2. Patron: Seibold
3. Committee: Public Safety
4. Title: Use of canines in correctional and juvenile correctional facilities; prohibited acts.
5. Summary: This bill makes it unlawful for any correctional officer, jail officer, or other employee of a state, local, or juvenile correctional facility to use a patrol or security canine in any state, local, or juvenile correctional facility. The bill specifies that such provisions do not apply to the training or use of detector canines or detector canine handlers.

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Preliminary. See Item 8 below.
8. Fiscal Implications: The Department of Corrections (DOC) currently uses security canines in its facilities. DOC is still reviewing the impact this bill would have on agency operations. However, it is possible that any fiscal impact this bill would have could be addressed using current resources.

According to the Department of Juvenile Justice, the agency does not use security canines in its facility. Therefore, this bill has no fiscal impact on agency operations.

The impact this bill may have on local and regional jails is not known at this time. If additional information becomes available, this impact statement will be revised.

The Office of the Attorney General reports that this bill may expose the Commonwealth to additional litigation and, therefore, may have a fiscal impact on agency operations. However, the fiscal impact cannot be quantified at this time.
