Under current law, such orders are appealable to the Supreme Court.						
	The bill requires that the Supreme Court of Virginia promulgate rules no later than July 1, 2023, governing the appeal of an interlocutory order granting or denying a plea of sovereign, absolute, or qualified immunity.
