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VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY - CHAPTER

2 An Act to amend and reenact § 22.1-298.1, as it shall become effective, of the Code of Virginia, relating 3 to teachers; certain licenses and certificates.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

6 7 1. That § 22.1-298.1, as it shall become effective, of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted 8 as follows:

9 § 22.1-298.1. (For effective date, see Acts 2022, cc. 549 and 550, cl. 2) Regulations governing 10 licensure.

A. As used in this section:

12 "Alternate route to licensure" means a nontraditional route to teacher licensure available to 13 individuals who meet the criteria specified in the guidelines developed pursuant to subsection N O or regulations issued by the Board of Éducation. 14

15 "Industry certification credential" means an active career and technical education credential that is earned by successfully completing a Board of Education-approved Board-approved industry certification 16 examination, being issued a professional license in the Commonwealth, or successfully completing an 17 18 occupational competency examination.

19 "Licensure by reciprocity" means a process used to issue the issuance of a license as a teacher in the 20 Commonwealth to an individual coming into the Commonwealth from another state when that individual 21 meets certain conditions specified in the Board of Education's Board's regulations.

22 "Professional teacher's assessment" means those tests mandated for licensure as prescribed by the 23 Board of Education.

24 "Provisional license" means a nonrenewable license issued by the Board of Education or by a 25 division superintendent as permitted pursuant to subdivision D 5 for a specified period of time, not to 26 exceed three years, to an individual who may be employed by a school division in the Commonwealth 27 and who generally meets the requirements specified in the Board of Education's Board's regulations for 28 licensure, but who may need to take additional coursework, pass additional assessments, or meet 29 alternative evaluation standards to be fully licensed with a renewable license.

30 "Renewable license" means a license issued by the Board of Education for 10 years to an individual 31 who meets the requirements specified in the Board of Education's Board's regulations.

32 "Universal licensure by reciprocity" means the issuance of a license as a teacher in the Commonwealth to any individual who holds a valid out-of-state teaching license with full credentials 33 34 and without deficiencies that has been in force and in use by the individual as an employed teacher in a 35 non-virtual classroom setting at a public or private elementary or secondary school for at least three years prior to and is in force at the time the Department receives such individual's application for a 36 37 license as a teacher in the Commonwealth.

38 B. The Board of Education shall prescribe, by regulation, the requirements for the licensure of 39 teachers and other school personnel required to hold a license. Such regulations shall include procedures 40 for (i) the denial, suspension, cancellation, revocation, and reinstatement of licensure; (ii) written 41 reprimand of license holders on grounds established by the Board, in accordance with law, notice of 42 which shall be made by the Superintendent of Public Instruction to division superintendents or their 43 designated representatives; and (iii) the immediate and thorough investigation by the division superintendent or his designee of any complaint alleging that a license holder has engaged in conduct 44 45 that may form the basis for the revocation of his license. At a minimum, such procedures for investigations contained in such regulations shall require (a) the division superintendent to petition for 46 the revocation of the license upon completing such investigation and finding that there is reasonable 47 cause to believe that the license holder has engaged in conduct that forms the basis for revocation of a 48 49 license; (b) the school board to proceed to a hearing on such petition for revocation within 90 days of 50 the mailing of a copy of the petition to the license holder, unless the license holder requests the cancellation of his license in accordance with Board regulations; and (c) the school board to provide a 51 copy of the investigative file and such petition for revocation to the Superintendent of Public Instruction 52 53 at the time that the hearing is scheduled. The Board of Education shall revoke the license of any person 54 for whom it has received a notice of dismissal or resignation pursuant to subsection F of § 22.1-313 and, 55 in the case of a person who is the subject of a founded complaint of child abuse or neglect, after all 56 rights to any administrative appeal provided by § 63.2-1526 have been exhausted. In the case of a

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teacher who is the subject of a founded complaint of child abuse or neglect and whose license has been 57 58 revoked pursuant to this subsection, in the event that a court reverses such finding of abuse or neglect 59 and the individual submits to the Department an application for the reinstatement of his license as a 60 teacher, the Board shall consider and act upon such application no later than 90 days after the date of 61 submission. Regardless of the authority of any other agency of the Commonwealth to approve 62 educational programs, only the Board of Education shall have the authority to license teachers to be regularly employed by school boards, including those teachers employed to provide nursing education. 63

64 The Board of Education shall prescribe by regulation the licensure requirements for teachers who teach only online courses, as defined in § 22.1-212.23. Such license shall be valid only for teaching 65 66 online courses. Teachers who hold a 10-year renewable license issued by the Board of Education may 67 teach online courses for which they are properly endorsed.

