Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

15 1. That §§ 18.2-246.8, 18.2-371.2, 22.1-79.5, 22.1-206, 22.1-279.6, 58.1-1021.01, 58.1-1021.02, 16 58.1-1021.04:1, 58.1-1021.04:5, and 59.1-293.10 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted 17 and that the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Article 2.1 of Chapter 10 of Title 58.1 18 19 sections numbered 58.1-1021.06 through 58.1-1021.09 and by adding in Chapter 10 of Title 58.1 an 20 article numbered 4, consisting of sections numbered 58.1-1030.1 through 58.1-1030.7, as follows: 21 § 18.2-246.8. Age verification requirements.

A. No person shall mail, ship, or otherwise deliver cigarettes in connection with a delivery sale 22 23 unless prior to the first delivery sale to a consumer such person:

24 1. Obtains from the prospective consumer a certification that includes (i) a reliable confirmation that 25 the consumer is at least the legal minimum purchase age, and (ii) a statement signed by the prospective consumer in writing that certifies the prospective consumer's address and that the consumer is at least 21 26 27 years of age. Such statement shall also confirm (a) that the prospective consumer understands that 28 signing another person's name to such certification is illegal, (b) that the sale of cigarettes to individuals 29 under the legal minimum purchase age is illegal, and (c) that the purchase of cigarettes by individuals 30 under the legal minimum purchase age is illegal under the laws of the Commonwealth;

31 2. Makes a good faith effort to verify the information contained in the certification provided by the prospective consumer pursuant to subsection A subdivision 1 against a commercially available database 32 33 of valid, government-issued identification that contains the date of birth or age of the individual placing 34 the order, or obtains a photocopy or other image of the valid, government-issued identification stating 35 the date of birth or age of the individual placing the order;

3. Provides to the prospective consumer, via e-mail email or other means, a notice that meets the requirements of § 18.2-246.9; and

38 4. Receives payment for the delivery sale from the prospective consumer by a credit or debit card 39 that has been issued in such consumer's name or by a check drawn on the consumer's account.

40 B. 1. Except as provided in 58.1-1021.06, if a purchase order for a retail tobacco product, as 41 defined in § 58.1-1030.1, is made via the Internet, no person shall make a delivery for such order unless 42 the delivery is to a permit holder, as defined in § 58.1-1030.1.

2. Persons accepting purchase orders made via the Internet for delivery sales may request that 43 44 prospective consumers provide their e-mail email addresses.

§ 18.2-371.2. Prohibiting purchase or possession of retail tobacco products and hemp products 45 intended for smoking by a person under 21 years of age or sale of retail tobacco products and 46 47 hemp products intended for smoking to persons under 21 years of age; civil penalties.

A. No person shall sell to, distribute to, purchase for, or knowingly permit the purchase by any 48 49 person less younger than 21 years of age, knowing or having reason to believe that such person is less younger than 21 years of age, any retail tobacco product, nicotine vapor product, alternative nicotine 50 51 product, or hemp product intended for smoking.

52 Tobacco products, nicotine vapor products, alternative nicotine products, and No person shall sell 53 retail tobacco products or hemp products intended for smoking may be sold from a vending machine only if the machine is (i) posted with a notice, in a conspicuous manner and place, indicating that the 54 55 purchase or possession of such products by persons under 21 years of age is unlawful and (ii) located in a place that is not open to the general public and is not generally accessible to persons under 21 years 56 of age. An establishment that prohibits the presence of persons under 21 years of age unless 57 accompanied by a person 21 years of age or older is not open to the general public. 58

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36 37 59 B. No person less than 21 years of age shall attempt to purchase, purchase, or possess any tobacco 60 product, nicotine vapor product, alternative nicotine product, or hemp product intended for smoking. The 61 provisions of this subsection shall not be applicable to the possession of tobacco products, nicotine 62 vapor products, alternative nicotine products, or hemp products intended for smoking by a person less 63 than 21 years of age (i) making a delivery of tobacco products, nicotine vapor products, alternative 64 nicotine products, or hemp products intended for smoking in pursuance of his employment or (ii) as part 65 of a scientific study being conducted by an organization for the purpose of medical research to further efforts in cigarette and tobacco use prevention and cessation and tobacco product regulation, provided 66 that such medical research has been approved by an institutional review board pursuant to applicable 67 federal regulations or by a research review committee pursuant to Chapter 5.1 (§ 32.1-162.16 et seq.) of **68** Title 32.1. This subsection shall not apply to purchase, attempt to purchase, or possession by a 69 70 law-enforcement officer or his agent when the same is necessary in the performance of his duties.

71 C. No person shall sell a retail tobacco product, nicotine vapor product, alternative nicotine product, or hemp product intended for smoking to any individual who does not demonstrate, by producing a 72 73 driver's license or similar photo identification issued by a government agency, that the individual is at 74 least 21 years of age. Such identification is not required from an individual whom the person has reason 75 to believe is at least 21 years of age or who the person knows is at least 21 years of age. Proof that the person demanded, was shown, and reasonably relied upon a photo identification stating that the 76 77 individual was at least 21 years of age shall be a defense to any action brought under this subsection. In 78 determining whether a person had reason to believe an individual is at least 21 years of age, the trier of 79 fact may consider, but is not limited to, proof of the general appearance, facial characteristics, behavior, 80 and manner of the individual.

81 Before a retail dealer may sell retail tobacco products to any consumer, the person selling, offering
82 for sale, giving, or furnishing the retail tobacco products shall verify that the consumer is of legal age
83 by examining from any person who appears to be under 30 years of age a government-issued
84 photographic identification that establishes the person is of legal age and verifying the identification
85 presented using third-party identification fraud detection software, technology, or scanner that confirms
86 the authenticity of such identification.

87 This subsection shall not apply to mail order or Internet sales, provided that the person offering the 88 *retail* tobacco product, nicotine vapor product, alternative nicotine product, or hemp product intended for 89 smoking for sale through mail order or the Internet (i) prior to the sale of the *retail* tobacco product, 90 nicotine vapor product, alternative nicotine product, or hemp product intended for smoking verifies that 91 the purchaser is at least 21 years of age through a commercially available database that is regularly used 92 by businesses or governmental entities for the purpose of age and identity verification and (ii) uses a 93 method of mailing, shipping, or delivery that requires the signature of a person at least 21 years of age before the *retail* tobacco product, nicotine vapor product, alternative nicotine product, or hemp product 94 95 intended for smoking will be released to the purchaser.

96 D. The provisions of subsections B and C shall not apply to the sale, giving, or furnishing of any
97 tobacco product, nicotine vapor product, alternative nicotine product, or hemp product intended for
98 smoking to any active duty military personnel who are 18 years of age or older. An identification card
99 issued by the Armed Forces of the United States shall be accepted as proof of age for this purpose.

E. A violation of subsection A or C by an individual or by a separate retail establishment that involves a nicotine vapor product, alternative nicotine product, hemp product intended for smoking, or tobacco product other than a bidi is punishable by a civil penalty not to exceed \$100 for a first violation, a civil penalty not to exceed \$200 for a second violation, and a civil penalty not to exceed \$500 for a third or subsequent violation.

C. A violation of subsection A or $\in B$ by an individual or by a separate retail establishment that 105 106 involves the sale, distribution, or purchase of a bidi is punishable by a civil penalty in the amount of 107 \$500 for a first violation, a civil penalty in the amount of \$1,000 for a second violation, and a civil 108 penalty in the amount of \$2,500 for a third second or subsequent violation. Where a defendant retail 109 establishment offers proof that it has trained its employees concerning the requirements of this section, 110 the court shall suspend all of the penalties imposed hereunder. However, where the court finds that a 111 retail establishment has failed to so train its employees, the court may impose a civil penalty not to exceed \$1,000 in lieu of any penalties imposed hereunder for a violation of subsection A or C involving 112 113 a nicotine vapor product, alternative nicotine product, hemp product intended for smoking, or tobacco 114 product other than a bidi If applicable, upon a third or subsequent violation, the Department of Taxation shall suspend or revoke any distributor's license pursuant to subsection C of § 58.1-1021.04:1 and suspend or revoke any tobacco retailer's permit pursuant to subdivision B 2 of § 58.1-1030.5. 115 116

117 A violation of subsection B is punishable by a civil penalty not to exceed \$100 for a first violation and a civil penalty not to exceed \$250 for a second or subsequent violation. A court may, as an alternative to the civil penalty, and upon motion of the defendant, prescribe the performance of up to 20 hours of community service for a first violation of subsection B and up to 40 hours of community

service for a second or subsequent violation. If the defendant fails or refuses to complete the community 121 122 service as prescribed, the court may impose the civil penalty. Upon a violation of subsection B, the 123 judge may enter an order pursuant to subdivision A 9 of § 16.1-278.8. For any violation of this section 124 by an employee of a retail establishment, such penalty shall be assessed (i) against the establishment 125 and (ii) an additional penalty of \$100 against the employee.

