3. Committee: General Laws

4. Title: Charitable gaming; temporary permits; limitations.

5. Summary: Authorizes the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services to issue a temporary permit to certain qualified organizations authorizing such organizations to sell instant bingo, pull tabs, or seal cards upon premises located anywhere in the Commonwealth during a convention, conference, or related event lasting no more than seven days held by the organization's affiliated state, regional, or national organization up to four times per year, as designated in the temporary permit. Current law limits the sale of such games by a qualified organization to premises that are owned or exclusively and entirely leased by such organization or premises leased by the organization from any social organization for the purpose of selling such games.

8. Fiscal Implications: It is anticipated that any fiscal impact this bill may have to VDACS can be absorbed within existing resources.

This bill authorizes VDACS to require any prospective employee, permit holder, or applicant to submit to a criminal history records check through the Central Criminal Records Exchange and the Federal Bureau of Investigation, and the Central Criminal Records Exchange, upon receipt of a prospective employee, permit holder, or applicant record or notification that no record exists to forward the report to the Commissioner of VDACS or his designee.

The Central Criminal Records Exchange is part of the Virginia State Police (VSP). VSP does not anticipate any impact from this bill.
