WHEREAS, Annandale High School proudly fosters a sense of belonging for all of its students and ensures that all of them have the knowledge they need to thrive in a global society; and

WHEREAS, Annandale High School offers a rigorous academic curriculum and many opportunities for sports and extracurricular activities, empowering students to achieve their fullest potential in and out of the classroom; and

WHEREAS, the faculty and staff of Annandale High School work diligently with local partners to create opportunities for students to further their academic growth and become more engaged with the community; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the General Assembly hereby commend Annandale High School on the occasion of its 70th anniversary; and, be it

RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the House of Delegates prepare a copy of this resolution for presentation to Annandale High School as an expression of the General Assembly's admiration for the school's contributions to the Fairfax County community.
