3. Committee: Courts of Justice

4. Title: Appointment of counsel; public defenders; caseload exception.

5. Summary: The engrossed bill exempts the public defender, in jurisdictions where public defender offices are established, from providing defense services for indigent clients if the public defender, with the concurrence of the executive director of the Virginia Indigent Defense Commission or his designee, determines that the public defender's current active caseload would preclude the public defender from providing adequate representation to new clients.

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Preliminary. See Item 8 below.

8. Fiscal Implications: According to the Office of the Executive Secretary of the Supreme Court (OES), this bill may impact the Criminal Fund. However, the number of courts where Public Defenders' offices may opt out of providing services for indigent clients as allowed by the bill and the total number of cases impacted by the bill cannot be known. Therefore, the impact on the Criminal Fund is indeterminate.

According to the Indigent Defense Commission, this bill is not expected to have a material impact on agency operations.
