**4. Title:**    Abortion or other reproductive health care services; prohibitions on extradition for certain crimes.

**5. Summary:** This bill establishes that no demand for extradition of a person charged with a criminal violation of law of another state shall be recognized by the Governor if such alleged violation involves the receipt of or assistance with reproductive health care services unless the alleged violation would also constitute a criminal offense under the laws of the Commonwealth. The bill adds obtaining, disclosing, selling, or disseminating certain personal reproductive or sexual health information without the consent of the consumer as a prohibited practice under the Virginia Consumer Protection Act.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** According to the Office of Attorney General and the Department of Health, this bill is not expected to have a fiscal impact on agency operations.