126 Any attorney for the Commonwealth of the county or city in which an alleged violation occurred 127 may bring an action to recover the civil penalty, which shall be paid into the state treasury. Any 128 law-enforcement officer may issue a summons for a violation of subsection A_7 or B_7 or C_2 .

129 F. D. 1. Cigarettes and hemp products intended for smoking shall be sold only in sealed packages 130 provided by the manufacturer, with the required health warning. The proprietor of every retail 131 establishment that offers for sale any retail tobacco product, nicotine vapor product, alternative nicotine 132 product, or hemp product intended for smoking shall post in a conspicuous manner and place a sign or 133 signs indicating that the sale of *retail* tobacco products, nicotine vapor products, alternative nicotine 134 products, or hemp products intended for smoking to any person under 21 years of age is prohibited by 135 law. Any attorney for the county, city, or town in which an alleged violation of this subsection occurred 136 may enforce this subsection by civil action to recover a civil penalty not to exceed \$500. The civil 137 penalty shall be paid into the local treasury. No filing fee or other fee or cost shall be charged to the 138 county, city, or town which instituted the action.

139 2. For the purpose of compliance with regulations of the Substance Abuse and Mental Health 140 Services Administration published at 61 Federal Register 1492, the Department of Agriculture and 141 Consumer Services may promulgate regulations which allow the Department to undertake the activities 142 necessary to comply with such regulations.

143 3. Any attorney for the county, city, or town in which an alleged violation of this subsection 144 occurred may enforce this subsection by civil action to recover a civil penalty not to exceed \$500. The 145 civil penalty shall be paid into the local treasury. No filing fee or other fee or cost shall be charged to 146 the county, city, or town which instituted the action. 147

G. E. Nothing in this section shall be construed to create a private cause of action.

148 H. F. Agents of the Virginia Alcoholic Beverage Control Authority designated pursuant to § 4.1-105 149 may issue a summons for any violation of this section. Additionally, any retailer selling retail tobacco 150 products shall be subject to the enforcement and compliance provisions of § 58.1-1030.5. 151

I. G. As used in this section:

152 "Alternative nicotine product" means any noncombustible product containing nicotine that is intended 153 for human consumption, whether chewed, absorbed, dissolved, or ingested by any other means. 154 "Alternative nicotine product" does not include any nicotine vapor product, tobacco product, or product 155 regulated as a drug or device by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) under Chapter V (21 156 U.S.C. § 351 et seq.) of the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act.

157 "Bidi" means a product containing tobacco that is wrapped in temburni leaf (diospyros melanoxylon) 158 or tendu leaf (diospyros exculpra), or any other product that is offered to, or purchased by, consumers as 159 a bidi or beedie.

160 "Electronic smoking device" means any device that may be used to deliver any aerosolized or 161 vaporized substance to the person inhaling from the device, including an e-cigarette, e-cigar, e-pipe, 162 vape pen, or e-hookah. "Electronic smoking device" includes any component, part, or accessory of the 163 device, whether or not sold separately, and also includes any substance intended to be aerosolized or 164 vaporized during the use of the device, whether or not the substance contains nicotine. "Electronic 165 smoking device" does not include any battery or battery charger when sold separately. "Electronic smoking device" does not include drugs or devices, as such terms are defined in 21 U.S.C. § 321, or 166 167 combination products, as such term is used in 21 U.S.C. § 353, if such drugs, devices, or combination 168 products are authorized for sale by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration.

169 "Hemp product" means and "hemp product intended for smoking" mean the same as that term is 170 those terms are defined in § 3.2-4112.

171 "Nicotine vapor product" means any noncombustible product containing nicotine that employs a 172 heating element, power source, electronic circuit, or other electronic, chemical, or mechanical means, 173 regardless of shape or size, that can be used to produce vapor from nicotine in a solution or other form. 174 "Nicotine vapor product" includes any electronic cigarette, electronic cigar, electronic cigarillo, electronic 175 pipe, or similar product or device and any cartridge or other container of nicotine in a solution or other 176 form that is intended to be used with or in an electronic cigarette, electronic cigar, electronic cigarillo, 177 electronic pipe, or similar product or device. "Nicotine vapor product" does not include any product 178 regulated by the FDA under Chapter V (21 U.S.C. § 351 et seq.) of the Federal Food, Drug, and 179 Cosmetic Act.

180 "Tobacco Retail tobacco product" means (i) any product containing, made of, or derived from 181 tobacco or that contains nicotine that is intended for human consumption or is likely to be consumed,

182 whether smoked, heated, chewed, dissolved, inhaled, absorbed, or ingested by other means, including a 183 cigarette, a cigar, pipe tobacco, chewing tobacco, snuff, or snus; (ii) any electronic smoking device and 184 any substances that may be aerosolized or vaporized by such device, whether or not the substance 185 contains nicotine; and includes eigarettes, eigars, smokeless tobacco, pipe tobacco, bidis, and wrappings 186 (iii) any component, part, or accessory of a product described in clause (i) or (ii), whether or not such 187 component, part, or accessory contains tobacco or nicotine, including filters, rolling papers, blunt or 188 hemp wraps, and pipes. "Retail tobacco product" includes any nicotine vapor product as that term is 189 defined in § 58.1-1020.01. "Tobacco Retail tobacco product" does not include any nicotine vapor product, alternative nicotine product, or product that is regulated by the FDA under Chapter V (21 190 191 U.S.C. §- 351 et seq.) of the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act drugs or devices, as such terms are 192 defined in 21 U.S.C. § 321, or combination products, as such term is used in 21 U.S.C. § 353, if such 193 drugs, devices, or combination products are authorized for sale by the U.S. Food and Drug 194 Administration.

195 "Wrappings" includes papers materials made or sold for covering or rolling tobacco or other 196 materials for smoking in a manner similar to a cigarette or cigar. 197

§ 22.1-79.5. Policy regarding retail tobacco products and hemp products intended for smoking.

198 Each school board shall develop and implement a policy to prohibit, at any time, the use and 199 distribution of any retail tobacco product or nicotine vapor product or hemp product intended for 200 smoking, as those terms are defined in § 18.2-371.2, on a school bus, on school property, or at an 201 on-site or off-site school-sponsored activity.

202 Such policy shall include (i) provisions for its enforcement among students, employees, and visitors, 203 including the enumeration of possible sanctions or disciplinary action consistent with state or federal law, and (ii) referrals to resources to help staff and students overcome tobacco addiction. 204 205

Each school board shall work to ensure adequate notice of this policy.

206 § 22.1-206. Instruction concerning drugs, alcohol, substance abuse, retail tobacco products, 207 hemp products intended for smoking, and gambling.

208 A. Instruction concerning drugs and drug abuse shall be provided by the public schools as prescribed 209 by the Board of Education.

210 B. Instruction concerning the public safety hazards and dangers of alcohol abuse, underage drinking, and drunk driving shall be provided in the public schools. The Virginia Alcoholic Beverage Control 211 212 Authority shall provide educational materials to the Department of Education. The Department of 213 Education shall review and shall distribute such materials as are approved to the public schools.

214 C. The Virginia Foundation for Healthy Youth shall develop and the Department of Education shall 215 distribute to each local school division educational materials concerning the health and safety risks of using retail tobacco products, nicotine vapor products, and alternative nicotine products and hemp 216 217 products intended for smoking, as such terms are defined in § 18.2-371.2. Instruction concerning the 218 health and safety risks of using tobacco products, nicotine vapor products, and alternative nicotine 219 products and hemp products intended for smoking, as such terms are defined in § 18.2-371.2, shall be 220 provided in each public elementary and secondary school in the Commonwealth, consistent with such 221 educational materials.

