4. Title: First offender drug program; previous misdemeanor marijuana conviction.

5. Summary: This bill allows any person not previously convicted of any felony offense under § 18.2-251 (first offense) or under and substantially similar statute of the United States to participate in the first offender drug program. Current law prohibits any person with a previous conviction relating to narcotic drugs, marijuana, or stimulant, depressant, or hallucinogenic drugs from participating in the program.