68 C. The Board of Education's Board's regulations shall include requirements that a person seeking 69 initial licensure:

70 1. Demonstrate proficiency in the relevant content area, communication, literacy, and other core skills for educators by achieving a qualifying score on professional assessments or meeting alternative evaluation standards as prescribed by the Board. The literacy assessment for any individual seeking 71 72 73 initial licensure with an endorsement in early/primary education preschool through grade three, 74 elementary education preschool through grade six, special education general curriculum kindergarten 75 through grade 12, special education deaf and hard of hearing preschool through grade 12, or special 76 education blindness/visual impairments preschool through grade 12 or as a reading specialist shall 77 include a rigorous test of science-based reading research and evidence-based literacy instruction; 78

2. Complete study in attention deficit disorder;

79 3. Complete study in gifted education, including the use of multiple criteria to identify gifted 80 students; and

81 4. Complete study in methods of improving communication between schools and families and ways of increasing family involvement in student learning at home and at school. 82 83

D. In addition, such regulations shall include requirements that:

84 1. Every person seeking initial licensure and persons seeking licensure renewal as teachers who have 85 not completed such study shall complete study in child abuse recognition and intervention in accordance with curriculum guidelines developed by the Board of Education in consultation with the Department of 86 Social Services that are relevant to the specific teacher licensure routes; 87

88 2. Every person seeking renewal of a license shall complete all renewal requirements, including 89 professional development in a manner prescribed by the Board, except that no person seeking renewal of 90 a license shall be required to satisfy any such requirement by completing coursework and earning credit 91 at an institution of higher education;

92 3. Every person seeking initial licensure or renewal of a license shall provide evidence of completion of certification or training in emergency first aid, cardiopulmonary resuscitation, and the use of automated external defibrillators. The certification or training program shall (i) be based on the current 93 94 national evidence-based emergency cardiovascular care guidelines for cardiopulmonary resuscitation and 95 96 the use of an automated external defibrillator, such as a program developed by the American Heart 97 Association or the American Red Cross, and (ii) include hands-on practice of the skills necessary to perform cardiopulmonary resuscitation. The Board shall provide a waiver for this requirement for any 98 99 person with a disability whose disability prohibits such person from completing the certification or 100 training;

101 4. Every person seeking licensure with an endorsement as a teacher of the blind and visually 102 impaired shall demonstrate proficiency in reading and writing Braille;

5. Every teacher seeking an initial license in the Commonwealth with an endorsement in the area of 103 104 career and technical education shall have an industry certification credential in the area in which the 105 teacher seeks endorsement. If a teacher seeking an initial license in the Commonwealth has not attained 106 an industry certification credential in the area in which the teacher seeks endorsement, the Board 107 division superintendent may, upon request of the employing school division or educational agency, issue 108 the teacher a provisional license to allow time for the teacher to attain such credential;

109 6. Every person seeking initial licensure or renewal of a license shall complete awareness training, 110 provided by the Department, on the indicators of dyslexia, as that term is defined by the Board pursuant 111 to regulations, and the evidence-based interventions and accommodations for dyslexia;

7. Every person seeking initial licensure or renewal of a license with an endorsement as a school 112 113 counselor shall complete training in the recognition of mental health disorder and behavioral distress, 114 including depression, trauma, violence, youth suicide, and substance abuse;

8. Every person seeking initial licensure as a teacher who has not received the instruction described 115 116 in subsection D of § 23.1-902 shall receive instruction or training on positive behavior interventions and supports; crisis prevention and de-escalation; the use of physical restraint and seclusion, consistent with 117

118 regulations of the Board of Education; and appropriate alternative methods to reduce and prevent the 119 need for the use of physical restraint and seclusion;

120 9. Every person seeking initial licensure or renewal of a license shall complete instruction or training 121 in cultural competency;