222 D. C. Instruction concerning gambling and the addictive potential thereof shall be provided by the 223 public schools as prescribed by the Board.

224 § 22.1-279.6. Board of Education guidelines and model policies for codes of student conduct; 225 school board regulations.

226 A. The Board of Education shall establish guidelines and develop model policies for codes of student 227 conduct to aid local school boards in the implementation of such policies. The guidelines and model 228 policies shall include (i) criteria for the removal of a student from a class, the use of suspension, expulsion, and exclusion as disciplinary measures, the grounds for suspension and, expulsion, and 229 exclusion, and the procedures to be followed in such cases, including proceedings for such suspension, 230 231 expulsion, and exclusion decisions and all applicable appeals processes; (ii) standards, consistent with state, federal, and case laws, for school board policies on alcohol and drugs, gang-related activity, 232 233 hazing, vandalism, trespassing, threats, search and seizure, disciplining of students with disabilities, 234 intentional injury of others, self-defense, bullying, the use of electronic means for purposes of bullying, 235 harassment, and intimidation, and dissemination of such policies to students, their parents, and school 236 personnel; (iii) standards for in-service training of school personnel in and examples of the appropriate 237 management of student conduct and student offenses in violation of school board policies; (iv) standards 238 for dress or grooming codes; and (v) standards for reducing bias and harassment in the enforcement of 239 any code of student conduct.

240 In accordance with the most recent enunciation of constitutional principles by the Supreme Court of 241 the United States of America, the Board's standards for school board policies on alcohol and drugs and 242 search and seizure shall include guidance for procedures relating to voluntary and mandatory drug testing in schools, including which groups may be tested, use of test results, confidentiality of test 243

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244 information, privacy considerations, consent to the testing, need to know, and release of the test results 245 to the appropriate school authority.

246 In the case of suspension and expulsion, the procedures set forth in this article shall be the minimum 247 procedures that the school board may prescribe.

248 B. School boards shall adopt and revise, as required by § 22.1-253.13:7 and in accordance with the 249 requirements of this section, regulations on codes of student conduct that are consistent with, but may be 250 more stringent than, the guidelines of the Board. School boards shall include in the regulations on codes 251 of student conduct procedures for suspension, expulsion, and exclusion decisions and shall biennially 252 review the model student conduct code to incorporate discipline options and alternatives to preserve a 253 safe, nondisruptive environment for effective teaching and learning.

254 C. Each school board shall include in its code of student conduct prohibitions against hazing and 255 profane or obscene language or conduct. School boards shall also cite in their codes of student conduct 256 the provisions of § 18.2-56, which defines and prohibits hazing and imposes a Class 1 misdemeanor 257 penalty for violations, that is, confinement in jail for not more than 12 months and a fine of not more 258 than \$2,500, either or both.

259 D. Each school board shall include in its code of student conduct policies and procedures that 260 include a prohibition against bullying. Such policies and procedures shall (i) be consistent with the standards for school board policies on bullying and the use of electronic means for purposes of bullying 261 262 developed by the Board pursuant to subsection A and (ii) direct the principal or his designee to notify 263 the parent of any student involved in an alleged incident of bullying within 24 hours of learning of the 264 allegation of bullying.

265 Such policies and procedures shall not be interpreted to infringe upon the First Amendment rights of 266 students and are not intended to prohibit expression of religious, philosophical, or political views, 267 provided that such expression does not cause an actual, material disruption of the work of the school.

268 E. A school board may regulate the use or possession of beepers or other portable communications 269 devices and laser pointers by students on school property or attending school functions or activities and 270 establish disciplinary procedures pursuant to this article to which students violating such regulations will 271 be subject.

272 F. Nothing in this section shall be construed to require any school board to adopt policies requiring 273 or encouraging any drug testing in schools. However, a school board may, in its discretion, require or 274 encourage drug testing in accordance with the Board of Education's guidelines and model student 275 conduct policies required by subsection A and the Board's guidelines for student searches required by 276 § 22.1-279.7.

277 G. The Board of Education shall establish standards to ensure compliance with the federal Improving 278 America's Schools Act of 1994 (Part F-Gun-Free Schools Act of 1994), as amended, in accordance with 279 § 22.1-277.07.

280 This subsection shall not be construed to diminish the authority of the Board of Education or to 281 diminish the Governor's authority to coordinate and provide policy direction on official communications 282 between the Commonwealth and the United States government.

283 H. Each school board shall include in its code of student conduct a prohibition on possessing any 284 retail tobacco product or nicotine vapor product hemp product intended for smoking, as those terms are 285 defined in § 18.2-371.2, on a school bus, on school property, or at an on-site or off-site 286 school-sponsored activity.

287 I. Any school board may include in its code of student conduct a dress or grooming code. Any dress 288 or grooming code included in a school board's code of student conduct or otherwise adopted by a school 289 board shall (i) permit any student to wear any religiously and ethnically specific or significant head 290 covering or hairstyle, including hijabs, yarmulkes, headwraps, braids, locs, and cornrows; (ii) maintain 291 gender neutrality by subjecting any student to the same set of rules and standards regardless of gender; 292 (iii) not have a disparate impact on students of a particular gender; (iv) be clear, specific, and objective 293 in defining terms, if used; (v) prohibit any school board employee from enforcing the dress or grooming 294 code by direct physical contact with a student or a student's attire; and (vi) prohibit any school board 295 employee from requiring a student to undress in front of any other individual, including the enforcing 296 school board employee, to comply with the dress or grooming code. 297

§ 58.1-1021.01. Definitions.

298 As used in this article, unless the context requires a different meaning:

299 "Actual cost" means the actual price paid by a remote retail seller for each individual stock keeping 300 unit or SKU.

301 "Alternative nicotine product" means any noncombustible product containing nicotine that is not 302 made of tobacco and is intended for human consumption, whether chewed, absorbed, dissolved, or ingested by any other means. "Alternative nicotine product" does not include any nicotine vapor product 303 or any product regulated as a drug or device by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) under 304

305 Chapter V (21 U.S.C. § 351 et seq.) of the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act.

"Cigar" means any roll of tobacco wrapped in leaf tobacco or in any substance containing tobacco, other than any roll of tobacco that is a cigarette as such term is defined in § 58.1-1000.

308 "Closed system" means any nicotine vapor product capable of utilizing a disposable container that is
309 (i) prefilled with liquid nicotine and sealed by the manufacturer, (ii) not easily refillable or intended or
310 designed to be refillable, and (iii) intended or used to dispense liquid nicotine for use in a nicotine
311 vapor product that is intended or designed for reuse. "Closed system" does not include any open system.
312 "Consumer" means the person who is the end or final user of tobacco products or liquid nicotine.

313 "Delivery sale" means a sale of liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor products to a consumer in the 314 Commonwealth in which the consumer submits the order for the sale by telephone, over the Internet, or 315 through the mail or another delivery system, and where the liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor products 316 are shipped through a delivery service. "Delivery sale" does not include a sale of liquid nicotine or 317 nicotine vapor products not for personal consumption to a person who is a manufacturer, distributor, or 318 retail dealer.

319 "Distributor" means (i) any person engaged in the business of selling tobacco products in the 320 Commonwealth who brings, or causes to be brought, into the Commonwealth from outside the 321 Commonwealth any tobacco products for sale; (ii) any person who makes, manufactures, fabricates, or 322 stores tobacco products in the Commonwealth for sale in the Commonwealth; (iii) any person engaged 323 in the business of selling tobacco products outside the Commonwealth who ships or transports tobacco 324 products to any person in the business of selling tobacco products in the Commonwealth; or (iv) any 325 retail dealer in possession of untaxed tobacco products in the Commonwealth.

326 "Heated tobacco product" means a product containing tobacco that produces an inhalable aerosol (i)
327 by heating the tobacco by means of an electronic device without combustion of the tobacco or (ii) by
328 heat generated from a combustion source that only or primarily heats rather than burns the tobacco.

329 "Liquid nicotine" means a liquid or other substance containing nicotine in any *a* concentration that is
 330 sold, marketed, or *and* intended for use in a nicotine vapor product.

"Loose leaf tobacco" means any leaf tobacco that is not intended to be smoked, but shall does not include moist snuff. Loose leaf tobacco weight unit categories shall be as follows:

1. "Loose leaf tobacco half pound-unit" means a consumer sized consumer-sized unit, pouch, or
package containing at least 4 *four* ounces but not more than 8 *eight* ounces of loose leaf tobacco, by net
weight, produced by the manufacturer to be sold to consumers as a single unit and not produced to be
divided or sold separately and containing one individual package.

