- **4. Title:** Criminal Injuries Compensation Fund; claims.
- **5. Summary:** The substitute provides that in claims for an award under the Criminal Injuries Compensation Fund involving sexual abuse of a minor, the claim shall be filed within 10 years after the minor's eighteenth birthday, except for in cases involving claims of sexual abuse of a minor where the conduct constitutes a felony, the passage of time shall not be a barrier to when the victim can file a claim.

- 7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Indeterminate see Item 8.
- 8. Fiscal Implications: According to the Virginia Workers' Compensation Commission, the proposed legislation is expected to increase the claim payments awarded from the Criminal Injuries Compensation Fund; however, the projected increase in claim payments cannot be determined.
