That § 3.2-6570 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: 11 § 3.2-6570. Cruelty to animals; penalty. 12 13 A. Any person who (i) overrides, overdrives, overloads, ill-treats, or abandons any animal, whether 14 belonging to himself or another; (ii) tortures any animal, willfully inflicts inhumane injury or pain not 15 connected with bona fide scientific or medical experimentation on any animal, or cruelly or 16 unnecessarily beats, maims, mutilates, or kills any animal, whether belonging to himself or another; (iii) deprives any animal of necessary food, drink, shelter, or emergency veterinary treatment; (iv) sores any 17 18 equine for any purpose or administers drugs or medications to alter or mask such soring for the purpose of sale, show, or exhibition of any kind, unless such administration of drugs or medications is within the 19 20 context of a veterinary client-patient relationship and solely for therapeutic purposes; (v) ropes, lassoes, 21 or otherwise obstructs or interferes with one or more legs of an equine in order to intentionally cause it to trip or fall for the purpose of engagement in a rodeo, contest, exhibition, entertainment, or sport 22 23 unless such actions are in the practice of accepted animal husbandry or for the purpose of allowing 24 veterinary care; (vi) willfully sets on foot, instigates, engages in, or in any way furthers any act of 25 cruelty to any animal; (vii) carries or causes to be carried by any vehicle, vessel or otherwise any 26 animal in a cruel, brutal, or inhumane manner, so as to produce torture or unnecessary suffering; or 27 (viii) causes any of the above things, or being the owner of such animal permits such acts to be done by 28 another is guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor. 29 In addition to the penalties provided in this subsection, the court may, in its discretion, require any 30 person convicted of a violation of this subsection to attend an anger management or other appropriate 31 treatment program or obtain psychiatric or psychological counseling. The court may impose the costs of such a program or counseling upon the person convicted. 32 33 B. Any person who (i) tortures, willfully inflicts inhumane injury or pain not connected with bona 34 fide scientific or medical experimentation, or cruelly and unnecessarily beats, maims, mutilates or kills 35 any animal whether belonging to himself or another; (ii) sores any equine for any purpose or administers 36 drugs or medications to alter or mask such soring for the purpose of sale, show, or exhibit of any kind, 37 unless such administration of drugs or medications is under the supervision of a licensed veterinarian 38 and solely for therapeutic purposes; (iii) ropes, lassoes, or otherwise obstructs or interferes with one or 39 more legs of an equine in order to intentionally cause it to trip or fall for the purpose of engagement in 40 a rodeo, contest, exhibition, entertainment, or sport unless such actions are in the practice of accepted 41 animal husbandry or for the purpose of allowing veterinary care; (iv) maliciously deprives any companion animal of necessary food, drink, shelter or emergency veterinary treatment; (v) instigates, 42 engages in, or in any way furthers any act of cruelty to any animal set forth in clauses (i) through (iv); 43 or (vi) causes any of the actions described in clauses (i) through (v), or being the owner of such animal 44 permits such acts to be done by another; and has been within five years convicted of a violation of this 45 subsection or subsection A, is guilty of a Class 6 felony if the current violation or any previous 46 47 violation of this subsection or subsection A resulted in the death of an animal or the euthanasia of an

C. Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit the dehorning of cattle conducted in a reasonable and customary manner.

53 D. This section shall not prohibit authorized wildlife management activities or hunting, fishing or 54 trapping as regulated under other titles of the Code of Virginia, including Title 29.1, or to farming 55 activities as provided under this title or regulations adopted hereunder.

E. It is unlawful for any person to kill a domestic dog or cat for the purpose of obtaining the hide,
fur or pelt of the dog or cat. A violation of this subsection is a Class 1 misdemeanor. A second or
subsequent violation of this subsection is a Class 6 felony.

59 F. Any person who (i) tortures, willfully inflicts inhumane injury or pain not connected with bona 60 fide scientific or medical experimentation, or cruelly and unnecessarily beats, maims, or mutilates any 61 dog or cat that is a companion animal whether belonging to him or another and (ii) as a direct result 62 causes serious bodily injury to such dog or cat that is a companion animal, the death of such dog or cat 63 that is a companion animal, or the euthanasia of such animal on the recommendation of a licensed 64 veterinarian upon determination that such euthanasia was necessary due to the condition of the animal is 65 guilty of a Class 6 felony. If a dog or cat is attacked on its owner's property by a dog so as to cause injury or death, the owner of the injured dog or cat may use all reasonable and necessary force against 66 the dog at the time of the attack to protect his dog or cat. Such owner may be presumed to have taken 67 necessary and appropriate action to defend his dog or cat and shall therefore be presumed not to have 68 violated this subsection. The provisions of this subsection shall not overrule § 3.2-6540, 3.2-6540.1, or 69 70 3.2-6552.

For the purposes of this subsection, "serious bodily injury" means bodily injury that involves
substantial risk of death, extreme physical pain, protracted and obvious disfigurement, or protracted loss
or impairment of the function of a bodily member, organ, or mental faculty.

74 G. Any person convicted of violating a violation of this section that is punishable as a felony may 75 be prohibited by the court from possession or ownership of companion animals for life and any person 76 convicted of a violation of this section that is punishable as a misdemeanor may be prohibited by the 77 court from possession or ownership of animals for a period of up to five years. In addition to any other 78 penalty provided by law, any person who violates the provisions of this subsection shall be punished for 79 contempt of court and the court shall order that any animal possessed or owned by such person may 80 be: (i) sold by a local governing body, if not a companion animal; (ii) disposed of by a local governing body pursuant to subsection D of § 3.2-6546, whether such animal is a companion animal or an agricultural animal; or (iii) delivered to another person with a right of property in the animal. 81 82
