelling units and (b) golf, ski, and other recreational facilities to members of the
235 managed entities and the general public. The hotel or corporation shall have or manage a minimum of
236 140 private guest rooms or dwelling units contained on not less than 50 acres, whether or not
237 contiguous to the licensed premises; if the guest rooms or dwelling units are located on property that is
238 not contiguous to the licensed premises, such guest rooms and dwelling units shall be located within the
239 same locality. The Authority may consider the purpose, characteristics, and operation of the applicant
240 establishment in determining whether it shall be considered as a resort complex. All other pertinent
241 qualifications established by the Board for a hotel operation shall be observed by such licensee.

242 "Restaurant" means, for a wine and beer license or a limited mixed beverage restaurant license, any
243 establishment provided with special space and accommodation, where, in consideration of payment,
244 meals or other foods prepared on the premises are regularly sold.

245 "Restaurant" means, for a mixed beverage license other than a limited mixed beverage restaurant
 246 license, an established place of business (i) where meals with substantial entrees are regularly sold and
 247 (ii) which has adequate facilities and sufficient employees for cooking, preparing, and serving such
 248 meals for consumption at tables in dining areas on the premises, and includes establishments specializing
 249 in full course meals with a single substantial entree.

250 "Sale" and "sell" includes soliciting or receiving an order for; keeping, offering or exposing for sale;
 251 peddling, exchanging or bartering; or delivering otherwise than gratuitously, by any means, alcoholic
 252 beverages.

253 "Sangria" means a drink consisting of red or white wine mixed with some combination of
 254 sweeteners, fruit, fruit juice, soda, or soda water that may also be mixed with brandy, triple sec, or other
 255 similar spirits.

256 "Special agent" means an employee of the Virginia Alcoholic Beverage Control Authority whom the
 257 Board has designated as a law-enforcement officer pursuant to § 4.1-105.

258 "Special event" means an event sponsored by a duly organized nonprofit corporation or association
 259 and conducted for an athletic, charitable, civic, educational, political, or religious purpose.

260 "Spirits" means any beverage that contains alcohol obtained by distillation mixed with drinkable
 261 water and other substances, in solution, and includes, among other things, brandy, rum, whiskey, and
 262 gin, or any one or more of the last four named ingredients, but shall not include any such liquors
 263 completely denatured in accordance with formulas approved by the United States government.

264 "Wine" means any alcoholic beverage, including cider, obtained by the fermentation of the natural
 265 sugar content of fruits or other agricultural products containing (i) sugar, including honey and milk,
 266 either with or without additional sugar; (ii) one-half of one percent or more of alcohol by volume; and
 267 (iii) no product of distillation. "Wine" includes any wine to which wine spirits have been added, as
 268 provided in the Internal Revenue Code, to make products commonly known as "fortified wine" which do
 269 not exceed an alcohol content of 21 percent by volume.

270 "Wine cooler" means a drink containing one-half of one percent or more of alcohol by volume, and
 271 not more than three and two-tenths percent of alcohol by weight or four percent by volume consisting of
 272 wine mixed with nonalcoholic beverages or flavoring or coloring materials, and which may also contain
 273 water, fruit juices, fruit adjuncts, sugar, carbon dioxide, or preservatives and shall include other similar
 274 products manufactured by fermenting fruit or fruit juices. Wine coolers and similar fermented fruit juice
 275 beverages shall be treated as wine for all purposes except for taxation under § 4.1-236.

276 "With or without meals" means the selling and serving of alcoholic beverages by retail licensees for
 277 on-premises consumption whether or not accompanied by food so long as the total food-beverage ratio
 278 required by § 4.1-206.3, or the monthly food sale requirement established by Board regulation, is met by
 279 such retail licensee.

