3	A BILL to amend the Code of Virginia by adding a section numbered 46.2-1049.1, relating to vehicle
4	exhaust systems; inspection and administrative fee.

9	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
10	1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 46.2-1049.1 as follows:
11	§ 46.2-1049.1. Excessive noise; inspection and administrative fee.
12	A. The provisions of this section shall only apply in Planning District 8.
13	B. No person shall operate a passenger vehicle and no owner of a passenger vehicle shall permit or
14	allow the operation of any such passenger vehicle that has an exhaust system that emits noise in excess
14	
	of 95 decibels on a highway; on any driveway or premises of a church, school, recreational facility, or
16	business; on any governmental property open to the public; on the premises of any industrial
17	establishment providing parking space for customers, patrons, or employees; or on any highway under
18	construction or not yet open to the public.
19	B. If a law-enforcement officer, based on his training and judgment, determines the noise emitted by
20	a passenger vehicle's exhaust system to be in excess of the decibel limit permitted by this section, he
21	may stop such vehicle and issue a notice of an administrative fee of \$250 to be paid to the Department
22	at the time of such vehicle's next registration renewal. Such assessment of the administrative fee may be
23	rebutted by the vehicle being presented within 30 days for an inspection of exhaust system noise
24	conducted by the Department of Environmental Quality to determine if the vehicle exhaust system emits
25	noise in excess of the decibel limit permitted by this section. If the vehicle is found to emit exhaust
26	system noise in excess of the permitted decibel limit permitted by this section, such vehicle may be
27	resubmitted for inspection within 30 days of the date of the failed inspection. If the vehicle is found to
28	emit exhaust system noise in excess of the permitted decibel limit permitted by this section at the second
29	inspection, or if the vehicle is not resubmitted for inspection within the 30 days following a failed first
30	inspection, the administrative fee will be assessed and collected at the time of vehicle registration
31	renewal. If during an inspection conducted by the Department of Environmental Quality such vehicle is
32	found to emit exhaust system noise within the allowed limit permitted by this section, the administrative
33	fee shall be waived.
34	C. The Department of Environmental Quality may enter into a contract or agreement with any
35	agency or private vendor to (i) conduct such exhaust system noise inspections at existing emissions
36	inspection stations, (ii) conduct inspections of such emissions inspection stations and their operations for
37	purposes of this section, (iii) report any relevant information related to such exhaust system noise
38	inspections to the Department, (iv) designate locations of such emissions inspection stations at which
39	such exhaust system noise inspections shall be conducted, (v) provide the equipment necessary for such
40	exhaust system noise inspections to each such emissions inspection station, (vi) certify the calibration of
41	any such equipment, and (vii) provide for the inspection of such emissions inspection stations and their
42	operations.
43	2. That the provisions of this act shall become effective on January 1, 2025, so long as the
44	Department of Environmental Quality receives an appropriation or such funding necessary to
45	supply the necessary equipment to emissions inspection stations, as required by § 46.2-1049.1 of
46	the Code of Virginia, as created by this act, as determined by the Department of Environmental
47	Quality, by such effective date. The Department of Environmental Quality shall certify in writing
48	to the Virginia Code Commission that such contingency has been met.
49	3. That the Department of State Police shall develop and implement training for law-enforcement
50	officers to recognize vehicles emitting exhaust system noise in excess of the limits permitted by
51	statute and create and implement the use of a notice of the administrative fee required by
52	§ 46.2-1049.1 of the Code of Virginia, as created by this act.
53	4. That the Department of Environmental Quality shall develop a program for inspecting vehicle
54	exhaust system noise consistent with the provisions of § 46.2-1049.1 of the Code of Virginia, as
55	created by this act.
56 57	5. That the Department of Motor Vehicles shall implement any administrative processes necessary to fulfill the requirements of the previous of this pet

to fulfill the requirements of the provisions of this act.6. That the provisions of this act shall expire on July 1, 2027.
