ani (iii all the	Summary: This bill allows any locality to establish, organize, and maintain a computerized imal cruelty registry database for those convicted of (i) cruelty to animals (ii) animal fighting; a maiming, killing, or poisoning an animal; or (iv) killing or injuring a police animal. The bill lows the locality or local police department to remove a person's name and information from a registry database 15 years after the violation that warranted inclusion in the registry if the reson has no additional felony conviction.

reg im	Fiscal Implications: The bill does not require any locality to establish an animal cruelty gistry instead saying that they may establish an animal cruelty registry. Therefore, there is no pact on the state. The impact on localities is unknown at this time, but any impact on localities ould need to be absorbed by the locality since the bill clearly states that all costs to establish, ganize, and maintain a locality's animal cruelty registry shall be borne by such locality.
