Summary: This bill clarifies that, for the purposes of the Crime Victim and Witness Rights Act, the term "attorney for the Commonwealth" includes the Attorney General when the Attorney General is instituting or conducting a criminal prosecution pursuant to § 2.2-511 (outlines criminal cases in which the Attorney General has authority) or when appointed pursuant to § 19.2-155 (Disqualification or temporary disability of attorney for Commonwealth; appointment of substitute; powers, duties and compensation of such appointee), including representing the Commonwealth in any appeal.
