Summary: Establishes the Virginia Firefighting Facilities Grant Program for the purpose of awarding grants on a first-come, first-served basis to localities for the purpose of building and maintaining their firefighting facilities. The amount of such grants, as appropriated by the General Assembly, is to be as provided in the appropriation act. The Program is to be administered by the Department of Fire Programs. The Department would be required to develop guidelines for the Program, which (i) emphasize providing grants to localities that are cost burdened in the provision of firefighting services and (ii) require remedying facilities that do not meet minimum standards established by law. Department to report annually, beginning November 1, 2025, to the Governor and the

General Assembly a list of grants, the amount of each approved grant, and an assessment of the effectiveness of the Program in assisting localities in building and maintaining their

Fiscal Implications: According to the Department of Fire Programs (VDFP), one additional full-time position at an estimated annual cost of \$117,106 (salary and fringe benefits) is anticipated to be needed to carry out the proposed Virginia Firefighting Facilities Grant Program. Currently, the agency has two grants management positions overseeing five existing grant programs. However, the agency believes one additional person would be needed to address the additional workload.
