5.	Summary: Provides that the authority of the Commonwealth Transportation Board to make							

- 5. Summary: Provides that the authority of the Commonwealth Transportation Board to make regulations for the use of systems of state highways includes the use of devices in the right-of-way of such highways for law-enforcement purposes. The bill authorizes the Department of State Police (VSP) or chief law-enforcement officer of a locality to install, maintain, and operate devices for law-enforcement purposes on highways maintained by the Department of Transportation (VDOT). The bill requires that all data collected by such devices be purged and not retained later than 30 days after collection unless such data is being used in an active law-enforcement investigation. The bill prohibits the use of such data to enforce speed limits, traffic regulations, tolling requirements, or high-occupancy vehicle requirements. The bill provides that the provisions of this section shall not prevent or limit the use of any device that is authorized for use by any other provision of law.
