4. Title: Local correctional facilities; fees; report.

5. Summary: Current law provides for the establishment of stores in regional jails, regional jail farms, and local correctional facilities. Net profits from the operation of such stores must be used within the facilities for educational, recreational or other programs that benefit inmates. The substitute bill provides that net profits may be used for medical purposes including behavioral health, substance abuse, reentry and rehabilitative services for the benefit of inmates and provides that profits may be expended to pay for the training, salaries, and benefits of employees or contractors whose primary job is to provide such programs and services to the inmates. The bill also provides that net profits from the operation of telephonic communication systems must be used for the same purposes.

8. Fiscal Implications: According to the Board of Local and Regional Jails, this bill is not expected to have a fiscal impact on agency operations.
