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VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY - CHAPTER

2 An Act to amend and reenact § 22.1-227.1 of the Code of Virginia, relating to public middle schools 3 and high schools; student organizations; career and technical education organizations permitted.

6 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

7 1. That § 22.1-227.1 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: 8

§ 22.1-227.1. Career and technical education.

9 A. The Board of Education shall incorporate into career and technical education the Standards of 10 Learning for mathematics, science, English, and social studies, including history, and other subject areas as may be appropriate. The Board may also authorize, in its regulations for accrediting public schools in 11 Virginia, the substitution of industry certification and state licensure examinations for Standards of 12 13 Learning assessments for the purpose of awarding credit for career and technical education courses, 14 where appropriate.

- 15 B. The Board shall also develop a plan for increasing the number of students receiving industry certification and state licensure as part of their career and technical education. The plan shall include an 16 17 annual goal for school divisions. Where there is an accepted national industry certification for career and 18 technical education instructional personnel and programs for automotive technology, such certification 19 shall be mandatory.
- 20 C. With such funds as may be appropriated for such purpose, there shall be established, within the 21 Department of Education, a unit of specialists in career and technical education. The unit shall (i) assist 22 in developing and revising local career and technical curriculum to integrate the Standards of Learning, 23 (ii) provide professional development for career and technical instructional personnel to improve the 24 quality of career and technical education, (iii) conduct site visits to the schools providing career and 25 technical education, and (iv) seek the input of business and industry representatives regarding the content 26 and direction of career and technical education programs in the public schools of the Commonwealth.
- 27 D. The Board shall develop guidelines for the establishment of High School to Work Partnerships, 28 hereafter referred to as "Partnerships," between public high schools and local businesses to create 29 opportunities for high school students to (i) participate in an apprenticeship, internship, or job shadow program in a variety of trades and skilled labor positions or (ii) tour local businesses and meet with 30 31 owners and employees. These guidelines shall include a model waiver form to be used by high schools 32 and local businesses in connection with Partnership programs to protect both the students and the 33 businesses from liability.
- 34 Each local school board may establish Partnerships or delegate the authority to establish Partnerships 35 to the local school division's career and technical education administrator or his designee, in 36 collaboration with the school counselor office of each public high school in the school division, and 37 shall educate high school students about opportunities available through such Partnerships.
- 38 Students who miss a partial or full day of school while participating in Partnership programs shall 39 not be counted as absent for the purposes of calculating average daily membership, but each local school 40 board shall develop policies and procedures for students to make up missed work and may determine the 41 maximum number of school days per academic year that a student may spend participating in a 42 Partnership program.
- 43 E. Each public middle school and high school, regardless of whether such school offers career and 44 technical education courses, may establish career and technical education student organizations.

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
