3. Committee: Education and Health

4. Title: COVID-19 immunization; prohibition on requirement, discrimination prohibited, civil penalty.

5. Summary: Prohibits the State Health Commissioner and the Board of Health, the Board of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services, the Department of Health Professions and any regulatory board therein, and the Department of Social Services from requiring any person, including any child, to undergo vaccination for COVID-19 and prohibits discrimination based on a person's COVID-19 vaccination status (i) with regard to education, employment, or issuance of a driver's license or other state identification or (ii) in numerous other contexts. The bill establishes a civil penalty for violation of this prohibition by an employer.

8. Fiscal Implications: The provisions of this bill would not have a direct fiscal impact on the Commonwealth. Any indirect fiscal impacts that would result from the passage of this legislation cannot be determined
