The bill prohibits a health insurance carrier from imposing upon any person receiving contraceptive benefits pursuant to the provisions of the bill any copayment, coinsurance payment, or fee. The provisions of the bill apply to health insurance contracts, policies, or plans delivered, issued for delivery, or renewed on and after January 1,2024. | | | | | | |

According to the Department of Human Resource Management (DHRM), the fiscal impact is projected to be \$150,559 to provide coverage for contraceptives, including progestin implants and intrauterine devices (IUDs). The proposed legislation is not expected to change the health insurance premiums funded in HB 1400. | | | | | | |