2. "Loose leaf tobacco pound-unit" means a consumer sized consumer-sized unit, pouch, or package containing more than 8 *eight* ounces of loose leaf tobacco, by net weight, produced by the manufacturer to be sold to consumers as a single unit and not produced to be divided or sold separately and containing one individual package.

341 3. "Loose leaf tobacco single-unit" means a consumer sized consumer-sized unit, pouch, or package
342 containing less than 4 *four* ounces of loose leaf tobacco, by net weight, produced by the manufacturer to
343 be sold to consumers as a single unit and not produced to be divided or sold separately and containing
344 one individual package.

345 "Manufacturer" means a person who manufactures or produces tobacco products and sells tobacco346 products to a distributor.

347 "Manufacturer's representative" means a person employed by a manufacturer to sell or distribute the manufacturer's tobacco products.

349 "Manufacturer's sales price" means the actual price for which a manufacturer, manufacturer's350 representative, or any other person sells tobacco products to an unaffiliated distributor.

351 "Moist snuff" means a tobacco product consisting of finely cut, ground, or powdered tobacco that is
and intended to be smoked but shall *does* not include any finely cut, ground, or powdered tobacco that is
and intended to be placed in the nasal cavity.

354 "Nicotine vapor product" means any noncombustible product containing nicotine that employs a 355 heating element, power source, electronic circuit, or other electronic, chemical, or mechanical means, regardless of shape or size, that can be used to produce vapor from nicotine in a solution or other form, 356 357 including liquid nicotine. "Nicotine vapor product" includes any electronic cigarette, electronic cigar, electronic cigarillo, electronic pipe, closed system, open system, or similar product or device and any 358 359 cartridge or other container of nicotine in a solution or other form, *including liquid nicotine*, that is intended to be used with or in an electronic cigarette, electronic cigar, electronic cigarillo, electronic 360 pipe, or similar product or device. "Nicotine vapor product" does not include any product regulated by the FDA under Chapter V (21 U.S.C. § 351 et seq.) of the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act. 361 362

"Open system" means a nicotine vapor product designed and intended by the manufacturer to be
 reusable and refilled with liquid nicotine of the end user's choice. "Open system" does not include any
 closed system.

366 "Person" means any individual, corporation, partnership, association, company, business, trust, joint

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367 venture, or other legal entity.

368 "Pipe tobacco" means any tobacco that, because of its appearance, type, packaging, or labeling, is369 suitable for use and likely to be offered or purchased by consumers as tobacco to be smoked in a pipe.

370 "Remote retail sale" means any sale of cigars or pipe tobacco to a consumer in the Commonwealth 371 when (i) the consumer submits the order for the sale by means of a telephone or other method of voice 372 transmission, the mail, or the Internet or other online service, or the seller is otherwise not in the 373 physical presence of the consumer when the request for the purchase or order is made, or (ii) the cigars 374 or pipe tobacco are delivered to the consumer by common carrier, private delivery service, or other 375 method of remote delivery, or the seller is not in the physical presence of the consumer when the buyer 376 obtains possession of the cigars or pipe tobacco.

377 "Remote retail seller" means a person located within or outside of this state the Commonwealth that
378 makes remote retail sales of cigars or pipe tobacco.

379 "Retail dealer" means every person who sells or offers for sale any tobacco product *or liquid nicotine*380 to consumers at retail in a transaction other than a remote retail sale.

381 "Retail tobacco product" means (i) any product containing, made of, or derived from tobacco or that 382 contains nicotine that is intended for human consumption or is likely to be consumed, whether smoked, 383 heated, chewed, dissolved, inhaled, absorbed, or ingested by other means, including a cigarette, a cigar, 384 pipe tobacco, chewing tobacco, snuff, or snus; (ii) any electronic smoking device and any substances 385 that may be aerosolized or vaporized by such device, whether or not the substance contains nicotine; 386 and (iii) any component, part, or accessory of a product described in clause (i) or (ii), whether or not 387 such component, part, or accessory contains tobacco or nicotine, including filters, rolling papers, blunt or hemp wraps, and pipes. "Retail tobacco product" includes any nicotine vapor product. "Retail 388 389 tobacco product" does not include drugs or devices, as such terms are defined in 21 U.S.C. § 321, or 390 combination products, as such term is used in 21 U.S.C. § 353, if such drugs, devices, or combination 391 products are authorized for sale by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration.

392 "SKU" means an individual stock keeping unit identifier used for tracking inventory.

393 "Tobacco product" or "tobacco products" means (i) "cigar" as defined in § 5702(a) of the Internal
394 Revenue Code, and as such section may be amended; (ii) "smokeless tobacco" as defined in § 5702(m)
395 of the Internal Revenue Code, and as such section may be amended; or (iii) "pipe tobacco" as defined in
396 § 5702(n) of the Internal Revenue Code, and as such section may be amended; "Tobacco products" shall
397 also include loose leaf tobacco.

398 § 58.1-1021.02. Tax on tobacco products and liquid nicotine.

A. In addition to all other taxes now imposed by law, there is hereby imposed a tax upon the
 privilege of selling or dealing in tobacco products *and liquid nicotine* in the Commonwealth by any
 person engaged in business as a distributor or remote retail seller thereof, at the following rates:

402 1. Upon each package of moist snuff, at the rate of \$0.18 per ounce with a proportionate tax at the same rate on all fractional parts of an ounce. The tax shall be computed based on the net weight as404 listed by the manufacturer on the package in accordance with federal law.

405 2. For purposes of the tax under this article, loose leaf tobacco shall be classified as loose leaf tobacco single-units, loose leaf tobacco half pound-units, and loose leaf tobacco pound-units. Such tax shall be imposed on upon the distributor for loose leaf tobacco as follows:

- **408** a. \$0.21 for each loose leaf tobacco single-unit;
- b. \$0.40 for each loose leaf tobacco half pound-unit;
- 410 c. \$0.70 for each loose leaf tobacco pound-unit; and

d. For any other unit, pouch, or package of loose leaf tobacco, the tax shall be by net weight and
shall be \$0.21 per unit, pouch, or package plus \$0.21 for each increment of 4 *four* ounces or portion
thereof that the loose leaf tobacco exceeds 16 ounces.

414 The tax for each unit, pouch, or package of loose leaf tobacco shall be in accordance with the 415 provisions of subdivisions a- through d- only and regardless of sales price.

416 3. Upon *Except as otherwise provided, upon* tobacco products other than moist snuff or loose leaf 417 tobacco, at the rate of 10 percent of the manufacturer's sales price of such tobacco products.

418 Upon cigars and pipe tobacco products sold by remote retail sellers, the tax rates delineated in this 419 subdivision shall apply to:

420 (a) a. The actual cost; or

421 (b) b. If the actual cost is not available, the average of the actual cost over the 12 calendar months 422 before January 1 of the year in which the sale occurs.

423 4. a. Upon the privilege of selling or dealing in liquid nicotine in the Commonwealth by any person 424 engaged in business as a distributor of liquid nicotine, at the following rates:

425 (1) Upon liquid nicotine in closed systems at the rate of \$0.066 per milliliter beginning July 1, 2024,
426 for taxable sales or purchases occurring on and after such date.

427 (2) Upon liquid nicotine in open systems at the rate of 10 percent of the wholesale price beginning

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428 July 1, 2024, for taxable sales or purchases occurring on and after such date.

429 b. For any transaction involving liquid nicotine between a distributor and a retail dealer, both the 430 distributor and the retail dealer shall maintain and retain records of any invoice or sales receipt that 431 shall include itemized lists of the types of products included in such transaction, the tax due on each 432 product pursuant to this subsection, and the total amount of taxes paid. In every instance, a distributor 433 shall be responsible for paying the tax on liquid nicotine pursuant to this subdivision 4 at the time of 434 sale to a retail dealer. Such taxes shall apply only to liquid nicotine and not to any batteries, filters, or other mechanical or aesthetic components of liquid nicotine in a closed system or an open system. 435

436 Such tax shall be imposed at the time the remote retail seller located within or outside the 437 Commonwealth makes a remote retail sale to a consumer within the Commonwealth. It is the intent and 438 purpose of this subdivision that the remote retail seller be liable for the tax. It is further the intent and 439 purpose of this article to impose the tax once, and only once on all tobacco products, including cigars 440 and pipe tobacco sold in the Commonwealth.

