**3. Committee:** Labor and Commerce

**4. Title:** Energy efficiency programs; incremental annual savings.

**5. Summary:** Provides that it is in the public interest and the policy of the Commonwealth to deploy demand-side management programs and energy efficiency measures throughout the Commonwealth to achieve the greatest possible reductions in energy consumption. The bill permits the State Corporation Commission to increase or decrease an investor-owned electric utility's combined rate of return based on the utility's success in complying with energy efficiency program targets in existing law.

Additionally, the bill states that "in the public interest" for the purpose of assessing energy efficiency programs means that the Commission determines that the program is cost-effective.

Finally, the bill directs the Commission to promulgate regulations no later than December 31, 2025, establishing a single, consistent cost-effectiveness test for use in evaluating proposed energy efficiency programs.
