**3. Committee:** Judiciary

**4. Title:** Child abuse or neglect; definition; independent activities.

**5. Summary:** Clarifies that no child whose parent or other person responsible for his care allows the child to engage in reasonable independent activities without adult supervision shall for that reason alone be considered to be an abused or neglected child, provided that such independent activities are appropriate based on the child's age, maturity, and physical and mental abilities. The bill provides that such independent activities may include traveling to or from school or nearby locations by bicycle or on foot, playing outdoors, remaining at home for a reasonable period of time, or remaining in a vehicle if such vehicle is parked in a safe location and the temperature is not and will not become dangerously hot or cold.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** This bill does not have a fiscal impact. The legislation codifies current practice for determining the validity of a report alleging physical neglect by inadequate supervision of a child.