441 Such Except as otherwise provided, such tax shall be imposed on tobacco products (i) at the time of retail sale by a retail dealer or distributor; (ii) at the time the distributor makes, manufactures, or 442 443 fabricates tobacco products in the Commonwealth for sale in the Commonwealth; or (iii) at the time the 444 distributor ships or transports tobacco products to retailers in the Commonwealth to be sold by those 445 retailers. It is the intent and purpose of this article that the distributor who first possesses the tobacco 446 product subject to this tax in the Commonwealth shall be the distributor liable for the tax. It is further 447 the intent and purpose of this article to impose the tax once, and only once on all tobacco products for sale in the Commonwealth. 448

449 B. No tax shall be imposed pursuant to this section upon tobacco products not within the taxing 450 power of the Commonwealth under the Commerce Clause of the United States Constitution.

451 C. A distributor that calculates and pays the tax pursuant to subdivision A 1 or A 2 in good faith 452 reliance on the net weight listed by the manufacturer on the package or on the manufacturer's invoice 453 shall not be liable for additional tax, or for interest or penalties, solely by reason of a subsequent 454 determination that such weight information was incorrect.

455 § 58.1-1021.04:1. Distributor's or remote retail seller's license; liquid nicotine and nicotine 456 vapor products license; penalties.

457 A. 1. No person shall engage in the business of selling or dealing in tobacco products as a distributor 458 in the Commonwealth without first having received a separate license from the Department for each 459 location or place of business. Each application for a distributor's license shall be accompanied by a fee 460 to be prescribed by the Department. Every application for such license shall be made on a form 461 prescribed by the Department and the following information shall be provided on the application:

1. a. The name and address of the applicant. If the applicant is a firm, partnership, or association, the 462 463 name and address of each of its members shall be provided. If the applicant is a corporation, the name 464 and address of each of its principal officers shall be provided; 465

2. b. The address of the applicant's principal place of business;

3. c. The place or places where the business to be licensed is to be conducted; and

4. d. Such other information as the Department may require for the purpose of the administration of 467 468 this article.

469 B. 2. A person outside the Commonwealth who ships or transports tobacco products to retailers in 470 the Commonwealth, to be sold by those retailers, may make application for license as a distributor, be 471 granted such a license by the Department, and thereafter be subject to all the provisions of this article. 472 Once a license is granted pursuant to this section, such person shall be entitled to act as a licensed 473 distributor and, unless such person maintains a registered agent pursuant to Chapter 9 (§ 13.1-601 et seq.), 10 (§ 13.1-801 et seq.), 12 (§ 13.1-1000 et seq.), or 14 (§ 13.1-1200 et seq.) of Title 13.1 or Chapter 2.1 (§ 50-73.1 et seq.) or 2.2 (§ 50-73.79 et seq.) of Title 50, shall be deemed to have appointed 474 475 476 the Clerk of the State Corporation Commission as the person's agent for the purpose of service of 477 process relating to any matter or issue involving the person and arising under the provisions of this 478 article.

479 The Department shall conduct a background investigation, to include a Virginia Criminal History 480 Records criminal history records search, and fingerprints of the applicant, or the responsible principals, 481 managers, and other persons engaged in handling tobacco products at the licensable locations, that shall 482 be submitted to the Federal Bureau of Investigation if the Department deems a National Criminal 483 Records national criminal records search necessary, on applicants for licensure as tobacco products 484 distributors. The Department may refuse to issue a distributor's license or may suspend, revoke, or refuse 485 to renew a distributor's license issued to any person, partnership, corporation, limited liability company, 486 or business trust, if it determines that the principals, managers, and other persons engaged in handling 487 tobacco products at the licensable location of the applicant have been (i) found guilty of any fraud or 488 misrepresentation in any connection; (ii) convicted of robbery, extortion, burglary, larceny, 489 embezzlement, fraudulent conversion, gambling, perjury, bribery, treason, or racketeering; or (iii) 490 convicted of a felony. Anyone who knowingly and willfully falsifies, conceals, or misrepresents a 491 material fact or knowingly and willfully makes a false, fictitious, or fraudulent statement or 492 representation in any application for a distributor's license to the Department, shall be is guilty of a 493 Class 1 misdemeanor. The Department may establish an application or renewal fee not to exceed \$750 494 to be retained by the Department to be applied to the administrative and other costs of processing 495 distributor's license applications, conducting background investigations, and issuing distributor's licenses. 496 Any amount collected pursuant to this section in excess of such costs as of June 30 in even numbered 497 *even-numbered* years shall be reported to the State Treasurer and deposited into the state treasury.

498 C_{-3} . No person inside or outside the Commonwealth shall make a remote retail sale of cigars or 499 pipe tobacco to consumers in the Commonwealth without (i) completing an application for and being 500 granted a license as a remote retail seller; (ii) determining whether economic nexus activity thresholds have been met to register for a dealer's certificate under § 58.1-613; (iii) if economic nexus thresholds 501 502 are met, collecting and remitting the excise tax pursuant to subsection A of § 58.1-1021.02; (iv) 503 providing for age verification through an independent, third-party age verification service that compares 504 information available from a commercially available database, or aggregate of databases, that is regularly 505 used by government agencies and businesses for the purpose of age and identity verification to the 506 personal information entered by the individual during the ordering process that establishes that the 507 individual is of age; and (v) if economic nexus thresholds are met, and excise tax is being remitted 508 using the actual cost list method to calculate the excise tax, providing the remote retail seller's certified 509 actual cost list to the Department for each SKU to be offered for remote retail sale in the subsequent 510 calendar year. The actual cost list shall be updated quarterly as new SKUs are added to a remote retail 511 seller's inventory. New SKUs will be added using the actual cost first paid for the SKU.

512 D. B. Upon receipt of an application in proper form and payment of the required license fee, the 513 Department shall, unless otherwise provided by this article, issue to the applicant a license, which shall 514 permit the licensee to engage in business as a distributor at the place of business shown on the license. 515 Each license, or a copy thereof, shall be prominently displayed on the premises covered by the license. 516 No license shall be transferable to any other person. Distributor's licenses issued pursuant to this section 517 shall be valid for a period of three years from the date of issue unless revoked by the Department in the 518 manner provided herein. The Department may at any time revoke the license issued to any distributor 519 who is found guilty of violating or noncompliance with any of the provisions of this chapter, or any of 520 the rules of the Department adopted and promulgated under authority of this chapter. The Department 521 shall suspend or revoke the license issued to any distributor who is found guilty of a second or 522 subsequent violation of subsection A or B of § 18.2-371.2.

523 C. 1. No person shall engage in the business of selling or dealing liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor 524 products or who ships or transports liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor products to retailers in the 525 Commonwealth, to be sold by those retailers, as a manufacturer, distributor, or retail dealer in the 526 Commonwealth without first having received a separate license from the Department for each location 527 or place of business. Each application for a manufacturer's, distributor's, or retail dealer's liquid 528 nicotine and nicotine vapor products license shall be accompanied by a fee to be prescribed by the 529 Department. Any retail dealer who has been issued a tobacco retailer permit pursuant to Article 4 530 (§ 58.1-1030.1 et seq.) shall not be required to obtain a license under this subsection, but such permit 531 holder shall otherwise comply with all other requirements of a liquid nicotine and nicotine vapor 532 products license for retail dealers. Every application for such liquid nicotine and nicotine vapor 533 products license shall be made on a form prescribed by the Department and the following information 534 shall be provided on the application:

a. The name and address of the applicant. If the applicant is a firm, partnership, or association, the
name and address of each of its members shall be provided. If the applicant is a corporation, the name
and address of each of its principal officers shall be provided;

538 b. The address of the applicant's principal place of business;

539 c. The place or places where the business to be licensed is to be conducted; and

540 *d.* Such other information as the Department may require for the purpose of the administration of 541 this article.

