4. Title: Common Interest Community Board; enforcement power over continuing violations

5. Summary: The bill requires the Office of the Common Interest Community Ombudsman to either (i) refer a final adverse decision received to the Common Interest Community Board for further review of whether such decision is in conflict with relevant laws or regulations or (ii) make a determination of whether a final adverse decision received is in conflict with such laws or regulations and promptly notify the complainant, and, if applicable, the association that issued a final adverse decision that conflicts with such laws or regulations, of such determination. Subsequent notices of adverse decisions for the same violation within 365 days shall be immediately referred to the Board.