280 **§ 4.1-206.1. (Effective until July 1, 2024) Manufacturer licenses.**

281 The Board may grant the following manufacturer licenses:

282 1. Distiller's licenses, which shall authorize the licensee to manufacture alcoholic beverages other
 283 than wine and beer, and to sell and deliver or ship the same, in accordance with Board regulations, in
 284 closed containers, to the Board and to persons outside the Commonwealth for resale outside the
 285 Commonwealth. When the Board has established a government store on the distiller's licensed premises
 286 pursuant to subsection D of § 4.1-119, such license shall also authorize the licensee to make a charge to
 287 consumers to participate in an organized tasting event conducted in accordance with subsection G of
 288 § 4.1-119 and Board regulations.

289 2. Limited distiller's licenses, to distilleries that (i) are located on a farm in the Commonwealth on
 290 land zoned agricultural and owned or leased by such distillery or its owner and (ii) use agricultural
 291 products that are grown on the farm in the manufacture of their alcoholic beverages. Limited distiller's
 292 licensees shall be treated as distillers for all purposes of this subtitle except as otherwise provided in this
 293 subdivision. For purposes of this subdivision, "land zoned agricultural" means (a) land zoned as an
 294 agricultural district or classification or (b) land otherwise permitted by a locality for limited distillery
 295 use. For purposes of this subdivision, "land zoned agricultural" does not include land zoned "residential
 296 conservation." Except for the limitation on land zoned "residential conservation," nothing in this
 297 definition shall otherwise limit or affect local zoning authority.

298 3. Brewery licenses, which shall authorize the licensee to manufacture beer and to sell and deliver or
 299 ship the beer so manufactured, in accordance with Board regulations, in closed containers to (i) persons
 300 licensed to sell the beer at wholesale and (ii) persons outside the Commonwealth for resale outside the
 301 Commonwealth. Such license shall also authorize the licensee to sell at retail at premises described in
 302 the brewery license (a) the brands of beer that the brewery owns for on-premises consumption, provided
 303 that not less than 20 percent of the volume of beer sold for on-premises consumption in any calendar
 304 year is manufactured on the licensed premises, and (b) beer in closed containers, which shall include
 305 growlers and other reusable containers, for off-premises consumption.

306 4. Limited brewery licenses, to breweries that manufacture no more than 15,000 barrels of beer per
 307 calendar year, provided that (i) the brewery is located on a farm in the Commonwealth on land zoned
 308 agricultural and owned or leased by such brewery or its owner and (ii) agricultural products, including
 309 barley, other grains, hops, or fruit, used by such brewery in the manufacture of its beer are grown on
 310 the farm. The licensed premises shall be limited to the portion of the farm on which agricultural
 311 products, including barley, other grains, hops, or fruit, used by such brewery in the manufacture of its
 312 beer are grown and that is contiguous to the premises of such brewery where the beer is manufactured,
 313 exclusive of any residence and the curtilage thereof. However, the Board may, with notice to the local
 314 governing body in accordance with the provisions of § 4.1-230, also approve other portions of the farm
 315 to be included as part of the licensed premises. For purposes of this subdivision, "land zoned
 316 agricultural" means (a) land zoned as an agricultural district or classification or (b) land otherwise
 317 permitted by a locality for limited brewery use. For purposes of this subdivision, "land zoned
 318 agricultural" does not include land zoned "residential conservation." Except for the limitation on land
 319 zoned "residential conservation," nothing in this definition shall otherwise limit or affect local zoning
 320 authority.

321 Limited brewery licensees shall be treated as breweries for all purposes of this subtitle except as
 322 otherwise provided in this subdivision.

323 5. Winery licenses, which shall authorize the licensee to (i) manufacture wine and to sell and deliver
 324 or ship ~~the~~ *such* wine, in accordance with Board regulations, in closed containers, to persons licensed to
 325 sell the wine so manufactured at wholesale for the purpose of resale, and to persons outside the
 326 Commonwealth for resale outside the Commonwealth. ~~In addition, such license shall authorize the~~
 327 ~~licensee to~~ (i) operate distilling equipment on the premises of the licensee in the manufacture of

372 than wine and beer, and to sell and deliver or ship the same, in accordance with Board regulations, in
373 closed containers, to the Board and to persons outside the Commonwealth for resale outside the
374 Commonwealth. When the Board has established a government store on the distiller's licensed premises
375 pursuant to subsection D of § 4.1-119, such license shall also authorize the licensee to make a charge to
376 consumers to participate in an organized tasting event conducted in accordance with subsection G of
377 § 4.1-119 and Board regulations.