542 2. The Department shall conduct a background investigation, to include a Virginia criminal history 543 records search of the applicant, or the responsible principals and managers of liquid nicotine and 544 nicotine vapor products at the licensable locations that shall be submitted to the Federal Bureau of 545 Investigation if the Department deems a national criminal records search necessary, on applicants for 546 licensure as a liquid nicotine and nicotine vapor products manufacturer, distributor, or retailer, as 547 applicable. The Department may refuse to issue a license or may suspend, revoke, or refuse to renew a 548 license issued to any person, partnership, corporation, limited liability company, or business trust if it 549 determines that the principals, managers, and other persons engaged in handling liquid nicotine and nicotine vapor products at the licensable location of the applicant have been (i) found guilty of any 550

551 fraud or misrepresentation in any connection; (ii) convicted of robbery, extortion, burglary, larceny, 552 embezzlement, fraudulent conversion, gambling, perjury, bribery, treason, tax evasion, or racketeering; or (iii) convicted of a felony within the last five years. Anyone who knowingly and willfully falsifies, 553 554 conceals, or misrepresents a material fact or knowingly and willfully makes a false, fictitious, or 555 fraudulent statement or representation in any application for a license to the Department is guilty of a 556 Class 1 misdemeanor. The Department may establish an application or renewal fee to be retained by the 557 Department to be applied to the administrative and other costs of processing license applications, 558 conducting background investigations, and issuing licenses. Any amount collected pursuant to this section in excess of such costs as of June 30 in even-numbered years shall be reported to the State 559 Treasurer and deposited into the state treasury. 560

561 3. Upon receipt of an application in proper form and payment of the required license fee, the Department shall, unless otherwise provided by this article, issue to the applicant a liquid nicotine and 562 563 nicotine vapor products license, which shall permit the licensee to engage in business as a 564 manufacturer, distributor, or retail dealer at the place of business shown on the license. Each license, 565 or a copy thereof, shall be prominently displayed on the premises covered by the license. No license 566 shall be transferable to any other person. Licenses issued pursuant to this section shall be valid for two 567 years from the date of issue unless revoked by the Department in the manner provided in this section. 568 The Department may at any time revoke the license issued to any person who is found guilty of 569 violating or noncompliance with any of the provisions of this chapter or any of the rules of the 570 Department adopted and promulgated under authority of this chapter. Any distributor or retail dealer 571 granted a liquid nicotine and nicotine vapor products license pursuant to this section shall, as a condition of renewal, be required to submit to the Department an accurate record of any taxes paid on 572 573 liquid nicotine pursuant to § 58.1-1021.02.

4. No person shall make a sale of liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor products (i) to any person who 574 575 has not attained the legal age for purchasing liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor products and (ii) without 576 a valid liquid nicotine and nicotine vapor products license issued pursuant to this subsection. Any 577 person who is found guilty of violating or noncompliance with this subdivision shall be subject to the 578 following penalties: 579

a. For the first violation in a 36-month period, a penalty of no less than \$1,000;

580 b. For a second violation in a 36-month period, a penalty of no less than \$5,000 and a 30-day 581 suspension of the liquid nicotine and nicotine vapor products license; and

582 c. For a third violation in a 36-month period, a penalty of no less than \$10,000, revocation of the 583 liquid nicotine and nicotine vapor products license, and shall be ineligible to possess a liquid nicotine 584 and nicotine vapor products license for a period of three years from the date of the most recent 585 violation.

586 5. No person inside or outside the Commonwealth shall make a retail sale of liquid nicotine and 587 nicotine vapor products without providing for age verification through an independent, third-party age verification service that compares information available from a commercially available database, or 588 589 aggregate of databases, that is regularly used by government agencies and businesses for the purpose of 590 age and identity verification to the personal information entered by the individual during the ordering 591 process that establishes that the individual is of age.

592 6. For any transaction between a distributor and a retail dealer involving liquid nicotine or nicotine 593 vapor products, both the distributor and the retail dealer shall maintain and retain records of any 594 invoice or sales receipt involved that shall include itemized lists of the types of products included in such transaction, the tax due on each product pursuant to subsection B of § 58.1-1021.02, and the total 595 596 amount of taxes paid. Such records shall be produced and provided to the Department as necessary for 597 auditing, compliance, and enforcement purposes.

598 \mathbf{E} . D. The Department shall compile and maintain a current list of licensed distributors and remote 599 retail sellers of tobacco products and of manufacturers, distributors, and retail dealers of liquid nicotine and nicotine vapor products. The list shall be updated on a monthly basis, and published on the 600 601 Department's official Internet website, available to any interested party. 602

§ 58.1-1021.04:5. Tax Commissioner to establish guidelines and rules.

603 The Tax Commissioner shall establish guidelines and rules, including record keeping recordkeeping requirements, for implementation of the tax on tobacco products under Article 2.1 (§ 58.1-1021.01 et **604** seq.) of Chapter 10 of Title 58.1 of the Code of Virginia this article. The establishment of the 605 606 guidelines and rules by the Tax Commissioner shall be exempt from the provisions of the Administrative Process Act (§ 2.2-4000 et seq.). 607 608

§ 58.1-1021.06. Delivery sales of liquid nicotine and nicotine vapor products.

609 A. A retail dealer shall not make a delivery sale of liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor products without a license issued pursuant to § 58.1-1021.04:1. Such delivery sales and any shipment shall be made only **610** 611 to a legal consumer.

612 B. A retail dealer may not ship for delivery sale any liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor products

613 without first making a good faith effort to verify the age of the purchaser of the liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor products through an independent, third-party age verification software, service, or 614 615 technology that compares information available from public records to the personal information entered by the purchaser during the ordering process that establishes the purchaser is of legal age or older. 616

617 C. Prior to shipment of liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor products for a delivery sale, a retail dealer 618 shall be fully paid for the purchase and shall accept payment from the consumer by a check drawn on 619 an account in the consumer's name, by a credit card issued in the consumer's name, or by a debit card 620 issued in the consumer's name. A retail dealer taking a delivery sale may request the electronic mail 621 address of the consumer as a condition of completing such delivery sale.

622 § 58.1-1021.07. Retail sales of liquid nicotine and nicotine vapor products; identification and use 623 by minors.

624 A. Before a retail dealer may sell liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor products to any consumer, the 625 person selling, offering for sale, giving, or furnishing the liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor product shall 626 verify that the consumer is of legal age by:

627 1. For any retail sale by a retail dealer, examining from any person who appears to be under 30 628 years of age a government-issued photographic identification that establishes the person is of legal age 629 and verifying the identification presented using third-party identification fraud detection software, 630 technology, or scanner that confirms the authenticity of such identification; or

631 2. For any delivery sale by a retail dealer to a consumer in the Commonwealth, performing an age 632 verification through an independent, third-party age verification software, service, or technology that 633 compares information available from public records to the personal information entered by the 634 purchaser during the ordering process that establishes the purchaser is of legal age or older.

635 § 58.1-1021.08. General requirements for liquid nicotine and nicotine vapor products sales and 636 resale.

637 A. A retail dealer shall procure liquid nicotine and nicotine vapor products only from distributors 638 duly permitted to operate in the Commonwealth pursuant to this article.

639 B. A retail dealer shall sell liquid nicotine and nicotine vapor products only to consumers and is 640 prohibited from selling to manufacturers, distributors, other retailer dealers, and any other commercial 641 entities.

642 C. A retail dealer shall not sell more than two nicotine vapor products and five bottles or packages 643 of liquid nicotine in any one transaction to a consumer.

644 D. In every instance, a distributor shall be responsible for paying the tax on liquid nicotine pursuant 645 to § 58.1-1021.02 at the time of sale to a retail dealer.

646 E. A manufacturer may use as an ingredient in liquid nicotine and a distributor or retail dealer may 647 sell liquid nicotine containing a flavoring or food grade additive or synthetic flavoring substance that is 648 used to add flavor and that is not prohibited by the federal Food and Drug Administration as an 649 additive in nicotine vapor products. 650

§ 58.1-1021.09. Safety requirements for liquid nicotine and nicotine vapor products.

651 A. 1. Any person applying for a liquid nicotine and nicotine vapor products license or issued such a 652 valid license under this article shall comply with the following requirements:

a. Any liquid nicotine container shall use a child-resistant cap that has the child-resistant 653 654 effectiveness set forth in the poison prevention packaging standards under 16 C.F.R. § 1700.15(b)(1);

655 b. Any liquid nicotine container shall use a tamper-evident package feature that is designed to 656 remain intact and that does remain intact when handled in a reasonable manner during the 657 manufacture, distribution, and retail display of such liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor product container; 658 and

659 c. Any label on a liquid nicotine container shall meet the nicotine addictiveness warning statement 660 requirements under 21 C.F.R. § 1143.3.

