4. Title: Access to aggregated nonconfidential case data for public institutions of higher learning

5. Summary: The proposed bill allows the Office of the Executive Secretary of the Supreme Court, at the request of a public institution of higher education, to enter into an agreement to provide aggregated, nonconfidential case data, including names and partial dates of birth of parties, in electronic format. The bill specifies that such data shall not be subject to the Virginia Freedom of Information Act.

8. Fiscal Implications: The bill specifies that the Office of the Executive Secretary of the Supreme Court (OES) may require the requestor to pay the costs associated with providing the requested data.

According to OES, the Online Case Information System (OCIS) that retains case information for the trial courts would need to be modified to meet the provisions of the proposed legislation. The cost associated are as follows:
