**4. Title:** Enrollment of students transitioning into, between, and out of foster care and kinship care placement.

**5. Summary:** Requires that in the event that a person in a kinship care arrangement moves into a different school division during the school year as a result of (i) safely returning home, (ii) being emancipated pursuant to relevant law, or (iii) transitioning to a new kinship care arrangement, the student shall continue to be allowed to attend the school in which he was enrolled prior to the transition through the end of such school year. The bill also requires that certain provisions relating to the enrollment of children placed in foster care shall apply to a student who has transitioned out of foster care.