2. Any retail dealer selling liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor products shall also be required to 661 display signage clearly indicating "unaccompanied minors are not allowed on the premises," "products are not for sale to minors," or "underage sales prohibited" and to display vapor products behind a 662 663 664 counter or in an enclosed display that is inaccessible without the assistance of a sales representative of 665 the retailer.

666 B. No person may sell, offer for sale, or otherwise distribute any liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor 667 product with labeling or packaging that is not in compliance with 21 C.F.R. § 1143.3 or that:

668 1. Imitates or mimics a trademark or trade dress of food products, including candy, cookies, cereal, 669 juice boxes, or soft drinks, that are or have primarily been marketed to minors;

670 2. Depicts images or references to video games, movies, videos, or animated television shows known 671 to appeal to minors;

672 3. Depicts the actual consumption of liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor products or a minor using 673 *liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor products;*

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674 4. Makes any health, medicinal, or therapeutic claims about liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor 675 products; or

676 5. Otherwise promotes overconsumption of liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor products.

677 C. Any person shall advertise or market any liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor products only where 678 consistent with the following requirements:

679 1. All advertisements and marketing shall accurately and legibly identify the person responsible for **680** its content, shall be truthful and appropriately substantiated, and shall not be presented in a manner 681 that is materially false or untrue;

682 2. Any advertising or marketing in broadcast, cable, radio, print, and digital communications or any 683 event marketing or sponsorships shall be made only where at least 85 percent of the audience is **684** reasonably expected to be at least 21 years of age, as determined by reliable, up-to-date audience 685 composition data:

686 3. No advertising or marketing may contain any statement concerning a brand or product that is **687** inconsistent with any statement or images on its labeling;

688 4. No advertising or marketing of liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor products shall be conducted on a 689 sign within 1,000 feet of a child day center as defined in § 22.1-289.02, schools offering instruction to 690 children in kindergarten through grade 12, a playground, or a youth center. However, placement of advertising or marketing signs inside a licensed premises that are not readable by normal, unassisted **691** 692 vision from a public place or public right-of-way is allowable, provided that such advertising signs do 693 not advertise liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor products in a manner intended to encourage minors to consume liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor products. The provisions of this subdivision shall not apply to 694 a retail dealer that (i) was operating as a retail dealer before July 1, 2024, or (ii) begins operating as 695 a retail dealer on or after July 1, 2024, provided that at the time such retailer begins operation such retailer is not located within 1,000 feet of a youth-oriented facility; and 696 697

698 5. No advertising or marketing may contain any health-related statement that is untrue in any 699 particular manner or tends to create a misleading impression as to the health benefits of consumption of 700 liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor products. 701

Article 4.

Registration and Restrictions for Tobacco Retailers.

§ 58.1-1030.1. Definitions.

704 As used in this article, unless the context requires a different meaning:

705 "Electronic smoking device" means the same as that term is defined in § 18.2-371.2.

706 "Liquid nicotine" and "nicotine vapor product" mean the same as those terms are defined in 707 § 58.1-1021.01

708 "Permit holder" means a person that has obtained a permit from the Department pursuant to the 709 provisions of § 58.1-1030.3.

"Person" means any natural person. 710

711 "Retail tobacco product" means the same as that term is defined in § 58.1-1021.01.

712 "Tobacco retailer" means any person, partnership, joint venture, society, club, trustee, trust, 713 association, organization, or corporation that owns, operates, or manages any tobacco retail 714 establishment. "Tobacco retailer" does not include nonmanagement employees of a tobacco retail 715 establishment.

716 "Tobacco retail establishment" means any place of business where retail tobacco products are 717 available for sale to the general public, including any grocery store, retail tobacco product shop, kiosk, 718 convenience store, gasoline service station, bar, or restaurant where retail tobacco products are 719 available for sale to the general public.

720 "Youth-oriented facility" means a child day center as defined in § 22.1-289.02, elementary school, 721 middle school, high school, or public park or any establishment that advertises in a manner that 722 identifies the establishment as catering to or providing services primarily intended for minors. 723

§ 58.1-1030.2. Permit required for sale of retail tobacco products at retail; civil penalties.

724 A. No tobacco retailer shall operate a tobacco retail establishment, conduct business as a tobacco 725 retailer, or otherwise sell or offer to sell retail tobacco products at retail unless such tobacco retailer has obtained a permit from the Department pursuant to § 58.1-1030.3 and collects taxes on such 726 727 products as required by this chapter. A tobacco retailer that qualifies as a retail dealer and sells or 728 offers to sell liquid nicotine or nicotine vapor products shall also be required to comply with the 729 requirements of Article 2.1 (§ 58.1-1021.01 et seq.) to obtain a permit pursuant to § 58.1-1030.3.

730 B. 1. No tobacco retailer shall operate a tobacco retail establishment, conduct business as a tobacco 731 retailer, or otherwise sell or offer to sell retail tobacco products at retail at a location within 1,000 feet 732 of a vouth-oriented facility.

733 2. The provisions of this subsection shall not apply to a tobacco retailer that (i) was operating as a 734 tobacco retailer before July 1, 2024, or (ii) begins operating as a tobacco retailer on or after July 1, 2024, provided that at the time such retailer begins operation such retailer is not located within 1,000 735

736 feet of a youth-oriented facility.

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737 C. 1. Any person who is found guilty of violating or noncompliance with subsection A shall be 738 subject to the following penalties:

a. For the first violation in a 36-month period, a penalty of no less than \$1,000;

740 b. For a second violation in a 36-month period, a penalty of no less than \$5,000 and a 30-day 741 suspension of the tobacco retailer permit; and

742 c. For a third violation in a 36-month period, a penalty of no less than \$10,000, revocation of the 743 tobacco retailer permit, and shall be ineligible to possess such permit for a period of three years from the date of the most recent violation. 744

745 2. Any tobacco retailer who violates subsection B shall be subject to a civil penalty, to be assessed 746 and collected by the Department, for each violation of \$500 for a first offense and \$1,000 for a second or subsequent offense within a 36-month period. Any tobacco retailer that violates subsection B shall be 747 748 ineligible to obtain a permit from the Department pursuant to § 58.1-1030.3 for a period of three years 749 from the date of such tobacco retailer's most recent violation.

3. All penalties assessed pursuant to this section shall accrue to the Literary Fund.

§ 58.1-1030.3. Application for permit; penalty.

752 A. Any person may apply for a permit to operate a tobacco retail establishment or conduct business 753 as a registered tobacco retailer according to forms and procedures prescribed by the Department. The 754 Department shall require a separate permit for each location or place of business. Every application for 755 such permit shall be made on a form prescribed by the Department and the following information shall 756 be provided on the application:

757 1. The name and address of the applicant; if the applicant is a firm, partnership, or association, the 758 name and address of each of its members; if the applicant is a corporation, the name and address of 759 each of its principal officers: 760

2. The address of the applicant's principal place of business;

3. The address of the place or places where the business to be permitted is to be conducted; and

762 4. Any other information as the Department may require for the purpose of the administration of this 763 section.

764 B. 1. The application process shall require an applicant to participate in, and provide for its 765 employees, education related to retail tobacco products as provided in § 58.1-1030.6. The Department shall conduct a background investigation, to include a Virginia criminal history records search of the 766 applicant, or its responsible principals and managers, which shall be submitted to the Federal Bureau 767 768 of Investigation if the Department determines that a national criminal records search is necessary on 769 permit applicants.

770 2. As applicable, the Department shall refuse to issue a permit and shall suspend, revoke, or refuse 771 to renew a permit issued to any person, partnership, corporation, limited liability company, or business 772 trust if it determines that any principal or manager has been (i) found guilty of any fraud or misrepresentation in any connection; (ii) convicted of robbery, extortion, burglary, larceny, 773 774 embezzlement, fraudulent conversion, gambling, perjury, bribery, treason, or racketeering; or (iii) 775 convicted of a felony in the last five years. Any person who knowingly and willfully falsifies, conceals, 776 or misrepresents a material fact or knowingly and willfully makes a false, fictitious, or fraudulent 777 statement or representation in any application is guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor. The Department may 778 establish an application or renewal fee to be retained by the Department to be applied to the 779 administrative and other costs of processing permit applications, conducting background investigations, 780 and issuing permits.