378 2. Limited distiller's licenses, to distilleries that (i) are located on a farm in the Commonwealth on
379 land zoned agricultural and owned or leased by such distillery or its owner and (ii) use agricultural
380 products that are grown on the farm in the manufacture of their alcoholic beverages. Limited distiller's
381 licensees shall be treated as distillers for all purposes of this title except as otherwise provided in this
382 subdivision. For purposes of this subdivision, "land zoned agricultural" means (a) land zoned as an
383 agricultural district or classification or (b) land otherwise permitted by a locality for limited distillery
384 use. For purposes of this subdivision, "land zoned agricultural" does not include land zoned "residential
385 conservation." Except for the limitation on land zoned "residential conservation," nothing in this
386 definition shall otherwise limit or affect local zoning authority.

387 3. Brewery licenses, which shall authorize the licensee to manufacture beer and to sell and deliver or
388 ship the beer so manufactured, in accordance with Board regulations, in closed containers to (i) persons
389 licensed to sell the beer at wholesale and (ii) persons outside the Commonwealth for resale outside the
390 Commonwealth. Such license shall also authorize the licensee to sell at retail at premises described in
391 the brewery license (a) the brands of beer that the brewery owns for on-premises consumption, provided
392 that not less than 20 percent of the volume of beer sold for on-premises consumption in any calendar
393 year is manufactured on the licensed premises, and (b) beer in closed containers, which shall include
394 growlers and other reusable containers, for off-premises consumption.

395 4. Limited brewery licenses, to breweries that manufacture no more than 15,000 barrels of beer per
396 calendar year, provided that (i) the brewery is located on a farm in the Commonwealth on land zoned
397 agricultural and owned or leased by such brewery or its owner and (ii) agricultural products, including
398 barley, other grains, hops, or fruit, used by such brewery in the manufacture of its beer are grown on
399 the farm. The licensed premises shall be limited to the portion of the farm on which agricultural
400 products, including barley, other grains, hops, or fruit, used by such brewery in the manufacture of its
401 beer are grown and that is contiguous to the premises of such brewery where the beer is manufactured,
402 exclusive of any residence and the curtilage thereof. However, the Board may, with notice to the local
403 governing body in accordance with the provisions of § 4.1-230, also approve other portions of the farm

 469 *grown or produced outside the Commonwealth. Class II farm winery licensees shall have on the*

 488 traded or exchanged between farm winery licensees shall be considered grown or produced on the

 493 maintain complete and accurate records of the quantity and source of any fruit or agricultural products

 496 "agricultural products" means the raw materials used or intended to be used in the manufacture of wine

- 594 (1) Banquet license, \$40 per license granted by the Board, except for banquet licenses granted by the

- 607 7. Retail licenses — marketplace. For each marketplace license, \$1,000.

- 610 b. Internet wine and beer retailer license, \$240;
- 611 c. Bottler license, \$1,500;

614 f. Third-party delivery license, \$7,500, unless the licensee provides written certification to the Board
615 that the licensee has no more than 25 delivery personnel, including employees, agents, and independent

621 equal to one-twelfth of the taxes required by subsection A computed to the nearest cent, multiplied by
622 the number of months in the license period, and then increased by five percent. Such tax shall not be
623 refundable, except as provided in § 4.1-232.

624 C. Nothing in this chapter shall exempt any licensee from any state merchants' license or state
625 restaurant license or any other state tax. Every licensee, in addition to the taxes imposed by this chapter,
626 shall be liable to state merchants' license taxation and state restaurant license taxation and other state
627 taxation the same as if the alcoholic beverages were nonalcoholic. In ascertaining the liability of a beer
628 wholesaler to merchants' license taxation, however, and in computing the wholesale merchants' license
629 tax on a beer wholesaler, the first \$163,800 of beer purchases shall be disregarded; and in ascertaining
