4 5 6	Directing the Virginia State Crime Commission to study the increase in hate crimes and bias-motivated acts directed toward Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders in the Commonwealth. Report.

10	WHEREAS, during the COVID-19 pandemic, Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders (AAPI) have
11	suffered an increase in bias-motivated incidents, including harassment, property damage, and violent
12	assaults, related to a stigma around the geographic origins of COVID-19; and
13	WHEREAS, Stop AAPI Hate, a coalition tracking and collecting AAPI hate and discrimination
14 15	incidents during the pandemic, released data indicating that between March 19, 2020, and December 31, 2021, it received 10,905 reported incidents of racism and discrimination targeting Asian Americans and
15 16	Pacific Islanders across the United States, with Virginia reporting the tenth largest number of hate and
17	discrimination incidents; and
18	WHEREAS, research released by the Center for the Study of Hate and Extremism at California State
19	University, San Bernardino, compared data from the first quarter of 2021 to the same time period in
20	2020 across 24 major cities and found that hate crimes surged by 189 percent, continuing the increase in
21 22	such attacks from 2020; and WHEREAS, in addition to the impact on the immediate victim, hate crimes and bias-motivated acts
$\frac{12}{23}$	have a broader impact in communities where Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders may be fearful for
24	their physical safety when going out in public; and
25	WHEREAS, assessing the increase in such hate crimes and bias-motivated acts directed toward Asian
26	Americans and Pacific Islanders is important in understanding the scope of the issue in order for the
27	General Assembly to put forth appropriate resources toward preventing and addressing such acts; now,
28 29	therefore, be it RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the Virginia State Crime
3 0	Commission be directed to study the increase in hate crimes and bias-motivated acts directed toward
31	Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders in the Commonwealth.
32	In conducting its study, the Virginia State Crime Commission shall investigate and determine the
33	prevalence of hate crimes and bias-motivated acts toward Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders in the
34 35	Commonwealth, assess any increase in such hate crimes and bias-motivated acts since the start of the COVID-19 pandemic in March 2020, and analyze responses and recommendations to address such hate
35 36	crimes and bias-motivated acts and increase protections for Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders in the
37	Commonwealth.
38	Technical assistance shall be provided to the Virginia State Crime Commission by the Virginia State
39	Police. All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Virginia State Crime
40	Commission for this study, upon request.
41 42	The Virginia State Crime Commission shall complete its meetings by November 30, 2023, and the chairman shall submit to the Division of Legislative Automated Systems an executive summary of its
43	findings and recommendations no later than the first day of the 2024 Regular Session of the General
44	Assembly. The executive summary shall state whether the Virginia State Crime Commission intends to
45	submit to the General Assembly and the Governor a report of its findings and recommendations for
46	publication as a House or Senate document. The executive summary and report shall be submitted as
47 19	provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of
48	legislative documents and reports and shall be posted on the General Assembly's website.
