10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 18.2-308.5:2 as follows:
12	§ 18.2-308.5:2. Manufacture, importation, sale, possession, transfer, or transportation of auto sear
13	prohibited; penalty.
14	A. As used in this section, "auto sear" means a device made of metal or plastic designed for use in
15	converting a firearm to shoot automatically more than one shot, without manual reloading, by a single
16	function of the trigger.
17	B. It is unlawful for any person to manufacture, import, sell, offer for sale, possess, transfer, or
18	transport one or more auto sears in the Commonwealth.
19	C. A violation of this section is punishable as a Class 6 felony.
20	D. Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit a person from manufacturing, importing,
21	selling, offering for sale, possessing, receiving, transferring, or transporting any item for which such
22	person is in compliance with the National Firearms Act (26 U.S.C. § 5801 et seq.).
23	2. That the provisions of this act may result in a net increase in periods of imprisonment or
24	commitment. Pursuant to § 30-19.1:4 of the Code of Virginia, the estimated amount of the
25	necessary appropriation cannot be determined for periods of imprisonment in state adult
26	correctional facilities; therefore, Chapter 1 of the Acts of Assembly of 2023, Special Session I,
27	requires the Virginia Criminal Sentencing Commission to assign a minimum fiscal impact of
28	\$50,000. Pursuant to § 30-19.1:4 of the Code of Virginia, the estimated amount of the necessary
29	appropriation cannot be determined for periods of commitment to the custody of the Department
30	of Juvenile Justice.
