3. Committee: General Laws and Technology

4. Title: Office of the Children's Ombudsman.

5. Summary: Repeals the Children's Advocacy Fund, created to support the Office of the Children's Ombudsman (Office), as general funds are used to fund the Office. The definition of "abused and neglected child" is amended to match the definition in Title 63.2. The definition of "child caring institution" is removed and the definition of "children's residential facility" is amended to match the definition in Title 63.2. The bill removes the authority previously granted to the Office to investigate "adoption attorneys." The bill also clarifies that the Office is exempt from the Virginia Freedom of Information Act. Finally, the bill contains several technical amendments.

6. Budget Amendment Necessary: No.

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: No state fiscal impact.

8. Fiscal Implications: The Office of the Children's Ombudsman does not anticipate a fiscal impact from this legislation. The bill repeals the Children's Advocacy Fund, however, the fund has never been utilized because the Office has been funded using general fund appropriation. Therefore, there is no fiscal impact to the elimination of this fund.
