That § 18.2-144 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: 10 § 18.2-144. Maiming, killing, or poisoning livestock, companion animals, or fowl; penalties. Except as otherwise provided for by law, if any person maliciously shoot shoots, stab stabs, wound 11 12 or wounds, or otherwise cause causes bodily injury to, or administer administers poison to or expose exposes poison with intent that it be taken by, any horse, mule, pony, cattle, swine, or other livestock of 13 another, or any companion animal of another, with intent to maim, disfigure, disable, or kill the same, 14 15 or if he do does any of the foregoing acts to any such livestock or companion animal of his own with intent to defraud any insurer thereof, he shall be is guilty of a Class 5 felony. If any person do does any 16 of the foregoing acts to any fowl or with any of the aforesaid intents (i) to any companion animal with 17 any of the aforesaid intents unlawfully but not maliciously or (ii) to any fowl, he shall be is guilty of a 18 Class 1 misdemeanor, except that any second or subsequent offense shall be a Class 6 felony if the 19 20 current offense or any previous offense resulted in the death of an animal or the euthanasia of an animal 21 based on the recommendation of a licensed veterinarian upon determination that such euthanasia was 22 necessary due to the condition of the animal, and such condition was a direct result of a violation of this 23 section. 24 2. That the provisions of this act may result in a net increase in periods of imprisonment or 25 commitment. Pursuant to § 30-19.1:4, the estimated amount of the necessary appropriation cannot be determined for periods of imprisonment in state adult correctional facilities; therefore, Chapter 26

27 1 of the Acts of Assembly of 2023, Special Session I, requires the Virginia Criminal Sentencing

28 Commission to assign a minimum fiscal impact of \$50,000. Pursuant to § 30-19.1:4, the estimated

29 amount of the necessary appropriation cannot be determined for periods of commitment to the

30 custody of the Department of Juvenile Justice.
