4.	Title: Health insurance; emergency services; mobile crisis response services.
5.	Summary: The substitute provides that emergency services, as it relates to any mental health services or substance abuse services, as those terms are defined in § 38.2-3412.1, Code of Virginia, rendered at a behavioral health crisis services provider, include (a) a behavioral health assessment that is within the capability of a behavioral health crisis service provider, including ancillary services routinely available to evaluate such emergency medical condition, and (b) such further examination and treatment, to the extent that they are within the capabilities of the staff and facilities available at the behavioral health crisis service provider, as are required so that the patient's condition does not deteriorate. Coverage for emergency services that are related to mental health services or substance abuse services, as those terms are defined in § 38.2-3412.1, Code of Virginia, shall be provided in accordance with the federal Mental Health Parity and Addiction Equity Act of 2008, P.L. 110-343, even where those requirements would not otherwise apply directly. Such emergency services may be rendered at a location other than the emergency department of a hospital, such as a behavioral health crisis service provider, as required.
