4. Title: Local school boards and comprehensive community colleges; compensation structure for instructors.

5. Summary: Directs the Virginia Community College System and the Department of Education to convene a work group to assess the costs and develop implementation options to encourage local school boards and comprehensive community colleges to enter into local or regional agreements for the establishment and implementation of a competitive compensation structure to recruit and retain adjunct instructors to be jointly compensated by the relevant school boards and colleges to prepare both high school students and college students to earn credit-bearing workforce credentials and noncredit workforce credentials, as that term is defined in relevant law.

8. Fiscal Implications: The Virginia Community College System anticipates that costs to convene a work group are absorbable within existing resources. The Virginia Department of Education (DOE) notes that several bills have been introduced by the 2023 General Assembly that require DOE to issue a report to the Board of Education or the General Assembly by November 1, 2023. If several of these proposals are adopted, DOE may require additional state support above what is estimated in fiscal impact statements in order to meet all deadlines.