122 10. Every person seeking initial licensure or renewal of a license with an endorsement in history and 123 social sciences shall complete instruction in African American history, as prescribed by the Board;

124 11. Every person seeking renewal of a license as a teacher shall complete training in the instruction 125 of students with disabilities that includes (i) differentiating instruction for students depending on their 126 needs; (ii) understanding the role of general education teachers on the individualized education program 127 team; (iii) implementing effective models of collaborative instruction, including co-teaching; and (iv) 128 understanding the goals and benefits of inclusive education for all students; and

129 12. Every person seeking initial licensure with an endorsement in early/primary education preschool through grade three, elementary education preschool through grade six, special education general 130 curriculum kindergarten through grade 12, special education deaf and hard of hearing preschool through 131 132 grade 12, or special education blindness/visual impairments preschool through grade 12 or as a reading 133 specialist shall complete study in science-based reading research and evidence-based literacy instruction.

134 E. No teacher who seeks a provisional license shall be required to meet any requirement set forth in 135 subdivision D 1, 3, 6, or 8 as a condition of such licensure, but each such teacher shall complete each 136 such requirement during the first year of provisional licensure.

137 F. The Board shall issue a license to an individual seeking initial licensure who has not completed 138 professional assessments as prescribed by the Board, if such individual (i) holds a provisional license 139 that will expire within three months or, at the discretion of the school board and division superintendent, 140 within six months if the individual has received a satisfactory mid-year performance review in the 141 current school year; (ii) is employed by a school board; (iii) is recommended for licensure by the 142 division superintendent; (iv) has attempted, unsuccessfully, to obtain a qualifying score on the 143 professional assessments as prescribed by the Board; (v) has received an evaluation rating of proficient 144 or above on the performance standards for each year of the provisional license, and such evaluation was 145 conducted in a manner consistent with the Guidelines for Uniform Performance Standards and 146 Evaluation Criteria for Teachers, Principals, and Superintendents; and (vi) meets all other requirements 147 for initial licensure.

148 G. Each local school board or division superintendent may waive for any individual whom it he 149 seeks to employ as a career and technical education teacher and who is also seeking initial licensure or 150 renewal of a license with an endorsement in the area of career and technical education any applicable 151 requirement set forth in subsection C or subdivision D 2, 4, or 6.

152 H. The Board's regulations shall require that initial licensure for principals and assistant principals be 153 contingent upon passage of an assessment as prescribed by the Board.

154 I. The Board shall establish criteria in its regulations to effectuate the substitution of experiential 155 learning for coursework for those persons seeking initial licensure through an alternate route as defined 156 in Board regulations. Such alternate routes shall include eligibility for any individual to receive, notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, a renewable one-year license to teach in public 157 158 high schools in the Commonwealth if he has:

159 1. Received a graduate degree from a regionally accredited institution of higher education;

160 2. Completed at least 30 credit hours of teaching experience as an instructor at a regionally 161 accredited institution of higher education;

162 3. Received qualifying scores on the professional teacher's assessments prescribed by the Board, including the communication and literacy assessment and the content-area assessment for the 163 164 endorsement sought. The literacy assessment for any individual seeking initial licensure through an 165 alternate route with an endorsement in early/primary education preschool through grade three, elementary 166 education preschool through grade six, special education general curriculum kindergarten through grade 12, special education deaf and hard of hearing preschool through grade 12, or special education 167 168 blindness/visual impairments preschool through grade 12 or as a reading specialist shall include a 169 rigorous test of science-based reading research and evidence-based literacy instruction; and 170

4. Met the requirements set forth in subdivisions D 1 and 3.

171 J. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the Board (i) may provide for the issuance 172 of a provisional license, valid for a period not to exceed three years, pursuant to subdivision D 5 or to 173 any person who does not meet the requirements of this section or any other requirement for licensure 174 imposed by law; (ii) shall provide for the issuance of a provisional license, valid for a period not to 175 exceed three years, to any former member of the Armed Forces of the United States or the Virginia 176 National Guard who has received an honorable discharge and has the appropriate level of experience or 177 training but does not meet the requirements for a renewable license; and (iii) may provide for the 178 issuance of a provisional license, valid for a period not to exceed three years, to any individual who has