781 C. Upon receipt of an application in proper form and payment of any required fees, the Department 782 shall, unless otherwise provided by this article, issue to the applicant a permit authorizing the permit 783 holder to sell and offer to sell retail tobacco products at retail. Each permit, or a copy thereof, shall be 784 prominently displayed in the place of business covered by the permit. No permit shall be transferable to 785 any other person.

786 D. Unless an applicant or permit holder maintains a registered agent pursuant to Chapter 9 787 (§ 13.1-601 et seq.), 10 (§ 13.1-801 et seq.), 12 (§ 13.1-1000 et seq.), or 14 (§ 13.1-1200 et seq.) of Title 13.1 or Chapter 2.1 (§ 50-73.1 et seq.) or 2.2 (§ 50-73.79 et seq.) of Title 50, the applicant or permit 788 789 holder shall be deemed to have appointed the clerk of the State Corporation Commission as the **790** applicant's or permit holder's agent for the purpose of service of process relating to any matter or issue 791 involving the applicant or permit holder and arising under the provisions of this article.

792 E. 1. The Department shall annually determine and publish a fee for applications and renewals of 793 permits in an amount reasonably estimated to pay, but not exceed, the Department's administrative and 794 other costs of permitting administration, education and training, retail inspections, and unannounced compliance checks pursuant to the provisions of this article. Any application or renewal fees collected 795 pursuant to this subsection (i) in excess of such costs as of June 30 in even-numbered years shall be 796

797 reported to the State Treasurer and deposited into the state treasury and (ii) not in excess of such costs 798 as of June 30 in even-numbered years shall be reported to the State Treasurer and deposited into the

799 Tobacco Retail Permit Fund established pursuant to § 58.1-1030.7.

800 F. Permits issued pursuant to this section shall be valid for two years from the date of issue unless 801 revoked by the Department. The Department may revoke a permit if a permit holder fails to pay a tax 802 due under the provisions of this title. The Department may revoke a permit pursuant to any other 803 provision of this article that provides such authority.

804 G. The Department shall compile and maintain a current list of permit holders. The list shall be updated on a semiannual basis and published on the Department's website. 805

806 H. Any monetary penalty collected pursuant to the provisions of this section shall be reported to the 807 State Treasurer and deposited into the state treasury. 808

§ 58.1-1030.4. Certain records required of permit holder; access to premises.

809 A. 1. Each permit holder permitted pursuant to § 58.1-1030.3 shall keep in each permitted place of 810 business complete and accurate records for that place of business, including itemized invoices of (i) 811 products held and purchased, (ii) all sales of products, and (iii) any records required by the 812 Department.

813 2. All books, records, and other papers and documents required by this subsection shall be preserved, in a form prescribed by the Department, for a period of at least three years after the date of 814 815 the documents or the date of the entries thereof appearing in the records, unless the Department 816 authorizes, in writing, destruction or disposal of such documents at an earlier date.

817 B. At any time during usual business hours, duly authorized agents or employees of the Department 818 may enter any place of business of a permit holder and inspect the premises, the records required to be kept under this section, and the products contained therein to determine whether the permit holder is in 819 820 compliance with the provisions of this article. Refusal to allow such inspection by a duly authorized 821 agent or employee of the Department shall be grounds for revocation of the permit holder's permit.

C. Each permit holder that sells products to persons other than an ultimate consumer shall render 822 with each sale itemized invoices showing the seller's name and address, the purchaser's name and 823 824 address, the date of sale, and all prices. Such persons shall preserve legible copies of all such invoices 825 for three years after the date of sale. 826

§ 58.1-1030.5. Restrictions on the sale of retail tobacco products to minors; penalties.

827 A. A permit holder shall be required to comply with the provisions of this article, §§ 18.2-246.8, 828 18.2-246.10, and 18.2-371.2, and any other federal, state, or local law related to the sale of retail 829 tobacco products. If the Department determines that a permit holder has violated any such provision of 830 law, the Department may revoke its permit.

831 B. 1. For each permit holder, the Department shall conduct an unannounced investigation at least 832 once every 24 months to verify that the permit holder is not selling tobacco products to persons under 833 21 years of age. If the Department determines that the permit holder has violated any provision of this article, § 18.2-246.8, 18.2-246.10, or 18.2-371.2, or any other federal, state, or local law related to the 834 835 sale of retail tobacco products, it shall conduct an unannounced investigation of the permit holder 836 within six months of such violation.

837 2. If the Department determines that a permit holder, or a permit holder's agent or employee, sold a 838 retail tobacco product to a person under 21 years of age or violated subsection A or B of § 18.2-371.2, 839 the Department shall impose and the permit holder shall be subject to: 840

a. For the first violation in a 36-month period, a penalty of no less than \$1,000;

841 b. For a second violation in a 36-month period, a penalty of no less than \$5,000 and a 30-day 842 suspension of the tobacco retailer permit; and

843 c. For a third violation in a 36-month period, a penalty of no less than \$10,000, revocation of the 844 tobacco retailer permit, and shall be ineligible to possess such permit for a period of three years from 845 the date of the most recent violation.

846 C. The Department may collaborate with the Virginia Alcoholic Beverage Control Authority and 847 local law enforcement to the extent possible to enforce the provisions of this article and § 4.1-103.01. 848

§ 58.1-1030.6. Required education for permit holders and employees.

849 Any person that applies for a permit pursuant to § 58.1-1030.3 and any permit holder shall be 850 required to attest that it has conducted education and training for its employees related to: 851

1. The provisions of this article;

852 2. The prohibitions on the sale of retail tobacco products to persons under age 21 and other restrictions prescribed by §§ 18.2-246.8, 18.2-246.10, and 18.2-371.2; 853

854 3. Forms of identification that are acceptable as proof of age; and

855 4. The legal penalties that may be incurred for violation of the provisions of law identified in subdivisions 1 and 2. 856

857 § 58.1-1030.7. Tobacco Retail Permit Fund.

858 There is hereby created in the state treasury a special nonreverting fund to be known as the Tobacco

859 Retail Permit Fund, referred to in this section as "the Fund." The Fund shall be established on the books of the Comptroller. All revenues accruing to the Fund pursuant to this article, all funds 860 861 appropriated for such purpose, and any gifts, donations, grants, bequests, and other funds received on its behalf shall be paid into the state treasury and credited to the Fund. Interest earned on moneys in 862 863 the Fund shall remain in the Fund and be credited to it. Any moneys remaining in the Fund, including 864 interest thereon, at the end of each fiscal year shall not revert to the general fund but shall remain in 865 the Fund. Moneys in the Fund shall be used solely for the purposes of funding the Department's direct 866 and indirect costs of the license administration and enforcement program, including the administrative 867 costs of permitting administration, education and training, retail inspections, and unannounced 868 compliance checks. Expenditures and disbursements from the Fund shall be made by the State Treasurer 869 on warrants issued by the Comptroller upon written request signed by the Tax Commissioner.

870 § 59.1-293.10. Definitions.

871 As used in this chapter, unless the context requires another meaning:

872 "Child-resistant packaging" means packaging that is designed or constructed to meet the
873 child-resistant effectiveness standards set forth in 16 C.F.R. § 1700.15(b)(1) when tested in accordance
874 with the protocols described in 16 C.F.R. § 1700.20 as in effect on July 1, 2015.

875 "Liquid nicotine" means a liquid or other substance containing nicotine in any concentration that is876 sold, marketed, or intended for use in a nicotine vapor product.

877 "Liquid nicotine container" means a bottle or other container holding liquid nicotine in any
878 concentration but does not include a cartridge containing liquid nicotine if such cartridge is prefilled and
879 sealed by the manufacturer of such cartridge and is not intended to be opened by the consumer.

880 "Nicotine vapor product" has means the same meaning as that term is defined in § 18.2-371.2 881 58.1-1021.01.

882 2. That the Department of Taxation shall develop guidelines implementing the provisions of this

883 act. Such guidelines shall be exempt from the provisions of the Administrative Process Act (\$ 2.2,4000 at soc. of the Code of Vinginia)

884 (§ 2.2-4000 et seq. of the Code of Virginia).
