That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Title 9.1 a chapter numbered 16, consisting 12 of a section numbered 9.1-1600, as follows: 13 14 CHAPTER 16. VIRGINIA PUBLIC SAFETY COMMUNICATIONS INFRASTRUCTURE GRANT FUND AND PROGRAM. 15 § 9.1-1600. Virginia Public Safety Communications Infrastructure Grant Fund and Program. 16 A. There is hereby created in the state treasury a special nonreverting fund to be known as the 17 Virginia Public Safety Communications Infrastructure Fund (the Fund). The Fund shall be established 18 on the books of the Comptroller, shall be administered by the Department of Emergency Management 19 20 (the Department), and shall be financially managed by the Virginia Resources Authority. All funds 21 appropriated for such purpose, receipts from loans made to the Fund by local governments, and income 22 from the investment of funds in the Fund and any gifts, donations, grants, bequests, and other funds 23 received on its behalf shall be paid into the state treasury and credited to the Fund. Interest earned on 24 moneys in the Fund shall remain in the Fund and be credited to it. Any moneys remaining in the Fund, 25 including interest thereon, at the end of each fiscal year shall not revert to the general fund but shall remain in the Fund. Moneys in the Fund shall be used solely for purposes of (i) awarding grants on a 26 27 competitive basis to local governments through the Virginia Public Safety Communications 28 Infrastructure Program established pursuant to subsection B, (ii) making low-interest or zero-interest 29 loans to local governments through the Virginia Public Safety Communications Infrastructure Program 30 established pursuant to subsection B, or (iii) implementing and administering the Virginia Public Safety Communications Infrastructure Program established pursuant to subsection B. However, no more than 15 percent of unobligated moneys in the Fund shall be allocated for grant uses, and in no case shall grants from the Fund be used to fund the entire cost of an approved local project. Expenditures and 31 32 33 disbursements from the Fund shall be made by the State Treasurer on warrants issued by the 34 35 Comptroller upon written request signed by the State Coordinator of Emergency Management. 36 B. The Virginia Public Safety Communications Infrastructure Grant Program (the Program) is 37 hereby established for the purpose, subject to appropriation, of awarding grants on a competitive basis 38 and making low-interest or zero-interest loans from such funds as may be available from the Fund to 39 localities for the purpose of assisting with improvement projects relating to public safety radio and 40 communications infrastructure. The Program shall be administered by the Department. In administering 41 the Program, the Department shall establish and publish guidelines and criteria for grant awards or 42 loans, including guidelines and criteria governing applications to the Department and grant or loan recipients relating to improvements to public safety radio and communications infrastructure; develop 43 funding recommendations; and provide assistance and oversight for projects funded through the Program. The Department shall prioritize projects that (i) serve law-enforcement, fire, rescue, and 44 45 46 emergency medical services through a single operating system; (ii) provide comprehensive interoperability across multiple localities or a region; and (iii) serve areas with a high fiscal stress 47 48 index score. Localities eligible for the Program upon approval from the Department shall be eligible for 49 low-interest or zero-interest loans, partial grants, or a combination of loans and grants to help finance the costs of new or replacement public safety communications systems. However, in no case shall grants 50 51 be awarded in an amount that funds the entire cost of an approved local project. The Department shall 52 oversee each grant or loan awarded through the Program and ensure thorough reporting on each such 53 grant.
