**4. Title:** Surveillance Technology Registry; created.

**5. Summary:** The bill requires all state and local law-enforcement agencies and sheriff's departments to provide to the Department of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS) a list of all surveillance technologies used by such agencies and departments. DCJS must provide such information to the Joint Commission on Technology and Science (the Commission).

The bill also defines "surveillance technology."

**8. Fiscal Implications:** According to the Department of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS) and Virginia State Police (VSP), the proposed legislation is not expected to have a material fiscal impact on agency operations. The impact on other law enforcement agencies is unknown at this time. The fiscal impact statement will be updated as necessary. The Virginia Crime Commission reports that bill has no fiscal impact on their operations.
