- 3. Committee: Passed both houses
- **4. Title:** Public elementary and secondary school teachers; frequency of certain training activities, report.
- **5.** Summary: Prohibits any public elementary or secondary school teacher from being required to participate more frequently than once every five years in any training described in clause (iii) of subsection A of § 22.1-279.6 or relating to secure mandatory test violations as set forth in §§ 22.1-19.1 and 22.1-292.1, unless the school board or division superintendent determines that additional training is necessary to comply with federal or state law or to remediate misconduct. Each such teacher who completes any such training shall sign a written attestation that the teacher has been trained in and understands the relevant subject matter. The bill requires each local school board to report to the Board of Education and the General Assembly no later than October 1, 2023, on the frequency with which each public elementary and secondary school teacher in the local school division participates in each required training or professional development activity. The bill allows that, notwithstanding the provisions of § 22.1-302 of the Code of Virginia, during the 2023-2024 and 2024-2025 school years, any school board may employ a temporary employee to fill a teacher vacancy for a period of time not to exceed 180 days during one school year.
