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10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
12	1. That §§ 3.02 and 3.04, as severally amended, of Chapter 640 of the Acts of Assembly of 2011
13	are amended and reenacted as follows:
14	§ 3.02. Nomination of candidates.
15	a. Candidates for the offices of Mayor and members of the City Council under the provisions of this
16	Charter shall be nominated by petition. Any qualified voter of the city may be nominated as provided
17	herein. Subject to the provisions herein, there shall be printed on the ballots to be used in any municipal
18	election for the election of Mayor and City Council members the names of all candidates who have been
19	nominated by petition and no others. A nominating petition shall conform substantially to the following
20	requirements:
21 22	(1) Such petition shall state the name and place of residence of each person whose name is presented for a place upon the ballot, and shall request such person or persons to become a candidate or
$\frac{22}{23}$	candidates for the office of Mayor or City Council.
23 24	(2) Such petition shall be signed by at least one hundred and twenty-five (125) qualified electors of
25	the city and shall contain the residence address of each elector and an affidavit of any other qualified
26	voter who witnessed said signatures.
27	(3) Each elector signing a petition may subscribe to one nomination for each of the places to be
28	filled at the ensuing election, and no more.
29	(4) Such petition shall not be signed by any elector prior to January 1 of the year of such election,
30	and such petition shall be filed with the general registrar of the city not later than the time fixed for the
31 32	closing of the polls on the second 7:00 p.m. on the third Tuesday in June of the year of the election.
32 33	b. Any person whose name has been submitted for candidacy by petition as herein provided, shall file his or her acceptance of such candidacy with the general registrar of the city not later than the time
34	fixed for the closing of the polls on the second 7:00 p.m. on the third Tuesday in June of the year of
35	the election, otherwise that name shall not appear on the ballot. The filing of such acceptance shall be
36	deemed equivalent to the filing of notice of candidacy under the general election laws of the State, and
37	no other notice of candidacy need be given by the person filing the same.
38	c. No person may be a candidate for the office of Mayor and office of City Council member in the
39	same election.
40	d. Candidates for the offices of Mayor and City Council member shall appoint one campaign
41 42	treasurer and file the name and address of said campaign treasurer with the Portsmouth Electoral Board not later than the second <i>third</i> Tuesday of June of the year of the election. Any candidate who fails to
43	appoint and report the appointment of a treasurer shall be deemed to have appointed him/herself
44	treasurer. All candidates for such offices shall comply with the applicable provisions of Chapter 9 9.3
45	(§ 24.2-945 et seq.) of Title 24.2 of the Code of Virginia.
<b>46</b>	§ 3.04. City Council vacancies.
47	If, for any reason, there is an insufficient number of certified elected candidates for the office of City
48	Council after any municipal election, or if a City Council vacancy otherwise occurs, such vacancies shall
<b>49</b>	be filled for the unexpired portion of the term by majority vote of the remaining members of the City
50 51	Council, or, if the Council shall fail to fill a vacancy in its membership within sixty <i>forty-five</i> days of the occurrence of the vacancy, by appointment by a majority of the judges of the Circuit Court of the
51 52	City.
5 <u>7</u>	If any person duly elected to the City Council shall fail to take the oath of office prior to the first
54	day of January following such election, he or she shall be deemed to have declined the office, and the
55	seat shall be deemed vacant. If any person appointed to the City Council to fill an unexpired term shall
56	fail to take the oath of office within thirty days of such appointment, he or she shall be deemed to have
57	declined the office, and the seat shall be deemed vacant.
58	2. That an emergency exists and this act is in force from its passage.

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
