2. Patron: Campbell

3. Committee: Education

4. Title: Public schools; fire drills, timing and frequency.

5. Summary: Requires the first of the two fire drills required during the first 20 days of each public school session to be conducted during the first 10 days of such school session. The bill also requires every public school to hold additional fire drills during the remainder of such school session as required by the Statewide Fire Prevention Code, which currently requires such additional fire drills to be conducted on a monthly basis. Current law requires at least two additional fire drills to be conducted during the remainder of the public school session after the two fire drills required during the first 20 days of each such school session.