179 held within the last five years a valid and officially issued and recognized license or certification to teach issued by an entity outside of the United States but does not meet the requirements for a 180 181 renewable license if the individual's license or certification to teach has been evaluated and verified by 182 an entity approved by the Department. 183

K. The Board's licensure regulations shall also provide for licensure by reciprocity:

184 1. With comparable endorsement areas for those individuals holding a valid out-of-state teaching 185 license and national certification from the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards or a nationally recognized certification program approved by the Board of Education. The application for 186 187 such individuals shall require evidence of such valid licensure and national certification and shall not 188 require official student transcripts; and

189 2. For any spouse of an active duty or reserve member of the Armed Forces of the United States or 190 a member of the Virginia National Guard who has obtained a valid out-of-state license, with full 191 credentials and without deficiencies, that is in force at the time the application for a Virginia license is 192 received by the Department. Each such individual shall establish a file in the Department by submitting 193 a complete application packet, which shall include official student transcripts and an official copy of the 194 military permanent assignment orders of the individual's spouse. No service requirements or licensing 195 assessments shall be required for any such individual. The Department shall determine and communicate 196 such individual's eligibility for licensure by reciprocity within 15 business days of receipt of the 197 complete application packet; and

198 3. For individuals who have obtained a valid out of state license, with full credentials and without 199 deficiencies, that is in force at the time the application for a Virginia license is received by the 200 Department. Each such individual shall establish a file in the Department by submitting a complete 201 application packet, which shall include official student transcripts.

202 L. The Board's licensure regulations shall also provide for universal licensure by reciprocity for any 203 individual who holds a valid out-of-state teaching license with full credentials and without deficiencies 204 that has been in force for at least three years prior to and is in force at the time of application. No service requirements or licensing assessments shall be required for any such individual who applies for 205 206 universal licensure by reciprocity. Any individual who applies for universal licensure by reciprocity shall 207 provide a copy of the individual's out-of-state teaching license that meets the criteria set forth in this 208 subsection. Any such individual shall be subject to the provisions of §§ 22.1-296.2 and 22.1-296.4. The 209 Department shall prioritize applications for universal licensure by reciprocity.

210 L_{τ} M. The Board shall include in its regulations an alternate route to licensure for elementary 211 education preschool through grade six and an alternate route to licensure for special education general 212 curriculum kindergarten through grade 12. Each such alternate route to licensure shall require individuals 213 to (i) meet the qualifying scores on the content area assessment prescribed by the Board for the 214 endorsements sought and (ii) complete an alternative certification program that provides training in the 215 pedagogy and methodology of the respective content or special education areas prescribed by the Board. 216 The curriculum of any such alternative certification program shall be approved by the Board. Nothing in 217 this subsection shall preclude the Board from establishing other alternate routes to licensure.

218 \mathbf{M} . N. The Board, in its regulations providing for licensure by reciprocity established pursuant to 219 subsection subsections K and L, shall (i) permit applicants to submit third-party employment verification 220 forms and (ii) grant special consideration to individuals who have successfully completed a program 221 offered by a provider that is accredited by the Council for the Accreditation of Educator Preparation.

222 N. O. The Board shall develop guidelines that establish a process to permit a school board or any 223 organization sponsored by a school board to petition the Board for approval of an alternate route to 224 licensure that may be used to meet the requirements for a provisional or renewable license or any 225 endorsement. Any such alternate route may include alternatives to the regulatory requirements for 226 teacher preparation, including alternative professional assessments and coursework. The petitioner may 227 proffer or the Board may impose conditions in conjunction with the approval of such petition.

228 2. That the Department of Education shall compile and publicly post on its website in a format conducive to comparison to the standards and requirements for teacher licensure in the 229 230 Commonwealth data on the teacher licensure standards and requirements for each state for the 231 purposes of facilitating the determination of the compatibility of out-of-state teacher licenses with 232 teacher licensure requirements and standards in the Commonwealth and increasing transparency 233 in requirements for teacher licensure and licensure by reciprocity in the Commonwealth. The 234 Department shall update such data as necessary to reflect the current and accurate standards and 235 requirements for teacher licensure in each state.
